REFLECTION by Dianne Bergant CSA

Humans see and judge by appearances, but God looks into the heart, and there finds the real person. God's standards are not superficial, as are so many of the standards of the world. It is not age, beauty or physical strength that is important; it is not social position or religious role that is preferred. God chooses whom God chooses. God saw in David, the insignificant shepherd, the potential for being the chief shepherd of his people. The man who was born blind became the one through whom others would see the mighty works of God. Yet, neither young David nor the man in the gospel made the initial step; each simply responded with openness to God's choice of him.

By what criteria do we judge others? Do we consider some people too insignificant for greatness? Are we overly concerned with status? Do we categorise people according to the disease or physical limitation that they must endure? Do we sometimes blame them for their disability? Do our eyes perceive life in accord with the standards of a materialistic, body-orientated, pleasure-seeking society? Or do we look into the other's heart, as God does?

As with the other scrutiny Sundays, catechumens and long-standing members alike are exhorted to make a choice. Jesus is the one who gives sight to blind eyes and religious insight to those open to receive it. However, there is a price to pay. Will it be the standards of the world, or the power of God in Jesus Christ?

Ola! I'm Adeline and I'm heading to Portugal this year along with our 4 other LNSP WYD Pilgrims. Many of you will know me because I support the music at Mass at each of our churches. You might also know that I am our Parish Youth Coordinator. World Youth Day played an enormous part in my discernment journey. When I was 16, I was sponsored by



a generous parishioner to attend WYD in Poland. I had no idea what to expect really, but I could hardly contain my excitement. I made it my mission to have an authentic encounter with Jesus unlike any I had ever had up until that time. I asked, I prayed, and as always, God answered. On that pilgrimage, I met the Holy Spirit for the very first time. Of course, God's Spirit had always been with me, but I'd never been cognisant of that until I was standing in a field with 2 million other Catholic youths praying with our Pope and sharing in the offering of the Mass. From that day on, my life was changed. I'd always been a Mass-going Catholic, but my relationship with God and the Eucharist took on a whole new meaning after I met the Holy Spirit. The magnitude of this event cannot be understated, and being among that crowd of people from all countries, attending Mass in other languages, sharing a love of Christ and bonding with strangers over that incredible love, watching nuns play volleyball and seeing priests dance through the streets, hearing the chants of people from all over the world and journeying together in solitude all contributed to my passion for youth ministry. Without WYD, I'm not sure I'd be a youth leader today. This year, I'm attending WYD as a Pilgrim Group Leader for our Diocese of Broken Bay. I'm excited to be working with other young leaders, as well as Bishop Anthony and the Executive Team, to ensure we can facilitate opportunities for pilgrims to encounter God in the very real and very life-changing way pilgrims have to pay for their trips in early April, so our LNS Pilgrims only have 2 more weeks to that I did. Dear Friends,

Along with the Lower North Shore Parish Finance Committee, I present to you the Annual Financial Report of our Parish community. We have sought to provide you with as helpful an amount of information as possible.



The 2021/22 financial year continued to be challenging at times, however we were fortunate enough to be able to open our doors for the majority of the year. If you were able to join us, many of you

continued to give very generously to the Parish through your weekly donations and many of you also continued to embrace the "Tap N Go" terminals in each Church. For those who were not able to return in person, your continued support through online giving also very much assisted our Parish. Sadly,

despite significant Government financial support during lockdowns, our revenue from various

traditional means for donations and collections continues to decline year-on-year. The financial

viability of our Parish to properly perform ministry and evangelisation and at the same time to meet its operating costs is principally dependent on the continued financial support of our generous Parish community.

For those of you who are already a part of our planned giving program, might you be able to increase your donation, even if only by a few dollars? If this is not possible right now, then your ongoing

prayers and thoughts are always appreciated.

I want to take this opportunity to thank most warmly our Finance Committee, for contributing their time in such a generous way to the financial life of our community. I record my gratitude, and that of the Committee to our recently appointed Parish Bookkeeper, who provides the Committee with

comprehensive and extensive financial reports on a quarterly basis. I also thank the members of our Parish Missionary Council who dedicate their time and energy to our Parish, providing tremendous support and sharing their wisdom.

I extend my sincere appreciation to our Parish Secretary, Sacramental Coordinator and Catechist

Coordinator for their valuable support and expertise. A very big thank you also to Fr Biju and Fr Chima for their invaluable assistance and support throughout the year.

OUR COLLECTIONS

INFORMATION ON THE COLLECTIONS IN THE PARISH

The First Collection

The proceeds from the First Collection, as well as Stole fees (donations for Baptisms, Weddings and Funerals) are for the support of the Priests and Bishops in our Diocese.

After covering the household expenses of the clergy in our Parish, the balance of the Collection is passed over to a pooled fund that provides Stipends for all active Priests, supports our retired clergy and pays clergy medical costs. A portion of the collection (15%) is allocated to a fund to support the Bishop (and retired Bishops) and his office.

Personal mass offerings and gifts remain with individual Priests.

Pastoral Works Broken

Bay (formerly Charitable Works Fund).

