Advent: Get Ready to Welcome Jesus

Once again, we are entering the season of Advent. Just as Lent prepares us for the Passion and death of Jesus Christ and his resurrection at Easter, so Advent prepares us for his coming at Christmas.

Most of us associate Christmas with the birth of Christ, and for good reason. But in Advent, the Church actually invites us to meditate upon the three comings of Our Lord. What are they?

The first is Jesus' birth in a humble stable in Bethlehem. As St John reminds us, '... the Word became flesh and dwelt among us' (Jn. 1:14).

Jesus' Second Coming will be at the end of time. Not even Jesus knows the day, the hour or the circumstances of his return – only his Father knows. But as he so often reminds us, stay awake and be vigilant because one day he will arrive like a thief in the night (Mt. 25:13).

And his third coming is actually right now, in a very different but very real way. Jesus comes to us through his grace. How does he do that?

Jesus comes to us through prayer, through almsgiving and through works of charity (see Mt.25:31-46). He also comes to us through the penances and sacrifices made to God for the conversion of sinners. As well, his grace is communicated to us through the frequent and worthy reception of the Sacraments, and most especially Reconciliation and the Holy Eucharist.

So, in the season of Advent, we not only look forward to the birth of Jesus on Christmas Day; we also hope for his birth in the very depths of our hearts. To prepare ourselves, I encourage you to consider doing these things during December:

- 1. Pray more. Spend some quiet time with Jesus, reflecting, praying and listening for his quiet voice. Most of us think that A.S.A.P. means 'As soon as possible'. But it also means 'Always Say a Prayer'.
- 2. Attend daily Mass and reflect on the readings. Jesus wants us to get to know him better, and an excellent way to do this is through his Word. As Matthew tells us, 'Man does not live on bread alone, but on every word that comes forth from the mouth of God' (Mt.4:4).
- 3. Go to Confession. Advent is an ideal time to clean out and refresh our hearts, to make space for Our Lord.
- 4. And finally actively practise your Christian faith by loving your neighbour. Do something nice for someone. Or even better do something nice for several people. Love others just as Jesus loves us.

Stay awake, you must be ready.

For in those days before the Flood people were eating, drinking, taking wives, taking husbands, right up to the day Noah went into the ark, and they suspected nothing till the Flood came and swept all away. It will be like this when the Son of Man comes. Then of two men in the fields one is taken, one left; of two women at the millstone grinding, one is taken, one left.

'So stay awake, because you do not know the day when your master is coming. You may be quite sure of this that if the householder had known at what time of the night the burglar would come, he would have stayed awake and would not have allowed anyone to break through the wall of his house. Therefore, you too must stand ready because the Son of Man is coming at an hour you do not expect.'
