On Saturday 14 September, the Church celebrates the Feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross.

In one respect, this day commemorates the **discovery of the** relics of Christ's crucifixion by St Helena, in the fourth century and the dedication of the Church of the Holy Sepulcher Jerusalem. But in another respect this feast celebrates the event of Christ's Paschal Mystery.

Our first reading for this day (Num21:4-9) focuses the power of the cross to effect healing. Moses was commanded to create the image of a bronze serpent and mount it on a pole. Those who looked upon this image were healed from the effects of snake venom. This strange story is presented by the Fathers of the Church as a **foreshadowing of the cross**. What the cross effects is our healing—from the power of sin and death.

God wants to enter a **relationship of love with everyone.** This is offered in Jesus Christ, lifted upon the cross. Lifting our gaze should not enkindle **fear**, but **gratitude**, because that elevation is the measure of the love with which God, the Father loves His children in His Only Son, Jesus Christ. **"Do not forget the marvelous works of the Lord"** (Cf.Psalm 77).

Gospel Mark 7:31-37

Returning from the district of Tyre, Jesus went by way of Sidon towards the sea of Galilee, right through the Decapolis region. And they brought him a deaf man who had an impediment in his speech; and they asked him to lay his hand on him. He took him aside in private, away from the crowd, put his fingers into the man's ears and touched his tongue with spittle. Then looking up to heaven he sighed; and he said to him, 'Ephphatha,' that is, 'Be opened.' And his ears were opened, and the ligament of his tongue was loosened and he spoke clearly. And Jesus ordered them to tell no one about it, but the more he insisted, the more widely they published it. Their admiration was unbounded. 'He has done all things well,' they said 'he makes the deaf hear and the dumb speak.'




Children's Choir @ St Patrick's
