#### **SUNDAY'S READINGS**

#### **Entrance Antiphon** (Cf Psalm 104:3-4)

Let the hearts that seek the Lord rejoice; turn to the Lord and his strength; constantly seek his face.

#### First Reading (Exodus 22:20-26)

The Lord said to Moses, 'Tell the sons of Israel this, "You must not molest the stranger or oppress him, for you lived as strangers in the land of Egypt. You must not be harsh with the widow, or with the orphan; if you are harsh with them, they will surely cry out to me, and be sure I shall hear their cry; my anger will flare and I shall kill you with the sword, your own wives will be widows, your own children orphans. "If you lend money to any of my people, to any poor man among you, you must not play the usurer with him: you must not demand interest from him. "If you take another's cloak as a pledge, you must give it back to him before sunset. It is all the covering he has; it is the cloak he wraps his body in; what else would he sleep in? If he cries to me, I will listen, for I am full of pity.""

#### **Second Reading** (1 Thessalonians 1:5-10)

You observed the sort of life we lived when we were with you, which was for your instruction, and you were led to become imitators of us, and of the Lord; and it was with the joy of the Holy Spirit that you took to the gospel, in spite of

the great opposition all round you.

This has made you the great example to all believers in Macedonia and Achaia since it was from you that the word of the Lord started to spread - and not only throughout Macedonia and Achaia, for the news of your faith in God has spread everywhere. We do not need to tell other people about it: other people tell us how we started the work among you, how you broke with idolatry when you were converted to God and became servants of the real, living God; and how you are now waiting for Jesus, his Son, whom he raised from the dead, to come from heaven to save us from the retribution which is coming.

Alleluia, alleluia! All who love me will keep my words, and my Father will love them and we will come to them. Alleluia!

#### **Gospel** (Matthew 22:34-40)

When the Pharisees heard that Jesus had silenced the Sadducees they got together and, to disconcert him, one of them put a question, 'Master, which is the greatest commandment of the law?' Jesus said, 'You must love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your mind. This is the greatest and the first commandment. The second resembles it: you must love your neighbour as yourself. On these two commandments hang the whole Law, and the Prophets also.'





## St Leonard of Port Maurice

St. Leonard's Feast Day is celebrated on November 26th each year. He lived between the years of 1676 and 1751.

Leonard's surname is derived from his birthplace on the Gulf of Genoa. After completing his education in Rome, he joined the Franciscans of the Strictest Observance, and was ordained to the priesthood. Severe gastric haemorrhages kept him an invalid for four years, but he was restored to complete health when he vowed to devote his entire life to the conversion of sinners. For 44 years he gave popular missions throughout central and southern Italy, preaching to thousands in the open squares. His success was phenomenal, not only in converting hardened sinners and completely reconciling long standing feuds and violent enmities, but in rekindling the religious zeal of the entire population.

He promoted devotions to the Immaculate Conception of Mary, adoration of the Blessed Sacrament, veneration of the Sacred Heart of Jesus, and particularly the Stations of the Cross, of which he erected 571 in Italy, including a set in the Roman Coliseum.

Once, when he gave a two-week mission in the Piazza Navona in Rome, the Pope and the college of Cardinals attended. St. Leonard has left numerous ascetical and devotional works for the guidance of missionaries and laymen alike, which fill 13 volumes and have been repeatedly translated and republished.

### Vox Populi 19 October 2023

Another very busy schedule at the Synod on Synodality at the Vatican this week. Discussions included the possibility of revising canon law and addressing equality for women in the Church.

Bishop Anthony Randazzo was asked to join a Holy See press briefing in which he clarified the distinction between the "procedural or situational canon law."

"It's one very large, ongoing process," he said. "The law itself of course can change with the needs of the Church... [procedural] law can be adapted according to the needs of particular communities and situations and circumstances. Other laws are more deeply rooted in the Second Vatican Council and Sacred Scripture.

"So it is not just a matter of changing them to accommodate the changing circumstances of the world," he said. "We have to first ask what was in the mind of the legislator, what was the mind of the council, what were the theological, spiritual, pastoral fruits that led to those being prepared, not just in the 1960s but over the last 2000 years of the community of the Church."

Prof Reneé Köhler-Ryan, Dean of Philosophy and Theology at the University of Notre Dame Australia and one of the lay women delegates at the Synod, also took part in the same press briefing.

After being asked about whether Synod participants have addressed equality for women in the Church, she commented that she doesn't focus on the fact that she's not a priest.

Dr Kohler-Ryan also added there is currently a lot of focus on women's ordination.

"What happens when we place too much emphasis on this question is we forget about what women need throughout the world," she said.

"We could be making sure that professional women are not forced to choose between having families and being out there in the workforce; we could be doing more to make sure that families are supported in all kinds of way."


In his role of president of the Federation of Catholic Bishops Conferences of Oceania, Bishop Anthony also spoke about digital evangelization and how that affects different cultures.

"When we talk about the synodal way of walking together, we really should be talking about how we might swim or boat together," he joked. "There are people in the Church and communities of Oceania who are vast distances away from anyone else, and they live in deep isolation and so communication can be a real challenge."

"This raises for us even deeper questions with regards to the way we speak, the way we act, the way we involve various people in the community of the Church and in the society in which we live," he said.

One of the wonderful experiences for me here is sitting at a table with people who come from all over the world, who are not just from Europe, who don't come from traditional European communities of the Church.

"That sounds very synodal to me."