Commencing 2022/23 the Pastoral Works Broken Bay collections will be held twice a year. Donations, which are tax deductible, directly support the people of our Diocese. These are:

- 1. Confraternity of Christian Doctrine (CCD)
- 2. CatholicCare Hospital Chaplaincy and Pastoral Care Practitioners
- 3. Ephpheta Centre
- 4. St Lucy's School
- 5. St Edmund's College

The Second Collection

The Second Collection (Loose and Tap N Go) and Planned Giving (envelopes, credit cards and direct bank transfers) are for the needs of the Parish.

These funds support our parish ministries, meet the administration costs including electricity and insurance and the maintenance of the Parish buildings. as detailed on the following pages.



Devotional Candle Stands

The monies donated for the intentions of the donors at the candle stand, are placed at the service of Parish special appeals.

Peter's Pence: conducted on the first weekend in July and sent to the Vatican as a response from the faithful to support the charitable activities of the Holy See.

Project Compassion: conducted during Lent each year for Caritas, the Catholic organisation that provides humanitarian assistance to people in need.

St Vincent de Paul Appeals: held twice a year for the Winter Appeal and Christmas Appeal.

Holy Places: held on Good Friday to promote missionary work of the Church and support education, health, medical and social works for the people of the Holy Land and to preserve and restore sacred historical sites.

OUR FINANCES

OVERVIEW OF OUR PARISH FINANCES FY2021/22

The ongoing impacts of the COVID pandemic, coupled with declining planned giving contributions and the loss of rent from the Naremburn property all contributed to a net deficit of \$187K.

Government COVID assistance totaling \$45k received throughout the year partially offset extra costs that the Parish incurred to comply with COVID obligations, including making our churches safe and to enable the Parish to continue its various Ministries which otherwise would not have been possible in these difficult times. Government financial assistance programmes are no longer available.


Key Outcomes With Income

2021/22 total Church operating income declined by 15.8% on the prior year.

Unfortunately, first and second collections giving continues to steadily decline year-on-year (refer to graphs).


Key Outcomes With Expenditure

2021/22 total Church operating expenditure had decreased by 5% on the prior year (driven largely by Government subsidising wages during lockdowns). Wage expenses will increase again in the coming financial year as Government subsidies are no longer available.

Notes for FY2021/22:

- Office Staff wages accounted for \$126,253 of total operating expenditure
- Music Ministry wages accounted for \$116,380 of total operating expenditure
- Figures exclude expenditure incurred on the proposed Naremburn development (\$282K). This amount is covered by the payment received from the developer as part of the development rights payment.
- PWBB collections shortfall of \$56,062 which is required to be paid from Parish funds. Target for FY2022/23 is \$77,738.

OUR FINANCES

Key Outcomes With Income:

- Recurring planned second collection (credit cards, direct debits and envelopes) income decreased by 11.8% on the prior year.
- Second collection loose and Tap N Go income declined by 11.6% on the prior year reflecting reduced Mass attendance due to COVID restrictions.
- Total Church revenue (excl. Govt. Subsidies) declined by \$97K or 15.8% on the prior year driven mainly by significant decreases in planned giving (11.8%), unplanned giving (11.3%), one-off donations (28.5%), and interest income from Term Deposits (58.9%).
- The above significant decreases in income were only partially offset by Government assistance subsidies.

Key Outcomes With Expenditure:

Total Church operating expenses declined by \$37K or 5% on the prior year.

- Key drivers were reductions in Motor Vehicle costs, IT expenses, and Altar & Church requisites.
- Employment expenses also declined due to COVID closures but will increase again in the new financial year.
- Any increases in operating expenses were offset by these larger cost savings.

Latest from Letefoho



This weekend is LETS Awareness weekend. We are not holding a collection, but you are more than welcome to donate to the LETS projects via BPoint on the Parish website.

To remind you all LETS stands for Letefoho East Timor Support. Letefoho is a remote subdistrict in the mountains of Timor Leste. It includes 65 villages and 25,000+ people. It is a very poor area of one of the poorest countries in the world. LNSP has been supporting Letefoho through LETS since September 2013.

Our past projects include:

1) The complete renovation of a high school

2) the building of a boarding house for girls



3) Vehicles for the community









4) The extension of an old building to be a boarding house for boys



Our ongoing projects continue to include students sponsorship for high school students and students attending tertiary education institutions. This year we will be expect to be sponsoring a total of 95 high school students and 65 tertiary students. This is a most effective level of support for a very poor community, which provides for future self-sustainability and improved quality of life for not just the students, but



the whole community.

LETS continues to send reconditioned laptops, school supplies and occasionally books to Letefoho, with the great

support of D B Schenker Australia to transport the goods to Melbourne for us and then Rotary Donations in Kind for transport to Timor Leste.

This year we are working towards:

- 1. funding repairs to the older section of the boys' boarding house (~AUD9,524)
- 2. completion of the Eraulo chapel. Eraulo is a village of Letefoho with a significant position.
- 3. funding a new project of pig farming. Initiated by the Letefoho Parish, this project is to be the base of a village project for families to eventually grow and sell pigs themselves.

We are very fortunate to have LETS as a part of our Parish community. It is a LNSP project that is now in its 10 year, thanks to the wonderful support of our Parish Priests and you, our Parishioners!
