#### **REFLECTION by Dianne Bergant CSA**

We know that we will all have to face some kind of suffering, and so we try to prepare ourselves for it. Yet when it comes, as prepared as we try to be, it can overtake us with such fury that we fall back defenceless. We look to others for support and assistance, and if we are fortunate, we find it. However, even in the most supportive of communities, suffering tends to alienate us from those who are healthy and secure. Suffering reminds us of our own finitude and the contingent nature of all of life. It threatens our sense of order.

Jesus is not deterred by human suffering. He welcomes all who approach him; his healing touch reincorporates those who have been ostracised; his loving embrace reassociates those who have been alienated. In the reign of God, there are no outsiders. All belong to Jesus, and, therefore, all belong to each other. When the one afflicted is embraced by the community, the community is an authentic manifestation of the inclusive reign of God.

In suffering we witness human vulnerability and our desperate need of each other and of God. There, at the edge of life and on the fringes of the community, we may experience the tenderness and compassion of God. The loving touch of Christ that can heal our souls, if not our bodies. The man went away, but then started talking about it freely and telling the story everywhere, so that Jesus could no longer go openly into any town, but had to stay outside in places where nobody lived. Even so, people from all around would come to him.

#### LITURGICAL MUSIC AT LNS PARISH

Why do we do what we do?

When choosing music for our weekend Masses, we should preserve the gifts we have received from the past. A mix of old and new music is often appreciated by our congregations, who are diverse in age and experience. There is a long tradition of music from our ancient treasury, and so from time to time, we may include some chant; currently, in Lent, the Seasonal use of the Chant Mass is helpful in focussing our minds and hearts as we reflect and focus towards Easter.

There are also opportunities to use more charismatic music e.g. meditative music of Taize, and new songs from contemporary genres when they fit the occasion and the congregation.

Always, the general theme of the music choices varies with the readings from week to week; Lent 3 has the "Water of Life" as a theme. There may be an over-arching theme too, e.g. The Year of Mercy which was celebrated in 2016. There are certain things which we try to preserve; e.g. singing the psalm, which is fitting as they were written as songs.

Its good to be creative and to include new music too, as much of the music which we love and use repeatedly, can, even with the best of efforts, become stale and no longer serve to elevate our minds to prayer. So, as they say, variety is the spice of life! We change not to give the choir something else to showcase, but to keep turning our hearts, minds and spirits towards the presence of God in our lives through our sung prayer, and especially when we are together, for our celebrations of the Eucharist in Mass.

Our Parish choir comes together for rehearsal every Monday evening at St Thomas' 7:30pm, alternating Traditional and Contemporary styles of music. Rehearsals for Easter have begun. All welcome.
