Dear Parishioners,

I would like to take this opportunity to introduce myself to you, as your new Parish Priest.

When I was ordained 25 years ago - on 27 December 1996 – I adopted as my motto: 'By the grace of God I am what I am' (1Cor.15:10). I have always lived by these words, and God has never failed to lead or to ground me. So far, it has been quite an adventure.

I was born in Kottayam, in Kerala (in south west India), to my parents Annama and Philip. I have 2 brothers and 3 sisters, and I am number 5 in the family.

When I finished Year 10, I joined the seminary of the Oblates of the Sacred Heart, where I studied Philosophy and Theology and prepared for ordination. I am now in my (25th) Jubilee Year of priesthood.



Here in Broken Bay Diocese, I served for 3 years as assistant priest at Chatswood, and for 7 years as parish priest at Frenchs Forest. For the last 12 months I have been serving as parish priest at Kincumber.

I am delighted to now have this opportunity to serve you, the people of Lower North Shore, and I thank Bishop Anthony Randazzo for giving me this appointment.

I would also like to thank Fr Brian Moloney for his wonderful service to this parish over the last 6 years. I know him well.

The Oblates of the Sacred Heart are a priestly congregation with the charism of sharing the compassionate love of the Sacred Heart of Jesus. As a member of this congregation, my mission is to share God's love, and to help us to love each other.

FIRST READING

1 Sm 26:2. 7-9. 12-13. 22-23

A reading from the first book of Samuel The Lord has put you in my power, but I will not raise my hand against you.

Saul set off and went down to the wilderness of Ziph, accompanied by three thousand men chosen from Israel to search for David in the wilderness of Ziph.

So in the dark David and Abishai made their way towards the force, where they found Saul asleep inside the camp, his spear stuck in the ground beside his head, with Abner and the troops lying round him.

Then Abishai said to David, 'Today God has put your enemy in your power; so now let me pin him to the ground with his own spear. Just one stroke! I will not need to strike him twice. David answered Abishai, Do not kill him, for who can lift his hand against the Lord's anointed and be without guilt?' David took the spear and the pitcher of water from beside Saul's head, and they made off. No one saw, no one knew, no one woke up; they were all asleep, for a deep sleep from the Lord had fallen on them.

David crossed to the other side and halted on the top of the mountain a long way off; there was a wide space between them. David then called out, 'Here is the king's spear. Let one of the soldiers come across and take it. The Lord repays everyone for his uprightness and loyalty. As this earthly man was, so are we on earth; and as the heavenly man is, so are we in heaven. And we, who have been modelled on the earthly man, will be modelled on the heavenly man.

Instead, love your enemies and do good, and lend without any hope of return. You will have a great reward, and you will be sons of the Most High, for he himself is kind to the ungrateful and the wicked.

Do not judge, and you will not be judged yourselves; do not condemn, and you will not be condemned yourselves; grant pardon, and you will be pardoned. Give, and there will be gifts for you: a full measure, pressed down, shaken together, and running over, will be poured into your lap; because the amount you measure out is the amount you will be given back.'

VOLUNTARY ASSISTED DYING BILL

Since our on-line sessions in August last year on "Euthanasia, Dying and the Dignity of the Human Person", I am sure you are aware that the *Voluntary Assisted Dying Bill 2021* passed the Lower House in November 2021, when members voted in favour of the Bill 52 to 32 on a conscience vote.

The Bill is now before the Upper House, with the Legislative Council committee due to report back on 22 February. The Bill will be debated and voted on following this report. As part of the work being undertaken to stop the passage of the *Voluntary Assisted Dying Bill 2021* through the NSW Legislative Council, Greg Donnelly MLC has launched an ePetition. The ePetition is a short and unambiguous statement opposing the introduction of the legislation and only takes a few minutes to complete.

LEARNING THE LANGUAGE OF HEAVEN

Jesus challenges us to unlearn the language of the world and to learn a language which is counter-cultural, paradoxical, perplexing, such as: 'Love your enemies, do good to those who hate you' etc, etc. Are such attitudes and actions possible?

Our Lord is the best model. Jesus *is* the Word of God in human history. Jesus *is* the language of Heaven spoken in a human life. We have to read the Gospels and then imitate His dialect. Otherwise we might merely mutter to ourselves which would end up being eternally Hellish.

When we become aware of our language malpractice, i.e., sinning, and if we become *really* tongue-tied, i.e., seriously sinning, we can come to the Sacrament of Confession and emerge articulate and conversant with Christ again. We can talk with Our Lord again. We are singing the same tune.

Then at the moment of death we can gracefully pass over to our intended destiny which is not incommunicado, but communicado, holy conversation with God and with every creature.

We might pause for a moment and resolve to practise the language of Heaven and to 'walk the talk' every day.
