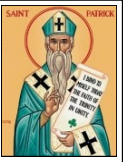

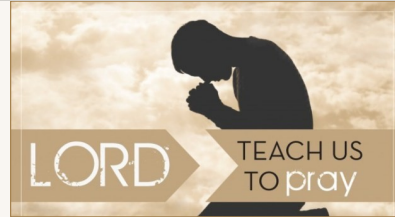

## Luke gives more attention to Jesus' teachings on prayer than any other Gospel writer.

He also mentions Jesus at prayer more than the others. In today's reading, from the beginning of Chapter 11 of his Gospel, Luke presents the core of Jesus' teaching on prayer. It consists of Jesus teaching a prayer to his disciples, a parable on the persistent neighbour, and assurances that God hears our prayers. The disciples notice Jesus praying "in a certain place." They ask him to teach them to pray just as John the Baptist had taught his disciples. Jesus teaches them a simple version of the most famous Christian prayer, the Our Father, or the Lord's Prayer. Matthew's version shows signs of being shaped by public prayer. Luke's version is probably closer to the original form that Jesus taught. Stripped of much of the language we are used to, Luke's version seems simple and direct. We pray that God's name will be recognized as holy and that his rule over all will be established. This is followed by petitions for our needs for bread, for forgiveness, and for deliverance. Luke uses the more theological language of "sins" rather than "debts," which is used in Matthew's version. Having taught his disciples a simple, daily prayer, Jesus goes on to reassure them that God answers prayers. First he tells a parable about a persistent neighbour who asks a friend for bread at midnight. The friend is already in bed and has no desire to disturb his family by opening the door. But because the neighbour is persistent, the sleeping man gets up and gives him all that he needs. If a neighbour is willing to help us if we are persistent enough, how could God not respond to our requests? This teaching concludes with the reminder that if we seek, we will get a response. If a human father, with all his faults, knows how to give good gifts to his children, how much more will our heavenly Father give us? Instead of good gifts, however, Luke substitutes the word *Holy Spirit*. This foreshadows the gift of the Holy Spirit, who is central to Luke's theology and who will play an important role in the growth of the early Church after Pentecost. The parable and the concluding teaching in this section should not lead us to think of prayer as a series of requests presented to God. Rather, as Jesus teaches in his model prayer, prayer consists in recognizing God's

*My dear sisters and brothers in Christ,*

No doubt many of you have been following the media reports regarding the Second Assembly of the Fifth Plenary Council of the Catholic Church in Australia. It is my hope over the coming weeks and months to begin to unpack the work of the Plenary Council, which along with the upcoming Synod on Synodality, will help inform our Broken Bay Pastoral Mission, *One in Christ*.

In the meantime, might I encourage you to remember that the Plenary Council was an ecclesial event, not a media event. The various reports presented in the print media and the electronic media, tend to inflame the process, decisions, and outcomes of what has been a long and fruitful process of listening and discernment.

One of the fruits of the Plenary Council is that it has raised a whole dimension in ecclesial life about listening. Inspired by the Book of Revelation, we have asked, **"What is the Holy Spirit saying to the Church?"** This question is fundamental for the Christian. The question is not merely an inquiry, it is a profession of faith. It confesses that the community of the Church, to which all the baptised belong, is in fact a communion in the fellowship of the Holy Spirit. As Catholic Christians, we believe that we are anointed by the Holy Spirit as the People of God. The Holy Spirit is constantly revealing to the Body of Christ the will of God the Father. Every member of Christ's Body is called each day to discern the voice of God calling us to life, ministry, and mission.

The Holy Spirit reveals Jesus, alive in every living member of the Church. The Holy Spirit draws the followers of Christ together into blessed communion. The Holy Spirit animates and sends baptised women and men into the world as disciples of Jesus Christ.

As we can plainly see, this is much more than a media event. Consequently, our ongoing listening and discerning cannot be focused on what we read reported in the secular media. There is a simple process that will help us unfold the work of the Plenary Council in Broken Bay. It begins with trust and hope in the grace of the Holy Spirit. Without this it would be very easy to fall into ideological divisions. That is certainly not what the Holy Spirit asks of us. The Holy Spirit binds us together, fills us with divine life, and urges us to proclaim the love and mercy of God to all whom we encounter.

The next phase of the Plenary Council is for the Australian Catholic Bishops Conference (ACBC) to receive the Acts and Decrees of the Council formally in November 2022. At this time, both the Acts and the Decrees will be forwarded to the Holy See for reception and consideration. The Holy Father will be part of this process, which signifies the movement of the Holy Spirit drawing the Catholic Church in Australia more deeply into communion with the Successor of Peter, and therefore with the Universal Church to which we belong. This phase may take up to 12 months before the ACBC receives the approval for implementation and engagement in the local Churches.

In the meantime, I encourage the whole community of the Church of Broken Bay, people, priests, and deacons, to join together in prayer and charity, as together we continue to engage in our Pastoral Mission of evangelisation, catechesis, communion, and mission – *One in Christ*.

May the Holy Spirit of God stir into flame the grace of baptism in each of us.

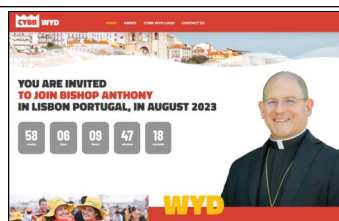
The **Fifth Plenary Council** of Australia final assembly took place July 3-9 ~ Full details can be found at <https://plenarycouncil.catholic.org.au/>

 **Community News: International Safeguarding Conference (ISC) 2022: Reporting Abuse – Obligations, Dilemmas and Reality.** Jodie Crisafulli, Director, Diocesan Safeguarding Office attended the ISC as a Facilitator and the following are her reflections from the conference...

Recently, I was privileged to be asked by the International Safeguarding Conference Committee to facilitate 'group discussions' with groups within Australia in the lead up to the International Safeguarding Conference 2022 held in Rome from 20 – 21 June 2022. The groups were made up of academics, safeguarding personnel from within some Dioceses and Religious Institutes, a representative from the New Zealand National Safeguarding Office and a representative from the Office of the Children's Guardian. Three group discussions were conducted providing this group with an opportunity to network, discuss the planned topics of the Conference and provide input to the International Safeguarding Conference committee prior to the commencement of the conference.

As a facilitator for the Conference, I was lucky enough to be able to travel to Rome and attend the Conference where I facilitated small group discussions throughout the conference, consisting of participants from around the world. There was a strong representation from Australia amongst the delegates at the Conference, which gave us an opportunity to mix with experts from around the globe and engage on the topics of the conference. The theme of the conference was reporting both within the Catholic Church and to Civil Authorities and included support to those that have been abused. The Conference was at times confronting, gave a clear picture of some of the cultural differences and challenges the Catholic Church faces around the world but equally uplifting to know that the Church has so many people with such expertise working to respond to abuse and better safeguard children.
