A letter to the People of God in the Diocese of Broken Bay ~ [Bishop Anthony 11 August 2020] ~ My dear brothers and sisters in Christ.

The Gospel, which is the Good News of Jesus Christ, is not just there to be proclaimed, although that is an important action. A more important and even more difficult action is integrating the Gospel into the fibre of our very lives. If we are honest, we would find that many of us struggle with this aspect the most. The theology and the proclamation of the Word is relatively easy. What is more challenging is the living out of the Word of God and becoming a credible witness to the Gospel. In the Gospels, Jesus spoke of a



cost involved in responding to His call to become a disciple (Lk 14:28), in terms of what becoming a disciple will do to our plans, our reputations and our possessions. He told Peter that answering the call will take him to places he would rather not go (Jn 21:18). The Christian vocation would cost them their very lives. To live one's vocation can appear to be foolishness according to the wisdom of the secular world. Why bother with such foolishness? Because when the Word of God is integrated into our lives, we undergo a transformation. When I integrate myself with the Word of God, I do not simply "become a better person", as if the Christian faith is merely a form of therapy. A Christian immersed in, integrated with, and transformed by the Word of God becomes in his or her own person a living Gospel, an embodied proclamation of the glory of the Lord. A Christian who integrates the Word of God makes the Word become his or her own flesh and allows the Word to dwell within them and dwell among us once again (Jn 1:1-18). When a person lives a life transformed by the Word, what was once an abstract concept of "the Christ" turns into the living body of Jesus Christ by the power of the Holy Spirit. Anyone who encounters a Christian who has truly been transformed by Christ will come to an encounter with the person of Jesus Himself, as it was in the Scriptural accounts all those centuries ago. The face of Christ is not an abstract concept, nor a distant memory. It is a living and breathing reality in any Christian who really abides in the Word of God. A Christian transformed by the Word of God is a living and breathing reality in the present, another incarnation in our day. We have read in the Gospels just how powerful the incarnation and an encounter with the incarnate Word can be. In the first instance, the incarnate Word of God is someone who will attract others. The incarnate Word of God can draw others out of themselves and ignite that desire for more than what their lives currently offer but never satisfy. A person transformed by the Word of God will spark a desire in others for the same kind of transformation in their own lives, not just for themselves, but also in the lives of others. What is the reason for this attraction? It is because a life integrated with Jesus is not a life that is less human. On the contrary, Christians who truly reflect Jesus are living lives that are fully human. A life that is fully human is an attractive life, a cause of wonder, and a call to move beyond a life of bland mediocrity and compromise. You can see how this is also a form of leadership. To lead one out of mediocrity, to inspire, and to instil desire to be more human in every pursuit. Instead of shoving from behind, the Christian transformed by Christ draws and attracts from the front. Leadership here is not measured by how many people you can boss around. In the context of vocation, leadership is measured by how a person has their life transformed by the Word of God, through the power of the Holy Spirit. My dear sisters and brothers do not be afraid to respond to this call to lead, to embody the beauty of Christ Jesus,

and through the Holy Spirit, to proclaim the glory of the Lord. + Authouy

FINANCE COMMITTEE REPORT TO PARISH YEAR ENDED 30TH JUNE 2020

The Parish Finance Committee reports as follows on the financial position and performance of the Parish for the year ended 30th June 2020.

The cash position of the Church A/c has improved by \$7,432 over the year to \$54,765. This figure includes the full repayment of the Loan A/c for the Pastoral Centre of \$14,849.

The revenue and expenses for the year recorded a surplus of \$13,342 compared to a surplus of \$30,506 for the previous year. This deterioration was mainly due to operating expenses being \$28,212 higher mainly due to increased employment costs, insurance, altar and church requisite expenses and presbytery expenses due to a special Strata levy for Haldane St. premises for building defects.

This was offset by operating income increasing by \$7,497 which was mainly due to Covid-19 government assistance for the cash flow stimulus and Job-keeper subsidy of \$22,000 and the inclusion of income from the 250 Club of \$7,722. This was offset by total collections being \$16,727 less mainly due to the effects of Covid-19 restrictions

Capital expenditure increased by \$24,967 compared to the previous year. The main expenditure during the year was for renovations on the St Bernard's Church and a storage shed at St Patrick's. The cost of replacing the roof at St Bernard's was covered by insurance. Thank you to those Parishioners who have specifically contributed for the renovations at St Bernard's which so far amounts to \$19,420.

A summary of these figures appears here and includes a detailed Statement of Income and Expenditure for the financial year. These can also be found on the Parish's website.

Thank you to all Parishioners who are currently contributing via the planned giving scheme. As it is proposed to carry out major renovations at St Patrick's in the coming year at an approx. cost of \$42,000 and ongoing repairs and maintenance issues to be attended to we seek your continued support.

We urge those not currently in the planned giving scheme to join it either via the Envelope system or preferably by the Credit Card option. For those already using planned giving and you haven't already done so, please review your commitment for this financial year. Also those using the credit card option please update the expiry date with the Pastoral Office if you have had a new credit card issued recently.

Have you thought? What's in a name? ~ On many occasions in the Bible a character is given, or takes on, a new name when they take on a new role or move to a new level in their faith and relationship with God. Abram became Abraham; Sarai became Sarah; Jacob became Israel; and Saul became Paul. In all of these circumstances the person took on a new name to reflect their new relationship with God. This tradition has continued right to this day. Men and women entering religious life have traditionally taken on a new name to indicate the new life they are entering. When Cardinal Joseph Ratzinger became pope he took on the name Benedict to indicate the new role and the new life he was beginning.

 Living the Gospel ... Who do YOU say I am? ~ The question that
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 Jesus asks the disciples is a question he asks of all of us. How we answer that question reflects our relationship with Jesus. But more

 importantly, how we answer that question reflects the way we live our life in response to who we believe Jesus to be. If we truly say that we believe in Jesus as the son of God, then how do we live our lives in such a way that we act on that belief? The gospel shows us that an inadequate answer to that question leads to missing the point of all that Jesus is.

Gospel Focus ~ Jesus' words to Peter, 'on this rock I will build my church', are obviously the gospel writers' words and not the words of Jesus himself. (Jesus did not set out to build a church community; that did not emerge until later.) In fact they appear only in this particular gospel. The other synoptic gospels have Peter's confession of faith but not these words attributed to Jesus. The words are sometimes understood as asserting that Peter himself is the rock on whom the church will be built, rather than his declaration of faith being the rock. This has then sometimes become confused with the line of popes beginning with Peter.

As reported on the weekend, St Agatha's Church at Pennant Hills is closed for deep cleaning following a parishioner testing positive to COVID-19. The church will remain closed until further notice. This is a timely reminder of our need to be vigilant and to keep lines of communication open. [...] Again, the importance of implementing the Parish

COVID-safe plan has been highlighted in this incident. Please ensure that all contact details are taken by every person attending the parish so contact tracing can occur in the event of an outbreak.

Please encourage your parishioners to wear masks, [...] I need to stress with the utmost urgency: If you are feeling unwell, and especially if you have any flu-like symptoms you must cease work, stay home, isolate and get tested. This advice is paramount for our clergy who are in contact with such a wide range of people in the course of their ministry.
