"Leo's Lens" ~ A Reflection by Nick Brodie

'Jesus satisfies the hunger of the crowd', Pope Leo says. When we look to Jesus, we see how 'he does what God does, and he teaches us to do the same.' At no point in the Gospels do we see Jesus hoarding money for himself or explaining that the poor deserve to be poor.

'Today,' the pope reflects, 'entire peoples are suffering.' Their pain, he adds gravely, is too often 'a result of the greed of

'In stark contrast to the dire poverty of many,' he adds, there is 'the amassing of wealth by a few.' This unholy disparity, he explains, 'is the sign of an arrogant indifference.' It directly 'produces pain and injustice.'

The pope reminds us that 'the Lord's example is a yardstick that should guide our actions and our service: we are called to share our bread.'

Indeed, by sharing our resources justly we work 'to multiply hope and to proclaim the coming of God's Kingdom.'

As the pope notes, 'Jesus' compassion for the suffering shows us the loving closeness of God, who comes into our world to save us.' Through compassionate action for those in distress and by working for justice in our world we can truly become God's servants. ## FINANCE COMMITTEE REPORT TO PARISH YEAR ENDED 30<sup>TH</sup> JUNE 2025

The Parish Finance Committee reports as follows on the financial position and performance of the Parish for the year ended 30<sup>th</sup> June 2025.

The Operating Profit/(Loss) for the year recorded a deficit of \$11,303 compared to a surplus of \$1,963 for the previous financial year. This deterioration was mainly due to operating expenses being \$27,221 higher primarily from an increase in employment expenses by \$25,500 and insurance cost by \$8,438. This was offset by a decrease in expenses for alter & church requisites and pastoral programmes by \$5,502.

On the positive side, the gross profit recorded an increase of \$22,706 on the previous year primarily from an increase in parish giving by \$24,210. Planned giving increased by \$1,031 and unplanned giving, including Tap N Go terminals, increased by \$23,179. Non-Operating Income and Expenditure recorded a

Non-Operating Income and Expenditure recorded a surplus of \$13,931 compared to a deficit of \$37,293 in the previous financial year. This was due to an increase in fettered donations and lower capital expenditure for the year.

This resulted in a total deficit for the financial year of \$12,683 compared to a deficit of \$35,331 for the previous financial year.

The cash position of the Church A/c has deteriorated by \$14,737 over the year to \$194,063. This figure includes \$136,000 from the insurance claim for the damaged retaining wall and storm water drainage pipes at St Patrick's Church. This has been quarantined in a term deposit until expenditure for the repairs is required.

A summary of these figures is included in this Bulletin with a full set on the Parish's website.

Thank you to all Parishioners who are continuing to generously support the Parish specially through planned giving by Credit Card and direct deposits.

For those not contributing via planned giving, we request you to consider it as this facilitates budgeting for the Parish.

For those already using planned giving and you haven't already done so, please review your commitment for this financial year as costs continue to increase.

The budget for this financial year is estimating a deficit of \$64,700.
