REFLECTION by Dianne Bergant CSA

Both the reading from the prophet Amos and the gospel narrative pointedly condemn the lifestyles of the rich. It is not wealth itself, but the complacency and the disregard for others that it too frequently generates, that is denounced. Biblical covenant is a communal concept. It emerges from a society that insists on mutual responsibility. Today's readings invite us to consider the covenant bond we have with others. How do we measure up?

The fundamental image of God reveals mercy and compassion. However, we cannot disregard the fact of judgment. Amos pronounces a woe against his own people; Abraham declares that there is an unbridgeable chasm between the saved and the condemned. Paul speaks here of the appearance of the Lord Jesus Christ who will bring judgment when he comes. Judgment will be determined not primarily in terms of our obedience to law, but in view of our fidelity to covenant commitment.

Righteousness is a covenant term. It is a quality of God that is shared with us by means of our covenant bond. Paul admonishes Timothy, and us, to pursue this righteousness, along with devotion, faith, love, patience and gentleness. Some of these virtues focus on our relationship with God, but most of them are directed toward our relationship with others. Those who are less fortunate are our sisters and brothers. If we take lightly our covenant obligations and allow them to languish at our gates, we will have only ourselves to blame when we find ourselves facing the harsh judgment of God.

During your life good things came your way just as bad things came the way of Lazarus. Now he is being comforted while you are in agony.

Jesus said to the Pharisees: 'There was a rich man who used to dress in purple and fine linen and feast magnificently every day. And at his gate there lay a poor man called Lazarus, covered with sores, who longed to fill himself with the scraps that fell from the rich man's table. Dogs even came and licked his sores. Now the poor man died and was carried away by angels to the bosom of Abraham. The rich man also died and was buried.

'In his torment in Hades he looked up and saw Abraham a long way off with Lazarus in his bosom. So he cried out, "Father Abraham, pity me and send Lazarus to dip the tip of his finger in water and cool my tongue, for I am in agony in these flames." "My son," Abraham replied "remember that during your life good things come your way, just as bad things came the way of Lazarus. Now he is being comforted here while you are in agony. But that

is not all: between us and you a great gulf has been fixed, to stop anyone, if he wanted to, crossing from our side to yours, and to stop any crossing from your side to ours."

'The rich man replied, "Father, I beg you then to send Lazarus to my father's house, since I have five brothers, to give them warning, so that they do not come to this place of torment too." "They have Moses and the prophets," said Abraham "let them listen to them." "Ah no, father Abraham," said the rich man "but if someone comes to them from the dead, they will repent." Then Abraham said to him, "If they will not listen either to Moses or to the prophets, they will not be convinced even if someone should rise from the dead."'

Happy 9th Anniversary

September marks 9 years since LETS, with the support of our then Parish Priest, Fr Rex Curry, was formed by parishioners of Lower North Shore Parish. Our aim was to help the people of Letefoho, Timor Leste, build a better future. Much has been achieved due to the generosity of the wonderful parishioners of LNSP, who have continued supporting LETS through funds, events and prayer.

Currently through LETS, 88 Senior High School students (26 in Year 12; 30 in Year 11; 32 in Year 10) are being supported to complete their high school education. Fifty tertiary education students are being supported to study at university, teachers' college or in a seminary college.

In 9 years LETS has supported:

- * the ongoing building of a large chapel for the district of Letefoho
- * the renovation and further development of Our Lady of Mt Carmel Senior High School
- * a student and community laptop programme
- * community water and ablution projects
- * a commercial truck for the community
- * a four-wheel drive vehicle for the Parish of Letefoho
- * boarding houses 1 for female students; 1 for male students
- * school and tertiary education of students in need
- * Immersion Tours for those interested in learning more about Timor Leste and the people of Letefoho

May we continue to work together for the people of Letefoho.
