As we ponder the divine wisdom contained within the weekend readings from Exodus, Corinthians, and John may we allow their messages to stir our hearts and minds this Lent. In Exodus, we encounter the Ten Commandments, a cornerstone of moral guidance for God's people. Do we truly grasp the significance of these commandments in our lives today? Do we prioritise our relationship with God above all else, or do we allow distractions to pull us away? Corinthians challenges us to contemplate the paradoxical nature of the cross. How do we perceive the message of the cross in our modern world? Do we embrace its wisdom, or do we stumble over it in our search for worldly knowledge and understanding? John's Gospel presents us with the powerful image of Jesus cleansing the temple. What impurities dwell within the temple of our own hearts? Are we willing to allow Jesus to cleanse and purify us, even if it means overturning the tables of our comfortable routines and habits? As we wrestle with these questions, let us remember that faith is not stagnant but dynamic, calling us to continual growth and transformation. Let us open our hearts to the guidance of the Holy Spirit, allowing it to lead us deeper into the mysteries of God's love and grace. Gospel

John 2:13-25

Just before the Jewish Passover Jesus went up to Jerusalem, and in the Temple he found people selling cattle and sheep and pigeons, and the money changers sitting at their counters there. Making a whip out of some cord, he drove them all out of the Temple, cattle and sheep as well, scattered the money changers' coins, knocked their tables over and said to the pigeon-sellers, 'Take all this out of here and stop turning my Father's house into a market.' Then his disciples remembered the words of scripture: Zeal for your house will devour me. The Jews intervened and said, 'What sign can you show us to justify what you have done?' Jesus answered, 'Destroy this sanctuary, and in three days I will raise it up.' The Jews replied, 'It has taken forty-six years to build this sanctuary: are you going to raise it up in three days?' But he was speaking of the sanctuary that was his body, and when Jesus rose from the dead, his disciples remembered that he had said this, and they believed the scripture and the words he had said.

During his stay in Jerusalem for the Passover many believed in his name when they saw the signs that he gave, but Jesus knew them all and did not trust himself to them; he never needed evidence about any man; he could tell what a man had in him.

This Sunday at the 9am Mass at St Philip Neri our Catechumens & Candidates receive the First of Three Scrutinies where we ask them to reflect more deeply upon the word of God as they have special prayers said over them. Please extend your loving support and prayers for them as we look forward to the day when you will share fully in the Lord's Table.
