FEAST OF ST THOMAS' PATRON SAINT OF ST THOMAS' CHURCH AND SCHOOL

ST. THOMAS was born a Jew and was called to be one of the twelve Apostles. His birth and death dates are unknown, but his **feast day is celebrated July 3.** He lived before the formal establishment of the Catholic Church but is recognized as the patron saint of architects.

He was a dedicated but impetuous follower of Christ. When Jesus said He was returning to Judea to visit His sick friend Lazarus, Thomas immediately exhorted the other Apostles to accompany Him on the trip which involved certain danger and possible death because of the mounting hostility of the authorities. At the Last Supper, when Christ told His disciples that He was going to prepare a place for them to which they also might come because they knew both the place and the way, Thomas pleaded that they did not understand and received the beautiful assurance that Christ is the Way, the Truth, and the Life. St. Thomas is best known for his role in

verifying the Resurrection of his Master. Thomas' unwillingness to believe that the other Apostles had seen their risen Lord on the first Easter Sunday earned him the title of "doubting Thomas." Eight days later, on Christ's second apparition, Thomas was gently rebuked for his scepticism and furnished with the evidence he had demanded - seeing in Christ's hands the point of the nails. Thomas even put his fingers in the nail holes and his hand into Christ's side. After verifying the wounds were true, St. Thomas became convinced of the reality of the Resurrection and exclaimed, "My Lord and My God," thus making a public Profession of Faith in the Divinity of Jesus. St. Thomas is also mentioned as being present at another Resurrection appearance of Jesus - at Lake Tiberias, when a miraculous catch of fish occurred. This is all that we know about St. Thomas from the New Testament. Tradition says that at the dispersal of the Apostles after Pentecost this saint was sent to evangelize to the Parthians, Medes, and Persians. He ultimately reached India, carrying the Faith to the Malabar coast, which still boasts a large native population calling themselves "Christians of St. Thomas." According to tradition, Thomas was killed in an accident when a fowler shot at a peacock and struck Thomas instead. Following his death, some of his relics were taken to Edessa while the rest were kept in what is now known as India. They can still be found within the San Thome Basilica in Chennai, Mylapore, India.

CONFIRMATION





Confirmation is conferred after Baptism to strengthen the work of the Holy Spirit begun in Baptism. **Confirmation** assists the person to conform more closely to Christ. It calls the person to accept a sense of mission to be sent out to the world to be a living vital witness to the teaching of Jesus, the Lord.

In our Parish, which is part of the Diocese of Broken Bay, children usually receive the Sacraments of Initiation (**Confirmation**, Reconciliation, and First Holy Communion) over a twelve month period, beginning in **Year 3** and concluding in Year 4.

If your child is in **Year 3** or above and is **Baptised Catholic**, he/she is eligible to enrol in the Sacramental program which begins with **Confirmation**.



Vox Populi 21 June 2023

This week we remember three martyrs, renowned for their preaching, pastoral care, integrity, courage, and steadfast faith.

During the 1400s, the Catholic Church played a key role in the religious, cultural and political fabric and life of many in England. This period saw the Catholic Church collaborating with the state, in union with Rome. However that all began to change during the rule of King Henry VIII (1509-1547). The king severed ties between the Church of England and Rome to secure his divorce and remarriage.

One year later, in 1535, King Henry VIII martyred two of England's greatest Catholic saints who opposed him: St John Fisher and St Thomas More. And this week we celebrated their feast day, 22 June.

They were martyred for the same cause, religious freedom; on the same occasion, defending the sanctity of marriage and Papal authority; at the hands of the same King, and within two weeks of each other.

Once King Henry's friend and former Lord Chancellor, More was imprisoned in the Tower of London where he was eventually condemned and beheaded. Fisher also had a close connection with King Henry VIII until he refused to recognise him as sovereign of the Catholic Church in England.

At the time of his impending death, the people of England rightly saw a strong resemblance between John Fisher's martyrdom and that of St. John the Baptist, who was also beheaded for speaking out against a ruler's unlawful divorce and remarriage. Because of this strong resemblance, King Henry VIII was afraid to let Fisher live until the feast day of St. John the Baptist on 24 June, and had him killed two days before. The irony is that John Fisher was due to be hanged, drawn, and quartered, but because the King hastened his death ahead of the popular feast day, he was beheaded instead . . . just like St. John the Baptist.

On Saturday, 24 June we celebrate the Nativity of St John the Baptist.

John the Baptist spent his adult life preparing the way for Jesus, and proclaiming that "the Kingdom of Heaven is close at hand.". He was born to Zachary and Elizabeth, an elderly married couple. The Angel Gabriel had visited Zachary and told him that his wife would bear a child, even though she was already past the child-bearing age.

Elizabeth was Mary's cousin and Zachary was a priest of the Temple in Jerusalem. As a baby in the womb, John recognized Jesus' presence in Mary's womb when Mary visited Elizabeth soon after the Annunciation. Both women were pregnant at the same time.

John was probably born at Ain-Karim, which is southwest of Jerusalem. As a young adult, he lived as a hermit in the desert of Judea until about A.D. 27. When he was 30, he began to preach on the banks of the Jordan, calling for repentance and baptizing people in the river waters. When Jesus came to John to be baptized, John recognized Jesus as the Messiah and baptized Him, saying: "It is I who need baptism from you."

John continued to preach after Jesus was baptized, but was imprisoned not long after by Herod Antipas, after he denounced the king's adulterous marriage with Herodias, wife of his half-brother Philip.

John was beheaded at the request of Salome, daughter of Herodias.
