SUNDAY'S READINGS

Entrance Antiphon (Cf Psalm 37:22-23)

Forsake me not, O Lord, my God; be not far from me! Make haste and come to my help, O Lord, my strong salvation!

First Reading (Malachi 1:14 - 2:2. 8-10)

I am a great king, says the Lord of hosts, and my name is feared throughout the nations. And now, priests, this warning is for you. If you do not listen, if you do not find it in your heart to glorify my name, says the Lord of hosts, I will send the curse on you and curse your very blessing. You have strayed from the way; you have caused many to stumble by your teaching. You have destroyed the covenant of Levi, says the Lord of hosts. And so I in my turn have made you contemptible and vile in the eyes of the whole people in repayment for the way you have not kept to my paths but have shown partiality in your administration. Have we not all one Father? Did not one God create us? Why, then, do we break faith with one another, profaning the covenant of our ancestors?

Responsorial Psalm (Ps 130)

(R.) In you, Lord, I have found my peace.

Second Reading (1 Thessalonians 2:7-9. 13)

Like a mother feeding and looking after her own children, we felt so devoted and protective towards you, and had come to love you so much, that we were eager to hand over to you not only the Good News but our whole lives as well. Let me remind you, brothers, how hard we used to work, slaving night and day so as not to be a burden on any one of you while we were proclaiming God's Good News to you.

Another reason why we constantly thank God for you is that as soon as you heard the message that we brought you as God's message, you accepted it for what it really is, God's message and not some human thinking; and it is still a living power among you who believe it.

Gospel Acclamation (Matthew 23:9. 10)

Alleluia, alleluia! You have one Father, your Father in heaven; you have one teacher: the Lord Jesus Christ. Alleluia!

Gospel (Matthew 23:1-12)

Addressing the people and his disciples Jesus said, 'The scribes and the Pharisees occupy the chair of Moses.

You must therefore do what they tell you and listen to what they say; but do not be guided by what they do: since they do not practise what they preach. They tie up heavy burdens and lay them on men's shoulders, but will they lift a finger to move them? Not they! Everything they do is done to attract attention, like wearing broader phylacteries and longer tassels, like wanting to take the place of honour at banquets and the front seats in the synagogues, being greeted obsequiously in the market squares and having people call them Rabbi 'You, however, must not allow yourselves to be called Rabbi, since you have only one Master, and you are all brothers. You must call no one on earth your father, since you have only one Father, and he is in heaven. Nor must you allow yourselves to be called teachers, for you have only one Teacher, the Christ. The greatest among you must be your servant. Anyone who exalts himself will be humbled, and anyone who humbles himself will be exalted.'.

CONGRATULATIONS BISHOP ANTHONY: 4TH ANNIVERSARY IN THE DIOCESE



Vox Episcopi 1 November 2023

As I arrive back in Sydney from Rome I join with you in prayer for All Saints Day as we remember all the saints and martyrs, known and unknown. Tomorrow, 2 November we remember all the faithful departed, not only our loved ones but all those around the world who we have not and will never meet. Through the mercy of God they will rest in peace.

I would like to take this opportunity to share with you my gratitude for your support and prayers for me and Kelly Paget and all the members of the Synod. While it has been a marvellous encounter, it has also been quite exhausting. The programme was relentlessly full-on. Kelly and I arrived in Rome at 1.30PM and we were both on the steps of Saint Peter's Basilica by 3PM. It did not slow down at all for the next month.

And yet, I must say that it has been a most graced time. I cannot imagine all the details that must have demanded the attention of Cardinal Grech and the Synod Team, and yet each time I had the opportunity to meet with him or speak with members of the Team, they were gracious, hospitable, and fraternal. As you well know, it is not possible to keep everyone happy all the time, and yet such a demonstration of charity and care was, I felt, exemplary of what is needed in a Synodal Church. Patience, charity, and kindness go a long way in making the Gospel real in our lives.

I was also quite humbled by the opportunities that were given to me to contribute, by presiding at Mass and preaching, leading the prayer in the Synod Hall, participating in the Commission for Information, and leading the Oceania Bishops in fraternal dialogue with Cardinal Grech and Cardinal Hollerich.

The Oceania Team was front and centre every day for the month. Apart from eight bishop members, there were 10 non-bishop members, four facilitators, and one theological peritus. For a continent of almost seven million Catholics (that is, the smallest Catholic continent) we were very well represented and extremely well engaged. The number of times people commented to me positively about the Oceania Team, and in particular Kelly Paget, was quite overwhelming, and I hope that our not-so-small contribution was positive and that we have in some way contributed to building the culture of a Synodal Church.

These next eleven months, I pray, will be a graced time of reflection, prayer, discernment, participation, and action in the Church. When we open ourselves to the regenerating love and mercy of God, the Holy Spirit does great things in and through us.
