#### THREE HUMMOCK ISLAND

The sons of Zebedee expected Jesus to lead a Messianic revolt to throw off the yoke of imperial Rome. But they wanted to be part of a similar sort of power structure. They had not grasped that Jesus had come to turn that sort of society upside down.

However, over the centuries, the Church took on much of the trappings of power of imperial Rome. The popes governed much of Italy. Giuseppe Garibaldi was one of those generals who defeated the forces defending the Papal States, and in doing so actually liberated the papacy from its role as feudal overlord of much of Italy.

In the course of the campaign, when despondent, Garibaldi often reflected on the delightful time he spent on Three Hummock Island just off the coast of Tasmania. So we may say that the liberation of the papacy, enabling it to respond more clearly to today's Gospel, began in Tasmania!

Pope Francis embodies the spirit of today's Gospel. He rails against a Church exhibiting 'the leprosy of a feudal court'. Rather, he has said: 'I see the Church as a field hospital after battle. Heal the wounds, heal the wounds.' And in his actions he has shown himself as a true 'Servant of the servants of God' as Jesus commands in today's Gospel.

We may pause for a moment to pray for Pope Francis that he may have the strength and time to persevere in his responding to today's Gospel so that the papacy may be truly liberated so as to practise a radically different way of exercising leadership in the Church and for the world.



#### **GOSPEL**

Mk 10:35-45

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Mark

The Son of Man came to give his life as a ransom for all.

James and John, the sons of Zebedee, approached Jesus. 'Master,' they said to him, 'we want you to do us a favour.' He said to them, 'What is it you want me to do for you?' They said to him, 'Allow us to sit one at your right hand and the other at your left in your glory.' 'You do not know what you are asking' Jesus said to them. 'Can you drink the cup that I must drink, or be baptised with the baptism with which I must be baptised?' They replied, 'We can.' Jesus said to them, 'The cup that I must drink you shall drink, and with the baptism with which I must be baptised you shall be baptised, but as for seats at my right hand or my left, these are not mine to grant; they belong to those to whom they have been allotted.'

When the other ten heard this they began to feel indignant with James and John, so Jesus called them to him and said to them: 'You know that among the pagans their so-called rulers lord it over them, and their great men make their authority felt. This is not to happen among you. No; anyone who wants to become great among you must be your servant, and anyone who wants to be first among you must be slave to all. For the Son of Man himself did not come to be served but to serve, and to give his life as a ransom for many.'

#### THE SYNOD OF BISHOPS



In March 2020, Pope Francis announced that the theme for the XVI Ordinary General Assembly of the Synod of Bishops would be "For a Synodal Church: Communion, Participation and Mission". The journey towards the celebration of the Synod in October 2023 will solemnly open on October 9-10, 2021 in Rome, and on October 17 in each particular Church.

For a synodal Church On September 7, 2021, the preparatory document and the vademecum (handbook) for the synodal journey were

released. With the convocation of the Synod of Bishops on the themes of communion, participation and mission, Pope Francis invites the entire Church to reflect on a theme that is decisive for its life and mission: "It is precisely this path of synodality which God expects of the Church of the third millennium. This journey, which follows in the wake of the Church's 'renewal' proposed by the Second Vatican Council, is both a gift and a task." 

## Reporting on the Plenary—Tricia Gemmell, (First appeared in Grail Website)

The week of the Plenary Council was exhilarating, fascinating, and exhausting, as I watched the livestream events, listened to almost every media podcast on offer and read all the blogs. By all reports, this was a historic turning point in the life of the Australian Catholic Church, the presence of the Holy Spirit was keenly felt, and even the cynics were surprised at what emerged. The official Plenary Podcast (<a href="https://anchor.fm/plenarypodcast">https://anchor.fm/plenarypodcast</a>) and Geraldine Doogue's series, Plenary Matters (<a href="https://podcasts.apple.com/au/podcast/plenary-matters/id1587458085">https://podcasts.apple.com/au/podcast/plenary-matters/id1587458085</a>) are both available, as are the livestreamed events on the Plenary Council website (<a href="https://plenarycouncil.catholic.org.au">https://plenarycouncil.catholic.org.au</a>). There was also a nightly Plenary Tracker delivered by Concerned Catholics Canberra Goulburn and Garratt Publishing, for which some three and a half thousand people registered. The ABC Religion and Ethics Report devoted a few programs to the event, the Drum interviewed Geraldine Doogue and Francis Sullivan one night, and daily blogs were delivered by both Francis Sullivan and John Warhurst. If you are in need of a full account of all the media offerings, go to the news page of the Catalyst for Renewal website and you will find it there.

My own recommendations, if you just want a taste of the Council, would be to listen to Archbishop Mark Coleridge interviewed by Geraldine on the last day of the Council (<a href="https://podcasts.apple.com/au/podcast/plenary-matters/">https://podcasts.apple.com/au/podcast/plenary-matters/</a> <a href="https://anchor.fm/">id1587458085</a>), and to Jude Hennessy interviewing Sr Monica Cavanagh and Selena Hasham (<a href="https://anchor.fm/">https://anchor.fm/</a> <a href="plenary-podcast-Saturday-Sr-Monica-Cavanagh-RSJ-Selina-Hasham-e18im05">https://anchor.fm/</a> <a href="plenary-podcast-Saturday-S

It was also very gratifying during the course of the week to hear so much about women preaching coming up. On Tuesday 6 October, Day 2 of the first session of the Plenary Council, John Warhurst blogged about 16 interventions made by members, saying one thread was strong, though not unanimous: "thoughtful and passionate advocacy for women preaching." On that same day Geraldine Doogue interviewed Fr. Peter Williams (Vicar-General of Parramatta), who mentioned "a very interesting suggestion" around extending who should preach in the church, while David Ranson, interviewed for the Plenary Podcast, reported that there was an intervention "quite bold in its scope," about developing the ministry of preaching and making it more inclusive. Dr Maeve Heaney, on the Religion and Ethics Report that day, also talked about allowing women to preach, as did Francis Sullivan on the Drum the following evening, and Virginia Bourke the night after that, on the Plenary Tracker. She even expressed surprise at how strongly that seemed to be coming through.

To what extent the joint WATAC/Grail project, *Australian Women Preach*, has been influential in this development is difficult to say, but we are certainly delighted that it has happened.
