# **First Reading**

Genesis 22:1-2. 9-13. 15-18

God put Abraham to the test. 'Abraham, Abraham,' he called.' Here I am' he replied. 'Take your son,' God said 'your only child Isaac, whom you love, and go to the land of Moriah. There you shall offer him as a burnt offering, on a mountain I will point out to you.' When they arrived at the place God had pointed out to him, Abraham built an altar there, and arranged the wood. Then he bound his son Isaac and put him on the altar on top of the wood. Abraham stretched out his hand and seized the knife to kill his son.

But the angel of the Lord called to him from heaven. 'Abraham, Abraham' he said. 'I am here' he replied. 'Do not raise your hand against the boy' the angel said. 'Do not harm him, for now I know you fear God. You have not refused me your son, your only son.' Then looking up, Abraham saw a ram caught by its horns in a bush. Abraham took the ram and offered it as a burnt offering in place of his son.

The angel of the Lord called Abraham a second time from heaven. 'I swear by my own self - it is the Lord who speaks - because you have done this, because you have not refused me your son, your only son, I will shower blessings on you, I will make your descendants as many as the stars of heaven and the grains of sand on the seashore. Your descendants shall gain possession of the gates of your enemies. All the nations of the earth shall bless themselves by your descendants, as a reward for your obedience.'

# Gospel

Mark 9:2-10

Jesus took with him Peter and James and John and led them up a high mountain where they could be alone by themselves. There in their presence he was transfigured: his clothes became dazzlingly white, whiter than any earthly bleacher could make them. Elijah appeared to them with Moses; and they were talking with Jesus. Then Peter spoke to Jesus. 'Rabbi,' he said 'it is wonderful for us to be here; so let us make three tents, one for you, one for Moses and one for Elijah.' He did not know what to say; they were so frightened. And a cloud came, covering them in shadow; and there came a voice from the cloud, 'This is my Son, the Beloved. Listen to him.' Then suddenly, when they looked round, they saw no one with them any more but only Jesus.

As they came down from the mountain he warned them to tell no one what they had seen, until after the Son of Man had risen from the dead. They observed the warning faithfully, though among themselves they discussed what 'rising from the dead' could mean.



# 25 February 2024

How was your first week of Lent? Prayerful and reflective? Our Church provides Lent almost like an annual retreat, a time of deepening the understanding of our Christian faith, a time for reflection and renewal, a time to make a fresh start. It offers us the opportunity to journey towards the joyous solemnity of Easter and while we reflect on our lives we can harness the call to participate in the Mission of Christ to which we are all called.

In the early centuries of the Church, Lent was seen as a time of beginning. It was – and is now – a time for forming new converts, preparing them for their formal entry into the Church community.

Last Sunday 130 Catechumens in the RCIA program from parishes in our Diocese gathered with Bishop Anthony at the Our Lady of the Rosary Cathedral for the annual Rite of Election which takes place on the First Sunday of Lent. This is a step in their journey to receive the sacraments of initiation – Baptism, Eucharist and Confirmation – at Easter.

Accompanied by their RCIA co-ordinators, Parish Clergy, sponsors, fellow parishioners, family and friends, the Catechumens were presented to the Bishop as a sign of "election" into the Catholic Church.

The Catechumens indicate their desire to join the Church by signing the Book of the Elect.

It was a beautiful grace-filled celebration as they journey towards the Easter liturgies. Lets us keep them all in our Lenten prayers


