Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,





On behalf of Fr Jose Philip, Parish Priest, who is away overseas on long service leave, I am inviting you to a very important and urgent Parish forum scheduled for **Wednesday**, **7 June at 7.30pm** at the **St Leonard's Church Hall, Naremburn**.

The urgent purpose of this forum is to share with you details regarding a recent decision taken by Willoughby Council to place an **Interim Heritage Order over the entire site at St Leonard's, Naremburn** and the impact of such a decision. This information needs to be shared with you without delay as there are significant time constraints now imposed on our Parish as a result that require your consideration.

The gathering will also provide and opportunity to share with you the **details of the planning process with Willoughby Council** to date since the original DA lodgement in November 2021.

It will also be an opportunity to share with you the **revised** development design scheme.

At the invitation of Fr Jose, I am also pleased to let you know that Fr Brian Moloney will be in attendance at this forum. You will recall Fr Brian's consultation with us when we embarked on the journey of the possible development of our St Leonard's Church site in 2017 through to the DA lodgement in late 2021.

THE BOOK OF JOB: FAITH AND JUSTICE IN A WORLD OF INCOMPREHENSIBLE NIHILISM.

Dr Robert Tilley

Dr Robert Tilley is a lecturer in biblical studies and ancient languages at the Catholic Institute of Sydney and in Christian literature at the Aquinas Academy.

Dr Robert Tilley did his Doctorate at the University of Sydney with a thesis entitled Reading the Sacred Text. He has lectured widely on a variety of topics, endeavouring to show how Scripture, theology, philosophy, and the arts all interrelate. He has lectured in Biblical Studies at the Catholic Institute of Sydney for close to ten years now, and for a longer period of time has been a regular lecturer in Biblical Studies, the arts and theology at the Aquinas Academy. He has also lectured at UNDA Sydney and tutored in Biblical Studies at the University of Sydney.

No other book of the Old Testament has exercised as much of an influence on modern philosophy, literature, and film as the Book of Job has. Only, it could be argued that this is for the wrong reason, in that many read Job through the lens of modern nihilism. They liken it to Kafka's The Trial wherein a man is caught within a world that, beneath appearances to the contrary, is incomprehensible and unjust. A world in which God and justice are words which, to borrow from Macbeth, 'signify nothing'. But this is wrong, as this short series hopes to show. Job is a book which sets out to counter just such an arbitrary and nihilistic view of God, a view that is not unique to the modern world but that can be found in ancient texts such as Ecclesiastes. The argument of Job is that God *is* comprehendible, that He loves justice, and that He works to reveal the lies and duplicities by which the fallen world seeks to justify injustice and corruption. Job is one of the great works of literature, and it is so because its majestic style mirrors its majestic contents.

Vox Populi 01 June 2023

This week we celebrated the feast of the Patroness of our Diocese, Mary Star of the Sea. Star of the Sea is an ancient title for the Mother of Jesus Christ and comes to us from the Latin *Stella Maris*.

Under this title Mary intercedes as both guide and protector for all those who seek their livelihoods on or by the sea.

This is very appropriate for our community whose borders skirt both the Pacific Ocean and the beautiful Brisbane Waters. We recognise Mary as our guiding star and the model of discipleship as the mother of the Church.

Many clergy and parishioners attended the Vigil Mass on Tuesday night to celebrate this feast day before moving to The Light of Christ Centre to a presentation on our Cathedral Precinct journey.

It was wonderful to see so many parishioners contributing to the discussions with many thoughtful and creative ideas and suggestions. The Diocese will continue to keep everyone informed as the next stage of the journey unfolds.

This Sunday we celebrate Holy Trinity Sunday – the first Sunday following Pentecost. It is a solemn celebration of the belief in the revelation of one God, yet three divine persons: God the Father, the creator and sustainer of all things; God the Son, the incarnation of God as a human being, Jesus Christ, on Earth; and God the Heavenly Spirit, the power of God which is active in the world, drawing people towards God.

The doctrine of the Trinity is perhaps one of the more difficult aspects of Christianity, but it is fundamental. It helps us understand the complex nature of God. The three persons of the Trinty teaches us better about the nature of God and the roles He plays. While we recognise God the Father is our Father and the Author of Life and God the Son is our Lord and Savior, God the Holy Spirit is our Teacher and Guide and helps us understand that God is always present in the world. This is a great source of strength as we know God is always with us.
