

Gospel Reflection © Greg Sunter

James and John are effectively calling 'shotgun' on the best seats at the table! When they ask to sit at the left and right hand of Jesus, they are asking Jesus to name them as his deputies. They're looking to secure for themselves positions of power and authority. The only problem is that they have a completely messed up idea of what it means for Jesus to enter into his glory. For several weeks now, we have been exploring a theme from the Gospel of Mark that follows a physical journey towards Jerusalem as well as a symbolic and theological journey towards what is going to occur in Jerusalem – Jesus' arrest, crucifixion and resurrection. Throughout this journey, Jesus has been trying to prepare the disciples for what is to come and educate them about what it really means to be a disciple of his. Three times Jesus tells the disciples explicitly what lies ahead. Each time the disciples fail to grasp what Jesus tells them.

Despite occasional glimpses of insight, the disciples still believe that Jesus is going to rise up as a political or military figure. In a complete dismissal of this sort of thinking, Jesus declares quite forcefully that

leadership of this sort is not what he intends for himself, nor for those who follow him.

Leadership in the Jesus model is about being of service to others; it is not about prestige and acclamation. Many of the best leaders are those who do not have any title of leadership or authority. Their leadership and authority come from what they do and how they do it. They inspire others to follow their example. They don't demand it; they don't bully; they don't play power games. People simply want to follow their example.

Living the Gospel - Servant Leadership

What does it really mean to practise servant leadership? It means placing the needs of others before your own desires for prestige or authority. We've all known people who have been given a position of leadership and they really only wanted the job as recognition of their popularity; a thank you for previous work done; an opportunity to demonstrate their strength of will or cleverness with words. Servant leadership is about collaborating; it's about empowering people to do their best; it's about trusting others and about rolling up your sleeves and getting on with the job.

Have you thought? Integrity

Who do you really admire? Who would you really like to be like? Aside from sports stars, models and actors whose particular skills you might admire or even envy; who is a person who lives their life in a way that you would like to emulate? Perhaps it's not that you want to do exactly what they have done but rather it's the way they've gone about living their life. I would bet that there is a close match between what they hold to be true and the way they live their life – integrity!

Scriptural context – Mark's Gospel

Despite appearing second, Mark's gospel is now recognised as being the first written of those that appear in the Bible. The shortest of the four gospels, it begins with Jesus' entry into public life and, in its original form, ends with the discovery of the empty tomb. It is sometimes called a gospel 'in a hurry' as the movement between events is almost abrupt. The gospel writer identifies almost immediately that Jesus is God's 'beloved Son' and then spends the rest of the gospel describing the gradual revelation of this fact and the disciples' growing awareness.

Jesus describes the logic of God's kingdom in paradoxical terms:

'Whoever wishes to become great among you must be your servant'.

However, this model is already an integral part of everyday life and can be observed in the relationship between parent and child – especially in the role of a mother.



We're working our way out-of-lockdown and back-to-Church

NB: This roadmap may be changed by the NSW Govt and/or the Diocese of Broken Bay at short notice. Additional restrictions may be made from time to time at the discretion of the Parish Priest for the safety of all parishioners.

Important Message from our Parish Priest: In light of the messages from

the Diocese of Broken Bay Chancery and the "Roadmap" issued by the New South Wales Government on KCCP anticipates recommencing services as follows:

27 September.

PHASE ONE ~ 70% ARE FULLY VACCINATED

Monday 11 October 2021 to approx. 24 October 2021

(Please be mindful of Govt. requirements for this stage and engage this opportunity with a sense of responsibility and COVID safety).

- Churches in our Diocese have reopened for private prayer and devotion only between 9am & 1pm weekdays only;
- Public Masses remain suspended;
- Weekend Sunday masses will be live-streamed as usual (6pm Saturday and 9am Sunday);
- Baptisms are delayed until the next stage;
- Weddings and funerals: up to 100 people may attend. Those attending need to be vaccinated;
- Those who are unvaccinated may only attend funeral with a maximum number of 10 people;
- It is essential that anyone visiting our churches use the QR code to register your visit, sanitise, and always wear a mask.

We're getting closer to ...

PHASE TWO ~ WHEN 80% ARE FULLY VACCINATED

Estimated date 25 October 2021

- Welcome to all vaccinated and unvaccinated alike;
- Mass and Reconciliation schedule resumes as before lockdown;
- Live-streamed Sunday Masses cease as we can come together again publicly;
- ALL attendees required to use QR Code to sign in for contact tracing;
- The **4sqm rule will apply** allowing up to 62 individuals in St Bernard's Church and allowing up to 101 individuals in St Patrick's Church at any one time;
- **ALL** attendees required to wear a mask as per State Government regulation;
- **NO congregational singing allowed:** but one musician and one cantor are allowed;
- Baptisms resume special opportunities have been made available call for details.

It's only a matter of time until ... PHASE THREE ~ WHEN 90% ARE EXPECTED

TO BE FULLY VACCINATED ~ Estimated date 1 DECEMBER – "THE NEW NORMAL"

- Again we Welcome all back to Mass, vaccinated and unvaccinated alike;
- ALL attendees are still required to use QR Code to sign in for contact tracing;
- The 2sqm rule now applies allowing up to 124 individuals in St Bernard's Church and allowing up to 202 individuals in St Patrick's Church at any one time;
- Wearing of **masks** is now **optional**;
- Congregational singing is allowed at some Masses only details to be advised;

This is IMPORTANT ~ At places of Worship you can NO LONGER sign-in MANUALLY

- It goes without saying (but say it we must) we are required to follow all directions from the NSW State Government and Dept. of Health upon our return to Mass, AND as a parish within the Diocese of Broken Bay we follow all directions from OUR Bishop.
- The above is pretty clear, but we need to clarify a main point of returning to our churches.
 - ♦ At places of Worship you can NO LONGER sign-in MANUALLY
 - ♦ The easiest way to sign-in is to download the NSW Service App to your Smartphone and scan the codes at our churches.
 - ♦ If this is not an option for you then in less than 2 minutes you can be ready to return to Mass by going to ...
 - ⇒ https://apply.service.nsw.gov.au/covid-checkin-card/
 - ⇒ Apply to Service NSW for a COVID-19 check-in card, which is a card with a unique QR code that contains your registered contact details, which is either printed off by you from your computer or posted to you by Service NSW.
 - ⇒ You then present this to the Usher at church who will have a 'scanner' to record your details electronically in accordance with the law. (The parish needs to purchase two cheap Smartphones specifically for this purpose).
 - ⇒ If you do not have access to a computer to apply for a card please contact the parish office on 9456 2450 for assistance.

NB: This requirement may be hard to accept, but without a way to sign-in electronically, by law, you are unable to enter our churches.

NB2: No bookings will be taken for any Masses in our Parish - Entry for Mass will be on a first to arrive and electronically sign-in basis.
