FOURTH SUNDAY OF LENT 10 MARCH 2024



Dear Parishioners,

In the past months there have been some developments on our Naremburn development. You will recall that the Interim Heritage Order (**IHO**) Appeal hearing took place in the Land and Environment Court in late October 2023.

The IHO Appeal decision was handed down later than expected, in January 2024. Most unfortunately the Appeal was dismissed, which means that Willoughby Council is now free to undertake a Heritage Listing Process for the former primary school. Despite a letter being sent to the Minister for Planning and Public Spaces (Paul Scully) to request that the Minister himself become involved in the matter to avoid Council retaining control over the Planning Proposal, the Minister declined, so the Council retains such control.

This is a major blow to the Parish, both in terms of the financial impact and the lost opportunity to create a vibrant parish and community precinct for generations to come. If the heritage listing proceeds, it means that the former primary school building must be retained, which in turn means the site could not be viably developed. As it is also clear that the school building cannot be used as a school, essentially the Parish will be left with an all but derelict building which will need to be fenced off for safety reasons at ongoing parish expense.

The Heritage Listing process involves Council amending the Local Environmental Plan by May 2024, with this process likely resulting in a listing. Nevertheless, parishioners will have an opportunity to voice their opinions one the proposed heritage listing once the Planning Proposal is open to public exhibition and comment. I will provide more detail about this in due course. The IHO Appeal loss is an extremely disappointing outcome for the community, the parish, and for all the parishioners who provided such wonderful personal support for the Parish as we fought the IHO.

Since the IHO Appeal decision, I have been considering the way forward with members of the Parish Finance Committee and our development partner, Metro. We have also sought advice to clarify our position. As the site would effectively become unusable and be a drain on Parish resources into the future, we have decided to progress the DA Appeal with a view to achieving a viable development of the site entailing the demolition of the former primary school, as always planned. This seems the most appropriate pathway to follow, given the pastoral vision we share for the renewed vitality, the wonderful facilities and amenity for our parish and our broader community which the development will bring. The DA Appeal has been listed for hearing in the Land and Environment Court on **26, 27 and 28 August 2024** so preparations for the Appeal will continue over the coming months and I will provide a further update as we progress. I thank you again for your continued support, advice and prayers for our Parish community. SUNDAY'S READINGS

First Reading

2 Chronicles 36:14-16. 19-23

All the heads of the priesthood, and the people too, added infidelity to infidelity, copying all the shameful practices of the nations and defiling the Temple that the Lord had consecrated for himself in Jerusalem. The Lord, the God of their ancestors, tirelessly sent them messenger after messenger, since he wished to spare his people and his house. But they ridiculed the messengers of God, they despised his words, they laughed at his prophets, until at last the wrath of the Lord rose so high against his people that there was no further remedy.

Their enemies burned down the Temple of God, demolished the walls of Jerusalem, set fire to all its palaces, and destroyed everything of value in it. The survivors were deported by Nebuchadnezzar to Babylon; they were to serve him and his sons until the kingdom of Persia came to power. This is how the word of the Lord was fulfilled that he spoke through Jeremiah, 'Until this land has enjoyed its sabbath rest, until seventy years have gone by, it will keep sabbath throughout the days of its desolation.' And in the first year of Cyrus king of Persia, to fulfil the word of the Lord that was spoken through Jeremiah, the Lord roused the spirit of Cyrus king of Persia to issue a proclamation and to have it publicly displayed throughout his kingdom: 'Thus speaks Cyrus king of Persia, "The Lord, the God of heaven, has given me all the kingdoms of the earth; he has ordered me to build him a Temple in Jerusalem, in Judah. Whoever there is among you of all his people, may his God be with him! Let him go up."

work of art, created in Christ Jesus to live the good life as from the beginning he had meant us to live it.

Jesus said to Nicodemus:

Yes, God loved the world so much that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him may not be lost but may have eternal life. For God sent his Son into the world not to condemn the world, but so that through him the world might be saved. No one who believes in him will be condemned; but whoever refuses to believe is condemned already, because he has refused to believe in the name of God's only Son.

On these grounds is sentence pronounced: that though the light has come into the world men have shown they prefer darkness to the light because their deeds were evil. And indeed, everybody who does wrong hates the light and avoids it, for fear his actions should be exposed; but the man who lives by the truth comes out into the light, so that it may be plainly seen that what he does is done in God.'

LAUDATO SI'



On Saturday 2 March 6 volunteers from the Parish's Laudato Si Action Platform (LSAP) group got a jump start on Clean Up Australia and combed the streets of Willoughby, picking up rubbish, mostly plastics and cigarette butts bound for Middle Harbour and our ecosystem via the storm water drains.

During the course of our collecting rubbish, we engaged in a number of conversations with people, telling them we were from the Parish, talking about Laudato Si and our Holy Father Pope Francis.

FIRST RECONCILIATION 2024



Children across our Parish are midway through their preparation for the Sacrament of Reconciliation. The halfway point is not a time to be discouraged but to be encouraged and present with Our Lord.


If you think Lent is a kind of spiritual boot camp or marathon, think of the joy and celebration three weeks ahead.

SERRA VOCATIONS MASS AND DINNER MEETING




