Liturgically, the Octave of Christmas commemorates: the Solemnity of the Mother of God; the day designated for prayers for global peace; and the beginning of the New Year. Though the shepherds gain insight into the presence of God by seeing this holy family, it is Mary who holds all these things in her heart. She is the one who ponders the significance of these mysterious events. Mary becomes for Christians an inspiration of contemplation and reflection. She inspires us to consider deeply the significance of events, lest we go blandly through life without meaning or direction. She inspires us to fidelity to the practices of our faith, practices which are the disciplines of soul that lead the community to a clearer focus on God's presence in human affairs.

The theme of peace appears today on many levels. Its meaning, 'fullness of life', bursts forth in every one of the readings. The ancient prayer or blessing of peace is an appropriate start for the New Year. It resonates well with the angels' wish for people of good will. Peace is also our inheritance in Christ. As adopted children of God, we have been given the freedom to live in a godly manner, calling God our *Abba*. Right relationships in the covenant activity of God are the pathways of peace. The beginning of a New Year is a good time to reach out to others and to pray for God's blessing of peace for each dimension of human encounter.

Latest from Letefoho - December 2022



Having recently visited Letefoho... here is the latest update!

Firstly, I was constantly overwhelmed by the gratitude of the students we sponsor, their parents and other members of the Letefoho Parish, I had the pleasure to meet. The head of the Letefoho Parish Council sincerely thanked not just me, but the members of LETS and all the Parishioners of LNSP for their continuing love and generosity towards the people of Letefoho. He warmly invited you to a special ceremony in August 2023, to close the visit of the Youth

Cross (Crux Joven) to Letefoho. We also hope to include the official opening of the Eraulo church at that time.

During 2022, Our Lady of Mt Carmel Senior High School (years 10,11,12) boasted an enrolment of 301 students - the highest number of students since 2014, with LETS sponsoring a total of 88 students. Each year since 2016, the Year 12 students give back to the school at the end of their final year. This year's class are contributing to the financing (through fundraising) and building of a covered outdoor area. They raised funds by selling cooked meals to other students. The boys boarding house additions are finished, but rain has damaged parts of the original building, so further work is needed.

In



discussions with the school board, we explored future projects for the Letefoho community and steps toward self-sufficiency. Pork is becoming a very popular protein source so the Parish is looking into starting a piggery which will eventually involve the whole community as a income source.

Our sponsored students are doing very well and working so hard to achieve good results. To the left you will see most of are the school students.


