## **Dear Parishioners,**

Thank you to those of you who were able to attend the Parish forum in late February regarding potential development of the Parish site at St Leonard's, Naremburn. My thanks as well to many of you who responded to the 'Parish Needs Assessment' questionnaire. I was delighted to receive your feedback and questions. Your responses overall were very positive, providing us a solid starting point for our ongoing discernment. I would like to share with you the feedback received, the opportunity to provide continued feedback and the next steps, as well as invite you to our next Parish Forum on **Wednesday, 22 May at 7.30-9.00pm** at the hall at St Leonards, Naremburn.

### **The Discernment Process**

The steps involved in the process include undertaking due diligence, seeking expert advice to help us discern our future, continuing to consult and seek feedback along the way, responding to queries and any concerns and providing a sense of timing.

Importantly, I would like to reassure everyone that this is just the beginning of the process, there will be no rush in making decisions and I will ensure there is ample opportunity to provide input and feedback.

While appreciating there has been some historic planning considered, but not progressed, the purpose of our first forum held in February was to commence our collective reflection and discernment regarding:

Our future and sustainability of the Parish.

Development opportunities for consideration in the context of our parish needs and requirements centred on our Mission and vision.

Possible next steps & timing for consideration.

An invitation for parishioner input to help formulate our direction and decisions.

### **Parish Mission & Vision**

Emma McDonald, the Diocesan Financial Administrator advised us at the forum that the first step for us as a Parish in discerning our future requirements and development options, was the need to consider together our Parish vision and mission and what our Parish needs might be as a result. Emma explained that prior to engaging any market interest regarding potential property development, it is important that we first develop a brief of requirements and expectations that we hope to achieve in support of our Mission.

This provides me the opportunity to share with you again our Parish Mission which is centred on:

#### ***Assisting parishioners to build a stronger relationship with God by:***

Educating parishioners through prayer, programmes and the sacraments.

Listening and responding to the hopes, needs and concerns of parishioners.

Re-engaging with those who have lost touch with the church.

#### ***Encouraging a strong parish faith community by:***

Encouraging parishioners to participate in and give of their talents in the work of the various parish ministries.

Supporting the creation of new groups.

Setting goals for the community within the framework of the Diocesan priorities.

#### ***Spreading our faith into the wider community by:***

Reaching out to those that are not engaged in our church/parish.

Supporting programs for the disadvantaged and those in need whether they be local, national or international.

Putting our faith into practice through works of love and generosity to others.

## Response to the Parish Needs Assessment - Overall reflections

There was a clear majority of responses favouring the exploration of development on the site in support of our Mission. Many of you indicated your support in embracing changes as a wonderful opportunity to enhance the Parish site with new and renewed assets and to secure both our spiritual and financial sustainability well into the future.

People also emphasised the need to ensure that whatever may be developed that it has to connect to the Mission of the Parish, promoting our Catholic values and ethos.

The clear preference for possible development on the site was aged care given the growing need in the area and the nearby location of Royal North Shore Hospital. Many people felt child care was not viable, nor needed as much as aged care. Key worker accommodation was also a suggestion, along with respite for the young and physically disabled, as well as residential apartments. Two people indicated that a school may still be required. People were in support of CatholicCare remaining on site.

While the majority of responses indicated in favour of considering all redevelopment options of the site, there were some suggestions that the current presbytery might be repurposed for another use such as a women's refuge or for the homeless. Both of which can be factored in to options when 'testing the market'.

Not surprisingly, there was an overwhelming response to the need for carparking, more than 20 spaces. The importance of ingress and egress for cars was also considered very important.

The redevelopment and creation of a modern multipurpose hall, that can be divided and partitioned, that is supported by an industrial kitchen and multimedia technology, also featured significantly in the responses. In promoting mission, people felt it is important to create meeting rooms, spaces and facilities to invite people to the Parish, an opportunity to reach out and to grow the parish, 'placing evangelisation front and centre' focused on faith formation.

It was clear that it is important that the Church curtilage is retained and enhanced, not encroached upon. That St Leonard's is maintained as a place of invitation and welcome to all, an opportunity to reach out more widely to the community, providing *'A stronger sense of community. A friendly, open, welcoming space for all people, an easy place to be'*. There was also a strong sense that the Church needs to be restored as appropriate.

***Some challenges and concerns raised are also acknowledged and appreciated*** - namely understanding the process and steps involved, understanding the nature of long term leasing and what partnering with a developer might look like, and safeguards the Parish will need to implement as a result. There will be continued opportunity to discuss and discern in greater detail throughout this process and this will feature significantly at the next Parish forum.

In summary, through the initial feedback from the Missionary Council and Finance Committee members, and now based on initial Parishioner feedback, the key needs identified include:

- Consider heritage requirements of the Church building and determine any renovation needs, including catering for overflow, potentially connected by a newly developed hall;
- Ensure a green space Church curtilage – enhance not encroach, a place of welcome and invitation;
- The Parish Hall needs to be rebuilt, fit for purpose and close by and easily accessible from the Church;
- New and accessible toilet facilities is important;
- Drive in and out, ingress and egress (for Church Funerals and Weddings) is vital;
- That any development option should not overdevelop the site;
- Predominantly, the mixes of uses need to respond to mission and sustainability of the Parish. The majority of responses received were a preference for seniors living or aged care;
- Any commercial return is to be invested in the parish;
- More than 20 carparking spaces is needed. Overwhelmingly, the majority of responses indicated the priority need for carparking if we are to sustain the parish;
- A desire to ensure CatholicCare remain on site;
- Any new development should include a newly developed Presbytery – however still consider adaptive uses of the current presbytery as an option;



- Also consider and respond to community needs such as respite accommodation, affordable housing and key worker accommodation as possible options;
- The land is not for sale.

