

SECOND SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME 14th January 2024



Dear Parishioners,

This weekend in the Gospel of John we encounter a moment that captures the essence of discipleship and the transformative power of encountering Jesus. The exchange between Jesus and the disciples is both simple and profound. Jesus, perceptive to their presence, turns and asks, "What do you want?" in other words what are you seeking. This question resonates through the ages, inviting us to reflect on our own pursuits in life. The disciples respond with another question, "Where do you live?" Their inquiry transcends physical lodgings; it reflects a deep yearning to dwell in the spiritual presence of the Messiah. Jesus responds with an invitation: "Come and see." These three words encapsulate the heart of Christian discipleship- an invitation to intimately know and experience Christ. The disciples, in turn, spend the day with Jesus and are forever changed. Andrew, deeply moved by this encounter, rushes to share the good news with his brother Simon, proclaiming, "We have found the Messiah." This passage underscores the contagious nature of authentic encounters with Christ, prompting a desire to share the transformative experience with others. Here we are prompted to consider our own response to Jesus' invitation: What are we seeking, and are we willing to spend time in His presence, allowing it to shape and define our lives? Furthermore, the passage challenges us to emulate Andrew's enthusiasm in sharing the life-changing encounter with those around us. **Fr Jose Philip OSH**

Entrance Antiphon

Psalm 65:4

All the earth shall bow down before you, O God, and shall sing to you, shall sing to your name, O Most High!

First Reading

1 Samuel 3:3-10.19

Samuel was lying in the sanctuary of the Lord where the ark of God was, when the Lord called, 'Samuel! Samuel!' He answered, 'Here I am'. Then he ran to Eli and said, 'Here I am, since you called me.' Eli said, 'I did not call. Go back and lie down.' So he went and lay down. Once again the Lord called, 'Samuel! Samuel!' Samuel got up and went to Eli and said, 'Here I am, since you called me.' He replied, 'I did not call you, my son; go back and lie down.' Samuel had as yet no knowledge of the Lord and the word of the Lord had not yet been revealed to him. Once again the Lord called, the third time. He got up and went to Eli and said, Here I am, since you called me.' Eli then understood that it was the Lord who was calling the boy, and he said to Samuel, 'Go and lie down, and if someone calls say, "Speak, Lord, your servant is listening." So Samuel went and lay down in his place. The Lord then came and stood by, calling as he had done before, 'Samuel! Samuel!' Samuel answered, 'Speak, Lord, your servant is listening.' Samuel grew up and the Lord was with him and let no word of his fall to the ground.

Responsorial Psalm

Ps 39:2. 4. 7-10. R. vv. 8.9

(R.) Here am I, Lord; I come to do your will.

1. I waited, I waited for the Lord. and he stooped down to me; he heard my cry. He put a new song into my mouth, praise of our God. (R.)

2. You do not ask for sacrifice and offerings, but an open ear. You do not ask for holocaust and victim. Instead, here am I. (R.)

3. In the scroll of the book it stands written that I should do your will. My God, I delight in your law in the depth of my heart. (R.)

Second Reading

1 Corinthians 6:13-15. 17-20

The body is not meant for fornication; it is for the Lord, and the Lord for the body. God, who raised the Lord from the dead, will by his power raise us up too. You know, surely, that your bodies are members making up the body of Christ; anyone who is joined to the Lord is one spirit with him. Keep away from fornication. All the other sins are committed outside the body; but to fornicate is to sin against your own body. Your body, you know, is the temple of the Holy Spirit, which is in you since you have received him from God. You are not your own property; you have been bought and paid for. That is why you should use your body for the glory of God.

Gospel Acclamation

John 1:41. 17

Alleluia, alleluia! We have found the Messiah: Jesus Christ, who brings us truth and grace. Alleluia!

Gospel

John 1:35-42

As John stood with two of his disciples, Jesus passed, and John stared hard at him and said, 'Look, there is the lamb of God.' Hearing this, the two disciples followed Jesus. Jesus turned round, saw them following and said, 'What do you want?' They answered, 'Rabbi,' - which means Teacher - 'where do you live?' 'Come and see' he replied; so they went and saw where he lived, and stayed with him the rest of that day. It was about the tenth hour. One of these two who became followers of Jesus after hearing what John had said was Andrew, the brother of Simon Peter. Early next morning, Andrew met his brother and said to him, 'We have found the Messiah' - which means the Christ and he took Simon to Jesus. Jesus looked hard at him and said, 'You are Simon son of John; you are to be called Cephas' - meaning Rock.



SEE THE BELLS OF ST LEONARD'S, NAREMBURN

Would you like to visit the bell tower of St Leonard's church, Naremburn for a guided tour to see our beautiful bells and to see a demonstration of bell ringing? Originally from a church in Wales, UK, these bells were cast in 1866 and retuned in Loughborough, UK in 2012, from where they were shipped to Australia. Installing the bells in St Leonard's church began in January 2013 and was completed in April 2013.

On Friday 26 January 2024 we are offering TWO free tours of the tower, commencing at 4pm & 4.45 pm. Please arrive promptly at the back of the church (corner Willoughby and Donnelly Roads) 10 ten minutes prior to your tour time. Tours are expected to last about 45 minutes.
