Dear Brothers and Sisters,

The Parable of the Talents in Matthew 25:14-30 resonates strongly with our Parish Mission of "To know and love God, and to be Christ to one another." In the context of this mission, the talents can be seen as the various gifts, skills, and resources that God has bestowed upon each individual within the parish community.

This parable emphasizes the importance of knowing God. The servants who actively engaged with their talents and invested them wisely demonstrated a deep understanding of their master's character and expectations. Similarly, in the parish community, the call to know God suggests an intimate relationship with Him through prayer, Scripture, and spiritual practices. This knowledge becomes the foundation for discerning how to utilize the unique gifts each person has received.

The command to love God is reflected in the way the faithful servants used their talents for growth and service. Love is an active and selfless expression, and in the context of the parish mission, it involves utilizing one's God-given talents to contribute positively to the community. Whether through acts of kindness, service, or sharing one's skills, the parable encourages parishioners to express their love for God by being actively engaged in the well-being and growth of the community.

Being Christ to one another is embodied in the parable through the idea of being faithful stewards. The servants who multiplied their talents not only benefited themselves but also contributed to the overall increase of the master's wealth. Likewise, in the parish mission, individuals are called to be Christ-like by using their talents to uplift and support one another. This might involve acts of compassion, understanding, and support, reflecting the selfless and sacrificial nature of Christ's love.

On the flip side, the cautionary example of the servant who buried his talent out of fear serves as a reminder for the parish community. Fear can paralyse individuals and hinder them from fully engaging with their gifts and serving others. The mission to be Christ to one another challenges parishioners to overcome fear and complacency, stepping out in faith to actively contribute to the flourishing of the community.

In the light of the parish mission to know and love God, and to be Christ to one another, reinforces the importance of active engagement, love-driven service, and the responsible stewardship of the gifts that God has entrusted to each member of the community.

Last weekend we started our November appeal for Pastoral Works BB, our Parish quota is \$67,579 for this financial year. This can only be achieved by your enormous generosity, so dig deep and make a contribution to this important appeal.

I would also like to remind you that Hien's Deaconate Ordination is this coming Friday 24th November 7.30pm at St Leonard's Church Naremburn. I would love to encourage our parish community to come and support Hien on his journey to priesthood. Could I ask you to RSVP via the QR code as there will supper celebrations afterwards.

servants and entrusted his property to them. To one he gave five talents, to another two, to a third one; each in proportion to his ability. Then he set out. The man who had received the five talents promptly went and traded with them and made five more. The man who had received two made two more in the same way. But the man who had received one went off and dug a hole in the ground and hid his master's money. Now a long time after, the master of those servants came back and went through his accounts with them. The man who had received the five talents came forward bringing five more. "Sir", he said "you entrusted me with five talents; here are five more that I have made." His master said to him, "Well done, good and faithful servant; you have shown you can be faithful in small things, I will trust you with greater; come and join in your master's happiness." Next the man with the two talents came forward. "Sir," he said "you entrusted me with two talents; here are two more that I have made." His master said to him, "Well done, good and faithful servant; you have shown you can be faithful in small things, I will trust you with greater; come and join in your master's happiness." Last came forward the man who had the one talent. "Sir," said he "I had heard you were a hard man, reaping where you have not sown and gathering where you have not scattered; so I was afraid, and I went off and hid your talent in the ground. Here it is; it was yours, you have it back." But his master answered him, "You wicked and lazy servant! So you knew that I reap where I have not sown and gather where I have not scattered? Well then, you should have deposited my money with the bankers, and on my return I would have recovered my capital with interest. So now, take the talent from him and give it to the man who has the five talents. For to everyone who has will be given more, and he will have more than enough; but from the man who has not, even what he has will be taken away. As for this good-for-nothing servant, throw him out into the dark, where there will be weeping and grinding of teeth."
