In years gone by the major focus of this feast of Corpus Christi was a procession that usually concluded with Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament. Many of us have fond memories of Benediction: a bejewelled cope and monstrance, the flickering candles, the Divine Praises and Latin hymns. It all worked to create a magical atmosphere. As richly theatrical as it was, the magical side of it was part of the problem.

In medieval times Catholics rarely received Holy Communion. So much so it was in this context that the Church ruled that we have to communicate at least once a year. In the absence

of communion, veneration of the Blessed Sacrament took on a great significance. Seeing the host was thought to impart an intense power. Although in the last 100 years we have been encouraged to receive communion more frequently, the magical properties ascribed to the host persist in some people's devotional thinking. As Catholics we believe that Jesus is really and personally present to us in the broken bread and shared cup of the Eucharist. And although we believe that Christ is present in the Scriptures, the assembly and the ministers of the Church, we hold that Christ's presence under the form of bread and wine is one filled with the greatest intimacy and uniqueness.

The Eucharist is not intimate and unique because it is magic. It's not intimate and unique because we gaze upon the elements. The Eucharist is intimate and unique because earthly signs are transformed by God's love, and are consumed in faith. As we eat and drink these elements Christ becomes part of us, and we come alive in Christ.

In the fifth century Saint Augustine taught his people that if they truly loved the Eucharist they would become what they eat. The same is true for us today. By receiving into our hands the bread – blessed and broken, the cup – poured and shared, we say 'Amen' to becoming the same in Christ: blessed, broken, poured out and shared in love. We commune with God and God with us in the Eucharist so that just as earthly gifts are transformed into Christ so through us will be the entire world, and all things in it.

There is a huge and important difference between grace and magic. One is a trick for show. The other is the power of love, which expresses itself in faith, hope and service. In a profound poem French Jesuit Didier Rimaud challenges those of us who love the Eucharist to see it linked to the liberation begun in the Exodus, consummated in the Resurrection and working in our world today.

In remembrance of you, We take the bread of Easter in our hands,

This Bread do we consume:

It does no longer taste of bitter herbs, nor of unleavened bread. It is the bread of a land promised us where we shall be set free.

In remembrance of you, We take the wine of Easter at our feast,

This wine do we hold dear:

It does no longer taste of bitter springs, nor of dark salty pools. It is the wine of land promised us where we shall be made whole.

In remembrance of you, From exile we return.

In remembrance of you, We walk across the sea!

No wonder the early Christians called the Body and Blood of Christ, 'food for the journey'.



May this Eucharist strengthen and embolden us to help God liberate and transform the world through how we spend our lives.

The precious gift of faith in God and the knowledge of God, is given to every child in the public school system, by Catechists in our Parish,

but sadly we do not have enough Catechists. Can you help us to help them??

All lessons are prepared for you. They are simple and training is provided, but really just follow the script and watch the children's faces come to life hearing the "greatest story ever told."

*********************** **Testimonies from our Catechists:**

Coral Thaddeus: I joined the Catechist ministry 17 years ago firstly at my local school, Hornsby Heights. Then about 6 years ago I extended to Wideview at Berowra Heights. At both schools I teach years 1 & 2 and 3 & 4, a half hour session for each class on a Tuesday & Wednesday. I have been blessed with lovely children, great teachers in the classrooms and lots of support from the other catechists. Nothing can compare to the joy you feel to see the children's smiling faces and it certainly lifts your spirit. If you are thinking of joining, my advice is to give it a go, step out in faith and let the Lord work His magic on you.

Glenn Shapter: I have been teaching scripture for seven years. I live at Berowra and I teach scripture to years 3 & 4 at Berowra public and Hornsby North. The lessons are easy to teach and the students work along with you. After a few courses you will be ready to teach. There is always a school teacher in the class room.

Annette Shapter: I have been a catechist for seven years. I live in Berowra and teach scripture to years 1-2 at Berowra Public School on Wednesday morning 9-30 to 10 am. I started as a helper and now I am teaching the class by myself. If I can so can you. Come and join us.

Paul Worthington: I have been involved in catechetical teaching in both catholic schools and scripture in state schools for over 40 years. I have thoroughly enjoyed teaching in both systems but my involvement in scripture lessons has been a real highlight with the students who seek to know more about Christ. The students in our state schools across our parish are a real treasure who have a real sense of being the "hands, eyes and ears' for the mission of Jesus.

Mary Stokes: I have been a Catechist for many years off and on. Now I no longer have to go to work I can enjoy it more. Lessons laid out in our manuals are very easy to follow and don't require any complicated knowledge of our faith, just let your light shine as the song says. I once went to a hairdresser and she remembered I taught her Scripture in 4th Class at Hornsby North Public. If you don't feel confident about it come as a helper to one of the Catechists. You have no idea what influence our small input can have on the children's lives.

Cynthia Gilbertson: I have been a Catechist for seventeen and a half years and I have enjoyed every minute of teaching about the precious gift of faith and love of our Lord Jesus Christ. The children's little hearts and minds are pure and loving and I encourage them to keep these very special gifts forever. Sometimes I ask the children to say a prayer, in their own words - the honesty and simplicity of their thoughts, usually brings a tear to my eyes. This is truly a rewarding Ministry. Please join us, now. These children need you.

Mary McAleer: In August 2016 I was assisting my daughter in preparing my grandsons for the Sacrament of Confirmation. I was approached by our Catechist Co-ordinator and asked if I would like to be a Catechist. My immediate response was that I didn't feel I had the ability to teach children in our local Primary Schools, but I agreed to be a catechist helper. I attended the training at CCD Pennant Hills and became a class helper in October 2016. In January 2017 I was asked if I would take a class as one of the Catechists had retired. I said I would 'give it a go' and here I am 5 years on. Being a Catechist is a very rewarding ministry and I find teaching the children enlightens my faith and we grow together. Please consider joining our ministry. You will be given a teacher's manual that sets out each lesson for you and books for the students.

Greta Wickham: I have been a catechist for more than thirty years. I have been given the great gift of faith and if I can pass that gift onto others, I feel God will be very pleased with me. Please join our Ministry now.

This is such an important ministry ~ the taking of our Lord in the Eucharist to fellow parishioners who are unable to join us physically at Mass. The rewards are great and they just love to see you.

Their relationship to the earth is not broken at the consecration – on the contrary the earthiness of the elements is valorised and blessed.


