ELEVENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME YEAR A - 18TH JUNE 2023

The major themes today are call and discipleship. Most of us are rather insignificant in the eyes of the broader society. And even those who are well known or in some way famous are still just simple human beings with needs and fears and dreams like the rest of us. Yet we have been called by God. This is what makes us special. Paul picks up this theme in his development of justification. He argues that we are special because when we were still sinners we were justified. All this has come to us as a pure gift from God. It is God who calls; it is God who chooses; it is God who justifies. If we are to boast, we must boast in God.

Paul further teaches that good works do not gain faith. It is the other way around. It is faith that manifests itself in works. In the gospel we see that the disciples are sent out to give to others the gift of faith which had been given to them. They proclaim the gospel, the good news that the time of fulfilment has come, and then they perform mighty works that demonstrate what they preach. We too have been called to discipleship; we have been made God's special people. To us has been entrusted the good news of salvation to proclaim to others. We must be the healing touch of Christ in our world. We must comfort those who mourn, bring back to life those who are in despair, embrace those who have been ostracised by society, drive out anger and fear and hatred.

CONFIRMATION

Confirmation is conferred after Baptism to strengthen the work of the Holy Spirit begun in Baptism. **Confirmation** assists the person to conform more closely to Christ. It calls the person to accept a sense of mission to be sent out to the world to be a living vital witness to the teaching of Jesus, the Lord.

TERM 3

In our Parish, which is part of the Diocese of Broken Bay, children usually receive the Sacraments of Initiation (Confirmation, Reconciliation, and First Holy Communion) over a twelve month period, beginning in Year 3 and concluding in Year 4.

If your child is in **Year 3** or above and is **Baptised Catholic**, he/she is eligible to enrol in the Sacramental program which begins with **Confirmation**.

Friday, 16 June is the Solemnity of the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus.

The Sacred Heart is a symbol of God's infinite love – the symbol of His own generous self-sacrificing love for all.

But why the heart? In every age and language, the heart is regarded as the natural symbol of love and affection. This feast day takes the physical heart of Jesus as a representation of His Divine love for humanity.

The Feast of the Sacred Heart has been in the Roman Catholic Liturgical calendar since 1856. The day always falls on a Friday, 19 days after Pentecost.

The devotion especially emphasizes the unmitigated love, compassion, and longsuffering of the heart of Christ towards humanity.

With the tragedy we have seen and felt this week following the devastating bus crash in the Hunter Valley resulting in so many deaths and injuries, and trauma for families and friends, we could turn to the Sacred Heart of Jesus to find healing and peace for everyone.

This week Bishop Anthony and many of our clergy have been attending their annual Clergy Conference. They too have been praying for all those affected by the bus tragedy and ask you to also keep them in your prayers.
