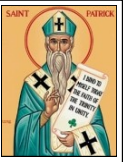

## Today is Social Justice Sunday

The Church in Australia marks Social Justice Sunday on August 28 and each year the Australian Catholic Bishops release a major social justice statement. The 2022-23 Social Justice Statement is entitled *Respect: Confronting Violence and Abuse* and it encourages the Catholic community to reflect and act on social, economic and ecological issues. The ACBC remind us of the social dimension of the mission of the Church and addresses the scourge of family and domestic violence in Australian society and the impact it has on our communities.

## Homily © Richard Leonard SJ

One of the most basic human responses to anything new is to ask, **'What's in it for me?'** We would like to think our motives are pure and our interests are for others, but there is often a nagging voice reminding us that selfish desires are never far from the surface.

That said, we all know heroic individuals who care for sick spouses or children, who go to faraway places to give those in need their time and talent or who stay at home and do the same in their local neighbourhood. That's what makes them heroic. There is nothing in it for them; they are drawn by bonds of love, faith or by a desire to create a better world. There are at least two ways we can hear Jesus' words in today's gospel. The first is as a strong challenge about social justice.

National boundaries mean nothing to God. All people are equal in God's sight, so the banquet Jesus refers to has implications for how we share the riches with which we have been blessed with others in the world. The poor, crippled, lame and blind of our world are the majority of God's children who mainly live in the Third World. They are our brothers and sisters. At the banquet of life Christians are called to give priority to the needs of these people, not only because they have a just claim on our resources, but also because they can't do anything for us in return. They purify our motives. When we link our concern, time, talent, career, and money with these children of God, we tame that nagging question, **'What's in it for me?'** with a firm reply, **'Very little – except God's justice.'**

A somewhat comforting angle to take on this gospel is more psychological. Many of us, when we come to God at any time, try to dress ourselves up to look better than we are! This gospel reminds us that at Christ's banquet, however, it's not the poised and perfect who are most welcome, but the vulnerable. What does this mean for us who pray and celebrate the Eucharist? That God embraces those parts of us that are in greatest need of his love and healing – where we are poor, crippled, blind and lame.

We know this it is true because if Jesus is telling us to host the poor and broken at our tables, then as the perfect host he must do exactly the same with us at this Eucharistic meal as well.

When I was a child we referred to our finest clothes as our **'Sunday best'** and we wore them proudly to Mass. Not only did we look good, we acted the part as well. Everyone was on best behaviour for the entire parish to see. Now, I have nothing against dressing with care and behaving well at Mass; it can be a sign of our self-respect, our courtesy toward others and our devotion to God. But God cares more about what's going on inside us. We can never hide from God, especially at the Eucharist because we have been invited to be here, not as we would like to be, but as we are.

May this Eucharist – this taste of heaven's justice – give us renewed courage to think beyond our self and national interests, and show to others the hospitality of God that has been lavished on us. May we discover that where faith is concerned, the answer to **'What's in it for me?'** is **'More than we can ever hope or imagine.'**

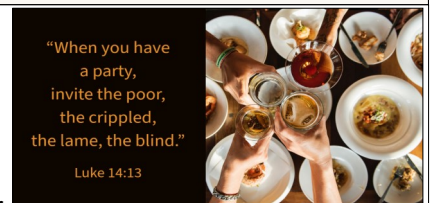

In the past week, Catholic Youth Broken Bay (CYBB) hosted more than 150 youth and young people for Praisefest which was supported by a number of communities and ministries including Catholic Schools Broken Bay, Youth Vinnies, Youth for Christ and Broken Bay's very talented young adults Glorious team of creative musicians, singers, dancers, writers and artists.



The generous parishioners and clergy from Our Lady of the Rosary, Gosford welcomed everyone with an excellent barbeque and supported the many stalls, games and live music, including the very popular Dance Off where youth ministers, teachers, religious and priests entertained everyone with their unexpected dance skills.

### FINANCE COMMITTEE REPORT TO PARISH YEAR ENDED 30th JUNE 2022

The Parish Finance Committee reports as follows on the financial position and performance of the Parish for the year ended 30th June 2022.

The Operating Profit for the year recorded a surplus of \$31,360 compared to a surplus of \$8,920 for the previous year. This improvement was mainly due to operating expenses being \$34,518 lower primarily from total employment expenses being \$32,581 less than the previous year. This was mainly due to the Parish Secretary being paid less by the Parish while receiving Covid payments from the Government during lockdown. This was offset by Altar & Church Requisites being \$2,549 higher, Insurance being \$3,183 higher and Repairs & Maintenance \$2,534 higher. Also Operating Income was \$12,077 lower than the previous year due to collections being \$18,378 lower mainly because there was no Mass attendance during Covid lockdown through to October 2021. This was offset by Other Parish Income being \$6,301 higher mainly due to higher income from Sacramental Programmes.

Non-Operating Income and Expenditure recorded a surplus of \$21,756 compared to a surplus of \$36,129 in the previous financial year. This was due to a decrease in Government Assistance for Covid-19 by \$20,650, and Donations for renovations to both churches by \$25,610. This was offset by a reduction in Capital Expenditure by \$28,911 due to the renovation costs to both Churches in the previous year. This resulted in a total surplus for the year of \$53,116 compared to a surplus of \$45,048 for the previous financial year.

The cash position of the Church A/c has improved by \$81,085 over the year to \$181,026 due to this surplus. There were also generous donations from parishioners towards expenditure to be incurred in the current financial year and an overpayment last year for Jobsaver totalling \$28,000.

A summary of these figures is included in this Bulletin and on the Parish's website.

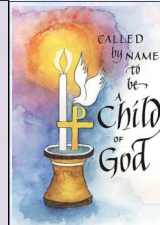

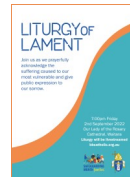

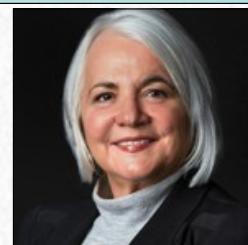
