When my father returned from serving in the Middle East during World War II, he brought home a set of photographs of the Sphinx, the Pyramids, the Church of the Holy Sepulchre and so on. The set was accompanied by a mysterious instrument which gave we young boys endless fascination: bioptic lenses which created a 3D effect.

What was a flat photograph suddenly had depth and foreground. The sphinx loomed close, the pyramids receded. The true dimension in which those objects existed was revealed. Their reality was more apparent because we saw them in the right perspective.

Our Lord is asking us to see reality about the Divine and about human beings, beyond a flat description of 'God' or 'person', and then we will respond appropriately.

Did you notice that Our Lord does not command us to love 'God'? That is too abstract. No, we are to love 'the Lord your God', the proper Hebrew title for the One who rescued the Jewish people from slavery.

The Lord God is the liberator, the one who sets us free. The resurrection of Jesus Christ reveals the Lord God as the liberator from the apparent final dominance of death. Loving such a liberator is the natural response. So, 'Love the Lord your God'.

Then Our Lord does not command us to love our neighbour! Rather, we are commanded 'Love your **neighbour as** *yourself*'. So, it is necessary to get a correct perspective on 'yourself'.

Am I merely a biological phenomenon? The answer is 'no'.

In the wonderful story-telling of Genesis, we are told that Adam, an earthen statue, had divine breath breathed into the nostrils, creating him as a human being.

We earthlings are conceived with the Divine Breath, Divine Life, at the core of our being. In a James McAuley hymn*, we sing of Jesus Christ as 'Divine Love in a human heart'. What is true of Jesus Christ by nature, is true of us by adoption, by grace.

The great Spanish mystic, St John of the Cross, wrote:

'[God] is hidden by his essence and his presence in the innermost being of the soul.'

'You yourself are [God's] dwelling and his inner secret room and hiding place. ...' (The Spiritual *Canticle*, 6.2, 7)

The challenge for you and for me is to see 'yourself' in that way. If only we saw ourselves in that way. If only we saw in that way every human being whose lives we can affect: the neighbour. And in today's global world, the neighbour can be a person in a society geographically distant and culturally very different, but 'L'Amour sans frontieres'.

With these perspectives, seeing the true dimensions of God, self and the other, then how easily we could fulfil the dual command:

'You shall love the Lord your God with your whole heart, with your whole soul and with your whole mind. And you shall love your neighbour as yourself.'

In the run-up to Christmas I have quite a few baptisms to celebrate.

Pray for all those to be baptised, that all those who encounter them will love them with the love due a neighbour who is the dwelling place of God.

Pray that those baptised persons may come to the fulfilment of divine and human love in the everlasting bliss of Heaven. * 'Jesus, in your heart we find'" Text 1976 James McAuley: music 1976 Richard Connolly.



Personal Participation of the Eucharist

It is good to see the increasing number of our parishioners for the participation of our daily masses and weekend masses. Vatican calls for a "necessary and urgent" return to in-person Mass. Very recently, Cardinal Robert Sarah, the Prefect of the Congregation for Divine Worship has sent a letter to world's Episcopal conferences which says, "Broadcast liturgies can never replace personal participation in the Eucharist". He has encouraged them a return to the "normality of Christian life," in particular to the resumption of regular participation at Mass. He continues to say that "As soon as circumstances permit, it is necessary and urgent to return to the normality of Christian life, which has the church building as its home and the celebration of the liturgy, especially the Eucharist as the summit toward which the activity of the Church is directed...".


