Specifically, we are organising a series of consultation workshops across our Parish, where refreshments will be served and all parishioners will be invited to listen, discuss and share any ideas, concerns and hopes they may have about our parish and its work. The planned workshops are as follows:

St Thomas Hall, Willoughby 7.00 pm Tues 7 March

St Leonards Hall, Naremburn 7.00 pm Weds 15 March

Each workshop will be facilitated by **Deacon Peter McCulloch**, of the Hornsby Cathedral Parish.

Deacon Peter is well known to me, as we worked closely together for several years at Frenchs Forest Parish. He has a background in business and community management, and before his ordination he spent most of his career working in the community sector. He also taught at Macquarie University.

Some of our parishioners may also remember Deacon Peter last year preaching at one of our Masses or speaking to parents about our Sacramental Programs.

It is hoped that the energy and ideas generated by these local workshops will lead to a combined parish consultation after Easter, as well as a new Parish Pastoral Plan that will quide our work into the future.

Far from relying on any power of my own, I came among you in great 'fear trembling' and speeches and the sermons that I gave, there were none of the arguments that belong philosophy; only a demonstration of the power of the Spirit. And I did this so that your faith should not depend on human philosophy but on the power of God.




