White elephants

I'd like to thank everyone who came to our public meeting last Wednesday on our proposed Naremburn project. Emma McDonald, our Diocesan Financial Administrator, updated us on recent actions, including our appeal to the Land and Environment Court against the Interim Heritage Order that has been imposed on the site. It's important to remember that this project is vital for the future health and sustainability of our parish. We are currently working on our new Parish Pastoral Plan, and it will be shared with you all sometime soon. But this plan, and our vision for the parish, will need to be resourced because there is so much work for us to do in our community. At last week's meeting White Elephants were mentioned. What is a white elephant? It's something that costs a lot of money but has no useful purpose. History tells us that white elephants were considered sacred and incredibly valuable in ancient Siam (now Thailand). White elephants were so highly prized that when one was born, it immediately became the property of the king. And sometimes, when the king wanted to reward someone, he gave them a white elephant. This was a great honour, of course, but also a terrible burden because what can you do with a white elephant? They are expensive to keep and economically useless.

Today, a 'white elephant' is any burdensome, expensive and useless possession that's much more trouble than it is worth. Our decrepit buildings at Naremburn will be a permanent white elephant, and a huge drain on parish funds, if our project is not approved. The word of the Lord was addressed to me as follows. 'Son of man, I have appointed you as sentry to the House of Israel. When you hear a word from my mouth, warn them in my name. If I say to a wicked man: Wicked wretch, you are to die, and you do not speak to warn the wicked man to renounce his ways, then he shall die for his sin, but I will hold you responsible for his death. If he does not listen, take one or two others with you: the evidence of two or three witnesses is required to sustain any charge. But if he refuses to listen to these, report it to the community; and if he refuses to listen to the community, treat him like a pagan or a tax collector.

The Nativity of the Blessed Virgin Mary 8 SEPTEMBER

The Catholic Church celebrates the birth of the Blessed Virgin Mary on its traditional fixed date of September 8, nine months after the December 8 celebration of her Immaculate Conception as the child of Saints Joachim and Anne.

The circumstances of the Virgin Mary's infancy and early life are not directly recorded in the Bible, but other documents and traditions describing the circumstances of her birth are cited by some of the earliest Christian writers from the first centuries of the Church.

The "Protoevangelium of James," which was probably put into its final written form in the early second century, describes Mary's father Joachim as a wealthy member of one of the Twelve Tribes of Israel. Joachim was deeply grieved, along with his wife Anne, by their childlessness. "He called to mind Abraham," the early Christian writing says, "that in the last day God gave him a son Isaac."

Joachim and Anne began to devote themselves extensively and rigorously to prayer and fasting, initially wondering whether their inability to conceive a child might signify God's displeasure with them.

As it turned out, however, the couple were to be blessed even more abundantly than Abraham and Sarah, as an angel revealed to Anne when he appeared to her and prophesied that all generations would honour their future child: "The Lord has heard your prayer, and you shall conceive, and shall bring forth, and your seed shall be spoken of in all the world."

After Mary's birth, according to the Protoevangelium of James, Anne "made a sanctuary" in the infant girl's room, and "allowed nothing common or unclean" on account of the special holiness of the child. The same writing records that when she was one year old, her father "made a great feast, and invited the priests, and the scribes, and the elders, and all the people of Israel."

"And Joachim brought the child to the priests," the account continues, "and they blessed her, saying: 'O God of our fathers, bless this child, and give her an everlasting name to be named in all generations'... And he brought her to the chief priests, and they blessed her, saying: 'O God most high, look upon this child, and bless her with the utmost blessing, which shall be for ever.'"

The protoevangelium goes on to describe how Mary's parents, along with the temple priests, subsequently decided that she would be offered to God as a consecrated Virgin for the rest of her life, and enter a chaste marriage with the carpenter Joseph.


