I'd like to take this opportunity to update you on our parish's Pastoral Discernment Process, which began early this year. You might remember that several consultation sessions were held across our three parish communities, and lots of feedback was collected from parishioners about the life of our parish.

This information has since been used to prepare a draft Parish Pastoral Plan, and in recent weeks this document has been undergoing a process of review by our newly formed Parish Missionary Council.

At our last PMC meeting, we discussed a new Vision statement for our parish. The preferred version, **To know and love God, and be Christ to one another**, will feature in our pastoral plan when it is released in the near future.

You may also be interested to hear that some of the pastoral priorities that will appear in our new plan include providing new opportunities for faith formation, encouraging our three communities to be more welcoming and inclusive, facilitating a closer engagement with our parish schools, ensuring clearer communications, and striving for truly beautiful liturgical celebrations. I expect this plan to be finalised shortly, and look forward to sharing it with you all.

Naremburn Project Update

You will be aware that the Interim Heritage Order Appeal hearing was scheduled to take place earlier this week on Monday 25 and Tuesday 26 September 2023. Most regrettably on the weekend of 23 September, immediately prior to the hearing, the Barrister who was to appear at the hearing for the Parish was hospitalised with a very serious condition. As a result, the hearing had to be postponed as there was simply not time for any alternative arrangements to be made. This was very unfortunate given all the preparations and our prayers are with our Barrister, whom I can report is recovering well in hospital. A new date for the hearing was determined by the Parish's solicitors on Thursday. The new court hearing dates are now scheduled to take place on **24 and 26 October**.

Thank you for your ongoing support, advice and prayers as our journey continues.

SUNDAY'S READINGS

Entrance Antiphon (Daniel 3:31,29,30,43,42)

All that you have done to us, O Lord, you have done with true judgement, for we have sinned against you and not obeyed your commandments. But give glory to your name and deal with us according to the bounty of your mercy.

First Reading (Ezekiel 18:25-28)

The word of the Lord was addressed to me as follows: 'You object, "What the Lord does is unjust." Listen, you House of Israel: is what I do unjust? Is it not what you do that is unjust? When the upright man renounces his integrity to commit sin and dies because of this, he dies because of the evil that he himself has committed. When the sinner renounces sin to become law-abiding and honest, he deserves to live. He has chosen to renounce all his previous sins; he shall certainly live; he shall not die.'

Responsorial Psalm (Ps 24:4-9. R. v.6)

(R.) Remember your mercies, O Lord.

Second Reading (Philippians 2:1-5)

If our life in Christ means anything to you, if love can persuade at all, or the Spirit that we have in common, or any tenderness and sympathy, then be united in your convictions and united in your love, with a common purpose and a common mind. That is the one thing which would make me completely happy. There must be no competition among you, no conceit; but everybody is to be self -effacing. Always consider the other person to be better than yourself so that nobody thinks of his own interests first but everybody thinks of other people's interests instead. In your minds you must be the same as Christ Jesus.

Alleluia, alleluia! My sheep listen to my voice, says the Lord; I know them, and they follow me. Alleluia!

Gospel (Matthew 21:28-32)

Jesus said to the chief priests and the elders of the people, 'What is your opinion? A man had two sons. He went and said to the first, "My boy, you go and work in the vineyard today." He answered, "I will not go," but afterwards thought better of it and went. The man then went and said the same thing to the second who answered, "Certainly, sir," but did not go. Which of the two did the father's will?' 'The first' they said. Jesus said to them, 'I tell you solemnly, tax collectors and prostitutes are making their way into the kingdom of God before you. For John came to you, a pattern of true righteousness, but you did not believe him, and yet the tax collectors and prostitutes did. Even after seeing that, you refused to think better of it and believe in him.'
