3rd Sunday of Advent - Rejoice!

Today, the 3rd Sunday of Advent, is often called *Gaudete* Sunday. The word *Gaudete* means 'rejoice', and it comes from our Entrance Antiphon: Gaudete in Domino semper, or 'Rejoice in the Lord always' (Phil.4:4-5). So, what is joy? Most people think that joy is happiness, but it's much deeper than that. Henri Nouwen tells us that happiness depends on what's happening around you; it depends on our circumstances. But joy is an internal process; it's inside you. Nouwen says that joy is an attitude that comes from 'knowing that you're unconditionally loved and that nothing ... can take that love away from you'. It's understanding that God is always with you, that he's in control, and that no matter what happens, he has promised you eternal life. So why are we rejoicing today? It's because we have passed the midpoint of Advent, and we know that Jesus Christ is coming. Soon we will all be celebrating Christmas, the birthday of Our Lord who came to save us from our sins (Mt.1:21b). That really is something to look forward to! But we also rejoice knowing that Jesus will come again one day, at the end of our physical lives and at the end of the world. It is then that he will give the Christian faithful the crown of righteousness (2Tim.4:8) and a place in his Father's house (Jn.14:2), to dwell with God and his angels and saints for all eternity. And we rejoice because we know that Jesus is available to us right now, through our prayers, our open hearts and our loving actions. As St Paul tells us, when we choose to accept God in our life, he opens our eyes to his grace and power in the world, and he fills us with joy (Rom.15:13). To reflect this joy, on Gaudete Sunday priests and deacons wear rose vestments, instead of the traditional purple, and the third candle of our Advent wreath is also rose-coloured. Today, as we open our hearts to receive the joy of God's love, let's think about how we might share it with others who need it.

was life changing. I shared in the joy of Christ and deepened my own faith. I encountered God in the faces of peers from all over the world. I attended Mass in languages I could not speak, and yet I was able to understand the universal language of Catholicism. I happily embraced pilgrimage, engaged in catechesis, and attended cultural events. My faith was transformed, and my passion for youth ministry was ignited. Our 6 pilgrims from LNSP will be undergoing formation activities, as well as fundraising over the coming months. You may see us running various events and pop-ups before and after Mass. We would be so grateful if you could support our fundraising efforts as we embark on this journey to Lisbon. We will continue praying for our Parish, and we humbly ask that you keep us in your prayers too as we spiritually prepare ourselves for this journey.