I am mindful of your feedback and the desire to protect and enhance the curtilage of our heritage listed Church as well as consideration of a revitalised Church, newly developed Parish hall and facilities, the need for parking and the ongoing desire to retain CatholicCare services on the site, and to ensure most importantly, that our mission and faith formation are at the forefront of our ongoing discernment at all times, driving our decision making process.

### **Due diligence and independent advice**

Engaging with you and inviting your input is one part of the process. Just as critical a step is undertaking some preliminary due diligence and market analysis.

This is sometimes referred to as a '*Highest & Best Use Financial Feasibility Study*'. In undertaking this initial work, resulting in a comprehensive report, it provided us with a solid base of understanding from which we are able to make informed, evidence-based decisions.

This preliminary investigative work was only undertaken to verify what possible options there might be to present to the Parish for consideration. Reassuringly, the result of this work indicated there is more than one possible option to explore, albeit each with their own set of challenges and opportunities.

This work helps us to identify and confirm the future development potential and associated financial value. It is important that we undertook this process so we could demonstrate transparency (that any development we might consider is aligned to market conditions), as well as provide reassurance and confidence that there is development potential and interest.

We undertook this work last year so that we could clearly articulate the redevelopment potential of St Leonard's to you in our first of many Parish forums. A key outcome of this work was to ensure we were fully informed in relation to St Leonard's development and value potential and that it provided us, the Parish, with a base from which to make decisions regarding the future use and development.

This is an important first step to ensure when engaging with you to ask about your hopes and desires for our much loved St Leonards, that from a starting point, we know with some confidence whether or not it might be feasible.

I also assure you, that in undertaking a review of the site and understanding its market value, that is not to say we have any plans to overdevelop the site. The purpose is to ensure that we are able to afford any identified renewed assets focussed on renewing and growing our mission as well as providing an income that will assist in ensuring our financial sustainability.

Apart from preliminary 'massing diagrams' developed in consideration of what might fit on the site, no detailed plans of any options have yet been developed. Design concepts will form part of the next phase, once we are sure we have clear support from you to further investigate and present to you for consideration. I assure you that from my perspective, the Parish is still looking at options and will not be committing itself to any definite course of action until the options have been thoroughly considered and the Parish has had time to consider and discuss them.

### **Next Steps - process**

**Continued Parish Consultation** - To bring all of the above detail to life, and to share and discern together, providing us a further opportunity to seek your input, I would like to invite you to our next Parish Consultation Forum on **Wednesday, 22 May at 7.30-9.00pm** at the hall at St Leonards, Naremburn. All Parishioners are welcome and encouraged to attend!

Ongoing consultation and discernment is crucial. I will endeavour to keep you informed through a variety of ways, sometimes via the Parish bulletin, questionnaires, Parish consultation forums, one on one meetings – all throughout the various stages of the process.

**Parish Needs Assessment** – Continue to discern our Parish needs through ongoing consultation until we feel comfortable and are supportive of taking whatever option or options that are still to be agreed upon to the market to seek potential interest.

**Establish a Steering Committee** – the formation of a Parish Steering Committee will be considered, drawing on experts from both the PFC and Missionary Council, as well as people from the wider Parish to assist in the process of ongoing consultation and preparing to engage the market more widely, seeking potential developer interest. Further to these members, the Committee will also be supported by the Parish's appointed experts and members of the Diocese.

**Engaging the Market** - Having undertaken some preliminary due diligence regarding potential development opportunities, once the Parish Needs Assessment has been finalised, it is envisaged that property consultant experts will be appointed to represent the Parish in engaging the market more widely through an **Expressions of Interest Campaign** to determine development interest in the site and design concepts for consideration. It is at this point that possible design options could be presented to the Parish for consideration.

As part of this process, it is very important to ensure we determine our Parish needs as an initial step – what are your hopes for the life of your Parish?

In engaging the market it will assist in:

Determining actual interest in the site.

Identifying potential development partners.

Identifying design concepts for the Parish's consideration.

As part of this process, all potential development partners will be well briefed on our vision for the Parish. BUT, we are a long way away from this stage of the process. We are at the beginning of this journey.

I remain most grateful to members of my Parish Missionary Council and Parish Finance Committee in providing me guidance and advice as well as to all of you for your shared interest, enthusiasm and strong desire to sustain our wonderful Parish well into the future.

Wishing you all the joy and blessings of the Holy Easter Season and I hope you can join us on **22 May** at our next consultation forum.

Stabat Mater is the title of a 13th century Latin hymn meaning "the Mother was standing", describing the sorrow of Mary, the mother

of Jesus, at the foot of the Cross. It has been a source of inspiration for many composers, but it is the anguished setting of Italian composer Giovanni Battista Pergolesi in 1736, which he composed in the final weeks of his life.

The work is divided into twelve movements and will be played after each Station of the Cross.
