CONFIRMATION





Confirmation is conferred after Baptism to strengthen the work of the Holy Spirit begun in Baptism. **Confirmation** assists the person to conform more closely to Christ. It calls the person to accept a sense of mission to be sent out to the world to be a living vital witness to the teaching of Jesus, the Lord.

In our Parish, which is part of the Diocese of Broken Bay, children usually receive the Sacraments of Initiation (**Confirmation**, Reconciliation, and First Holy Communion) over a twelve month period, beginning in **Year 3** and concluding in **Year 4**.

If your child is in **Year 3** or above and is **Baptised Catholic**, he/she is eligible to enrol in the Sacramental program which begins with **Confirmation**.

Vox Populi 08 June 2023

This month of June is dedicated to the Sacred Heart of Jesus.

The Catholic Church reserves June for a deeper devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus which represents His love for humanity.

The devotion inspires us to remember how much Jesus loves us, while growing our desire to love Him.

It is also when we celebrate the solemnity of the Sacred Heart of Jesus on 16 June.

This feast dates back to 1673, when a French nun who belonged to the Order of the Visitation of Holy Mary began to receive visions about the Sacred Heart.

Jesus appeared to Sister Margaret Mary Alacoque and revealed ways to venerate his Sacred Heart, and explained the immense love he has for humanity, appearing with his heart visible outside his chest, on fire, and surrounded by a crown of thorns.

In 1856, Pope Pius IX designated the Friday following the feast of Corpus Christi as the feast of the Sacred Heart for the universal Church. Ever since, the month of June has been devoted to the Sacred Heart of Jesus and his immense love for us all.

Devotion to the Sacred Heart was also an essential component of Saint John Paul II's hopes for the "new evangelization" which he often spoke during his Pontificate.

"For evangelization today," he said in 1984, "the Heart of Christ must be recognized as the heart of the Church: It is He who calls us to conversion, to reconciliation. It is He who leads pure hearts and those hungering for justice along the way of the Beatitudes. It is He who achieves the warm communion of the members of the one Body. It is He who enables us to adhere to the Good News and to accept the promise of eternal life. It is He who sends us out on mission. The heart-to-heart with Jesus broadens the human heart on a global scale."

Shine Conference 2023

On 19 May, the Vocations Broken Bay Team attended the Shine Conference 2023, hosted at St Peter's Catholic College, Tuggerah. The team, including Michelle Chahine, Fr Stephen Wayoyi, and myself, attended this vibrant event aimed at inspiring students from years 7-12 to explore their faith, identity, and leadership. The spirit was high as we witnessed over 350 students actively participate, clearly ignited in their Christian faith journey by the praise and worship, opportunity for prayer, and faith based workshops.

We seized the opportunity to promote vocations and converse with the students. We set up a stall for the students offering our customary vocations merch, which provided some moments for meaningful chats about God's personal call in their lives. Additionally, we facilitated a workshop titled "The Bible Slaps: Change my Mind!" (Gen Z lingo) which opened up a deep exploration of the Scriptures' transformative power, its influential role in our cultural heritage, and most importantly, how it helps us encounter God's voice and understand his divine plan for our lives.

Overall, the Shine Conference was an extraordinary occasion for the Vocations team to connect with young people in our Diocese. The workshop was well-received, sparking enthusiastic responses and fuelling our excitement for future involvement. Our team remains inspired by the faith-filled atmosphere of the event, and the hard work of Mr Michael Tobin, who coordinated the even, and we are already looking forward to next year's conference. Let's continue to pray for these young leaders, that they may shine in their faith and respond generously to their unique callings.

THE BOOK OF JOB: FAITH AND JUSTICE IN A WORLD OF INCOMPREHENSIBLE NIHILISM.

Dr Robert Tilley

Dr Robert Tilley is a lecturer in biblical studies and ancient languages at the Catholic Institute of Sydney and in Christian literature at the Aquinas Academy.

Dr Robert Tilley did his Doctorate at the University of Sydney with a thesis entitled Reading the Sacred Text. He has lectured widely on a variety of topics, endeavouring to show how Scripture, theology, philosophy, and the arts all interrelate. He has lectured in Biblical Studies at the Catholic Institute of Sydney for close to ten years now, and for a longer period of time has been a regular lecturer in Biblical Studies, the arts and theology at the Aquinas Academy. He has also lectured at UNDA Sydney and tutored in Biblical Studies at the University of Sydney.

No other book of the Old Testament has exercised as much of an influence on modern philosophy, literature, and film as the Book of Job has. Only, it could be argued that this is for the wrong reason, in that many read Job through the lens of modern nihilism. They liken it to Kafka's The Trial wherein a man is caught within a world that, beneath appearances to the contrary, is incomprehensible and unjust. A world in which God and justice are words which, to borrow from Macbeth, 'signify nothing'. But this is wrong, as this short series hopes to show. Job is a book which sets out to counter just such an arbitrary and nihilistic view of God, a view that is not unique to the modern world but that can be found in ancient texts such as Ecclesiastes. The argument of Job is that God *is* comprehendible, that He loves justice, and that He works to reveal the lies and duplicities by which the fallen world seeks to justify injustice and corruption. Job is one of the great works of literature, and it is so because its majestic style mirrors its majestic contents.


