Where is your treasure? © Dr Mary Coloe PBVM Colossians 3:1-5, 9-11; Luke 12:13-21



Today's Gospel gives us some insight into the concerns of Luke's community living towards the end of the first century. The issues of money, possessions and inheritance reflect the wealthier urban context of Luke's community rather than the rural village life of Jesus' mission. These same issues are very relevant for us today. How does a Christian live within the complex world of economics and global profit?

Jesus' words offer much wisdom. Security, and I would add happiness, does not come in owning more and more possessions. Security lies elsewhere. *Having* possessions is not the problem in this passage; it is insatiable greed in wanting more and more. This is the point of the parable.

Matthew's Gospel teaches the same point this way: 'Where your treasure is, there will your heart be also.' (Matt 6:21) So today might be well spent reflecting on these questions:

'Where is my treasure?' 'What is it in my life that I really value?' 'Where does my heart lie?' Where the parable speaks of harvests and barns, translate this into your own circumstances, a second car, a mobile phone, a bigger ..., the latest ..., a better

Sometimes life itself forces a person to reflect on the point of today's Gospel – a person hears s/he has a malignant tumour, or a failing heart. At these crisis times we can quickly re-evaluate the priorities in life, sometimes regretting that this lesson is learnt with little time left. Today, with life and time still available, check up on your true wealth, your real security.

Using the images and terms of his age Paul addresses much the same issue in this section from Colossians. Paul says, focus on God - this is to be your treasure. Anything that gets in the way of this wealth needs to be cut out from your life. At the heart of both readings lies the question of where to find true happiness, and deep inner peace. These passages remind me of a story told by the Indian Jesuit priest Anthony De Mello -'The Diamond'

The sannyasi had reached the outskirts of the village and settled down under a tree for the night when a villager came running up to him and said, "The stone! The stone! Give me the precious stone!" "What stone?" asked the sannyasi.

"Last night the Lord Shiva appeared to me in a dream," said the villager, "And told me that if I went to the outskirts of the village at dusk I should find a sannyasi who would give me a precious stone that would make my rich forever."

The sannyasi rummaged in his bag and pulled out a stone. "He probably meant this one," he said, as he handed the stone over to the villager. "I found it on a forest path some days ago. You can certainly have it." The man gazed at the stone in wonder. It was a diamond, probably the largest diamond in the whole world, for it was as large as a person's head.

He took the diamond and walked away. All night he tossed about in bed, unable to sleep. Next day at the crack of dawn he woke the sannyasi and said, "Give me the wealth that makes it possible for you to give this diamond away so easily." (Anthony de Mello, The Song of the Bird, Anand: HIS, 1983 pp 182-83.) This parable by Tony de Mello expresses the heart of Jesus' teaching that all one has and is, is gift. That real wealth lies in the abundant love of God - of living within and from that abundance. Such a person is never poor, and is always able to live generously.

What does such inner wealth look like?

Inner peace - generosity of spirit and goods - lack of envy - compassion for the neediness of others whose emptiness is insatiable and can never be filled - hospitality and freedom to act on behalf of the vulnerable and oppressed. Having nothing, the 'poor in spirit' have nothing to lose.



Vox Populi - The Voice of the People - 27 July 2022

The approaching month of August is an extremely busy one. It will provide everyone with many opportunities for prayer and good works!

We know good works are our actions or deeds and that both good works and faith are necessary for salvation. And that means works of love or charity.

Next week, from 1-7 August, the Diocese of Broken Bay will join with people from around Australia in highlighting the growing problem in our society of homelessness.

We know homelessness has increased by nearly 14% in the past four years; that 2 out of 5 people in this situation are under 25, and there has been a 28% increase in our 55+ men and women experiencing homelessness. People from our communities right across the Diocese are represented in those figures.

CatholicCare is the social care agency of our Catholic Church in the Diocese of Broken Bay. Their services are as diverse as the people they serve but their common commitment is to provide assistance where it is most needed.

In the coming weeks CatholicCare and Catholic Schools Broken Bay will work together to support our homelessness services, and Bishop Anthony Randazzo is encouraging us all to help with their fundraising where we can, and to keep the homeless or transient always in our prayers.

This is also a very special time of year when we pray for Vocations. The word "vocation" simply means "to be called" Every member of the Church is called to holiness but responding to that call is unique and particular for each one of

VOCATIONS

It is not about becoming someone we are not. It is about living out our baptismal call to follow and imitate Jesus, and by doing so we are able to discover what this specific call is.

For some it may mean marriage, or for others a call to the priesthood or religious life or to live as a single person. For our young men or women who are discerning a religious life, pray for them to be generous, and courageous.

There are also many memorials and feast days during the month of August, including the Feast of the Transfiguration of the Lord on Saturday 6 August, and one of our most

important feast days and Holy Day of Obligation, the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary on Monday 15 August.

Many opportunities to pray. And how to pray?

Pope St John Paull II had a fairly straightforward reply when asked this question.

"This is a simple matter. I would say; Pray any way you like, as long as you pray."
