#### **True Perspectives**

Did you notice that Our Lord does not command us to love 'God'? No, we are to love 'the *Lord* your God', the One who rescued the Jewish people from slavery. The resurrection of Jesus Christ reveals the Lord God as the liberator from the apparent final dominance of death. Loving such a liberator is the natural response. So, 'Love *the Lord* your God'. Then Our Lord does not command us to love our neighbour! Rather, 'Love your neighbour as *yourself*.' But who is 'yourself'? In the wonderful story-telling of Genesis, we are told that Adam, an earthen statue, had Divine Breath breathed into the nostrils, creating him as a human being. We earthlings are conceived with the Divine Breath at the core of our being.

The challenge for you and for me is to see 'yourself' in that way, and thereafter every human being whose lives we can affect: the neighbour. And in today's global world, the neighbour can be a person in a society geographically or culturally distant.

#### A reading from the first letter of St Paul to the Thessalonians You turned away from idols to serve God and await his Son.

You observed the sort of life we lived when we were with you, which was for your instruction, and you were led to become imitators of us, and of the Lord; and it was with the joy of the Holy Spirit that you took to the gospel, in spite of the great opposition all round you. #### Dear Parishioners,

I am pleased to be writing to you with an update regarding the potential development of the Parish site at St Leonard's, Naremburn.

With our parish consultation undertaken and forums held throughout 2019, culminating in the consensus to proceed with testing the market via an Expression of Interest (**EOI**) campaign in early 2021, we were met with the challenges of the Covid -19 pandemic. As a result the Parish Finance Committee felt we should hold off until more was known about the impact on the property market. With that, we put the matter on hold.

As a recap of where things were left at the end of 2019 - parishioners throughout our consultation process expressed a clear desire to protect and enhance the curtilage of our heritage listed St Leonard's Church, along with the need to continue to maintain it and ensure as the result of any potential development that newly developed Parish hall and facilities would be provided along with adequate car parking and additional income to sustain the parish well into the future. Additionally, there was also a desire to retain CatholicCare services on the site (if possible). Most importantly, there was also a strong desire to ensure that our mission and faith formation remain at the forefront of our ongoing discernment at all times, driving our decision making process.

Having undertaken some preliminary due diligence and our parish discernment, we determined to proceed with engaging the services of Charter Keck Cramer, property consultants, to represent the Parish in engaging the market through an EOI Campaign, with the appointment of a real estate agent, to determine development interest in the site and design concepts for consideration.

You would also recall as part of reaching this decision, we would go to the market with two development scenarios in mind, retaining CatholicCare on site as a development option, and one without. The results of which will provide the basis of future discussions with CatholicCare and the optimal outcome for both parties.

The purpose of conducting an EOI campaign and engaging the market will assist in:

Ultimately confirming our preliminary findings by understanding the value, opportunity and challenges

Determining real interest in the site by identifying potential development partners

Discerning with you, parishioners, the potential interest

Identifying design concepts for the our further consideration together as a parish

Assisting in navigating any commercial agreement as a result of the above.

In late August we recommenced consideration of the timing of the launch of the EOI campaign and as a result determined that we would proceed in this second half of the calendar year (November 2020). The factors the PFC took into account were that the COVID-19 case numbers have stabilised in NSW and as a result, sentiment and confidence has improved significantly with developers and investors in NSW actively looking at opportunities. Of further appeal to developers is that our proposed project at Naremburn differs from traditional development site sales insofar as the development partner would not be required to invest in the site outright upfront, with a view to activating the project/commencing construction within the medium term of the next 3 to 5 years.

Against this background, and in order to have a potential development partner identified prior to Christmas, I am delighted to advise the the EOI campaign will **commence from 2 November**.

We have also discerned proposals from real estate agents and I am also pleased to advise that Colliers have been appointed to represent the parish.

The EOI campaign will run from 2 November to 2 December.

The EOIs received will then be evaluated with a view to shortlisting possible development partners, with the hope of having a preferred developer identified by Christmas. This will then provide an opportunity to present the outcomes to you for consideration in early 2021 via a parish consultation forum.

I look forward to this next exciting step and sharing the results with you.
