

REFLECTION

As incredible as it may seem, some people turn down the invitation to the eschatological banquet. This is the case, both in the parable and in our world today. This invitation seems much less interesting than a sports event, the latest movie, or some social affair. So much of our time and energy is spent either climbing the economic ladder or just trying to keep our heads above water. Even if we are interested in the banquet, we do not seem able to afford the time and energy that it might require. And so we send our regrets: I cannot come. What a shame! We seem to have forgotten that everything is tending toward the end; all of our plans, interests and distractions will cease. Only the banquet will remain. All God asks of us is that we receive the blessings that have been prepared for us. We need not work for them. In fact, we cannot work for them on our own. All we can do is enjoy them. Enjoyment of the eschatological time of fulfilment is open to all, but quaranteed to none.

One theme seems to connect all of the readings for this Sunday, our total dependence on God. God spreads the banquet table and invites the guests; God punishes those who are indifferent to or antagonistic toward the eschatological banquet; God supplies whatever we need in whatever circumstances we find ourselves. We do not have to bargain with God, or make reservations. All we have to do is accept what God has to offer.



SUNDAY'S READINGS

Entrance Antiphon (Psalm 129:3-4)

If you, O Lord, should mark iniquities, Lord, who could stand? But with you is found forgiveness, O God of Israel.

First Reading (Isaiah 25:6-10)

On this mountain, the Lord of hosts will prepare for all people a banquet of rich food, a banquet of fine wines, of food rich and juicy, of fine strained wines. On this mountain he will remove the mourning veil covering all peoples, and the shroud enwrapping all nations, he will destroy Death for ever. The Lord will wipe away the tears from every cheek; he will take away his people's shame everywhere on earth, for the Lord has said so. That day, it will be said: See, this is our God in whom we hoped for salvation; the Lord is the one in whom we hoped. We exult and we rejoice that he has saved us; for the hand of the Lord rests on this mountain.

Responsorial Psalm (Ps 22. R. v.6)

(R.) I shall live in the house of the Lord all the days of my life.

Second Reading (Philippians 4:12-14. 19-20)

I know how to be poor and I know how to be rich too. I have been through my initiation and now I am ready for anything anywhere: full stomach or empty stomach, poverty or plenty. There is nothing I cannot master with the help of the One who gives me strength. All the same, it was good of you to share with me in my hardships. In return my God will fulfil all your needs, in Christ Jesus, as lavishly as

only God can. Glory to God, our Father, for ever and ever. Amen.

Gospel Acclamation (See Ephesians 1:17-18)

Alleluia, alleluia!
May the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ enlighten the eyes of our heart that we might see how great is the hope to which we are called.
Alleluia!

Gospel (Matthew 22:1-14)

Jesus said to the chief priests and elders of the people: "The kingdom of heaven may be compared to a king who gave a feast for his son's wedding. He sent his servants to call those who had been invited, but they would not come. Next he sent some more servants. "Tell those who have been invited" he said "that I have my banquet all prepared, my oxen and fattened cattle have been slaughtered, everything is ready. Come to the wedding." But they were not interested: one went off to his farm, another to his business, and the rest seized his servants, maltreated them and killed them. The king was furious. He dispatched his troops, destroyed those murderers and burnt their town. Then he said to his servants, "The wedding is ready; but as those who were invited proved to be unworthy, go to the crossroads in the town and invite everyone you can find to the wedding." So these servants went out on to the roads and collected together everyone they could find, bad and good alike; and the wedding hall was filled with guests.'



Vox Populi 11 October 2023

The reports unfolding this week in the Middle East following the unprecedented attacks and responses are shocking and distressing.

In a region that has known conflict for many decades, this week has sadly carved another date into its bloody history.

The violent attacks by Hamas militants against Israeli civilians - children, the young and elderly, families – and the abductions and hostage-taking demonstrate disregard for human life and dignity.

As a result many Palestinian families are now suffering and grieving loss of loved ones following the terrorist-inflicted conflict which began at a music festival during a Jewish holy day.

All people of faith and goodwill must be devastated by this escalation of terror and war and be asking what does real peace look like for everyone, and how can we get there? Speaking from Rome this week Bishop Anthony Randazzo said terrorism and war do not lead to resolutions, only to further anguish, death and suffering.

"I will continue to pray for peace and that we do not see the potential incalculable consequences for the whole region," Bishop Anthony said.

Our prayers can have a powerful impact, especially during this month of October which is dedicated to the Holy Rosary.

Pray to Our Lady for an end to the devastating lost of civilian lives, the release of hostages and for renewed peacebuilding efforts.

News from the Synod, Rome:

The XVI Ordinary General Assembly of the Synod of Bishops in Rome is reaching its halfway point.

The overall theme is "For a Synodal Church: Communion, Participation and Mission." During the first week, around 460 participants met in small groups to discuss the first part of *Instrumentum Laboris*, the document guiding discussions during the monthlong assembly.

These discussions centred on "For a Synodal Church: An Integral Experience" and the experience of the people of God journeying together over the last two years.

This second week the gathering switched from small groups to a plenary assembly with the theme "A communion that radiates".

Bishop Anthony Randazzo was also elected this week to the synod's Information Commission.
