VINNIES WINTER APPEAL

We would like to thank everyone for their continuing support of Vinnies. Just a few facts about how your kind donation helps those in need.

Broken Bay Central Council which we belong to for the winter period between June and August 2022 provided \$232,000 worth of assistance to people experiencing disadvantage including \$90,000 worth of assistance for food. Welcome to the NBRS Winter 2023 Newsletter

We have had a busy six months with 274 airfares paid. They have arrived from Syria, Iraq, Afghanistan, Eritrea, Ethiopia and Congo. The largest numbers were from Syria and Iraq.

The Northern Beaches Refugee Sanctuary's first family arrived in June 2003. We have now helped 8160 people from 48 different countries. It has been a wonderful 20 years filled with so many memories. We have met or talked to so many courageous people who have profoundly affected us. Stories of heartbreak and survival. I am often asked how well do people settle here? I think it is best summed up by saying a lot better than where they came from. I remember asking one lady "what is the best thing in Australia". She thought about it and then said, "not hearing gunfire at night". It makes me extremely grateful for the life I have.

We are still seeing strong demand for assistance. The cost of airfares has fallen back towards pre-covid levels. This makes flights more affordable. It also makes it easier for the families to repay the loan.

We are delighted to be assisting a lot more people from Afghanistan (75), most of whom are families of interpreters who worked with the Australian Defense Forces. They have been targeted because of their relatives working with the ADF. They have been forced to flee and most have travelled to Pakistan or India. Sadly, there isn't any safety there either. When the visas to Australia are granted, there is great relief and celebration. The sponsor in Australia will have been supporting the families. This makes it difficult to save the cost of the airfares. They may also have to pay for an exit permit. When they arrive in Australia the children will be able to get a good education. They will all have food and medical treatment. There will be challenges to overcome but their lives won't be at risk.

We recently helped one family. The son had worked with the ADF and suffered gunshot wounds. He was lucky to survive. He helped his parents and siblings escape to Afghanistan while they waited for a visa. They were not allowed to work so life was very difficult. One of the family required an operation which the sponsor paid for. He also paid for their accommodation and food. The sponsor still suffers from the injuries he sustained which has made work painful. He also has a wife and children to support. When the visa was granted, he couldn't pay for the airfare. We were able to help and the family will arrive soon. His children will meet their grandparents and uncles and aunts. They will have a chance of freedom. The girls will be able to get an education and work. They won't be constantly fearful of people trying to kill them. They are so grateful for the help, and I am so happy that we were able to help them. I am not sure if I will ever meet them as they live a long way away, but the courage and generosity of the sponsor has been an inspiration to me.

We assisted Mohamed with his parents and siblings when they were granted visas in 2015. They arrived and settled in Melbourne. Mohamed is a terrific person. He was able to help his family make a life in Australia. His wife was sad that only his family had visas and her family didn't. She missed her mother and siblings. He said "happy wife happy life". He then sponsored his wife's family. They were rejected which was difficult for them. He kept applying for his wife's mother and siblings. They were finally granted a visa and we helped again with a loan for the travel. Mohamed and his wife are so grateful they both have family here now and his children have both sides of the family to enjoy and love.

This is an email we received from one of our families that we helped. He can tell you what your donations are used for better than I can.

"Dear David,

I cannot express how grateful we are for your generous offer to help us purchase the tickets we needed. Yes, you can absolutely contact IOM and pay them \$12000 and the rest \$5000 we will manage. Your kindness and willingness to assist us have truly touched our hearts.

We understand that the amount you have contributed is significant and we are committed to repaying it back to you as soon as possible. Your support has been a tremendous help to us, and we promise to work hard to fulfill our obligations to you. Also, our family members are waiting for their Immicard which they will receive in 1 week and then the IOM will proceed to the next stage to get their exit permits from Pakistan.

Once again, thank you from the bottom of our hearts. Your assistance has made a real difference in our lives, and we will never forget your kindness."

IOM is The International Organization for migration. It assists refugees with travel arrangements.

IMMICards are the documents that refugees travel on. They are issued by the Australian Government.

They have arrived now and have already started to repay the loan.

We are looking for donations if you can help.

Donations are tax deductible and reused many times. Our bad debts were about 0.3% of loans this year which is fantastic. If you want to help please transfer the money to our account.

First Reading

Jeremiah 20:10-13 (JB)

A reading from the prophet Jeremiah

He has delivered the soul of the needy from the hands of those who are evil.

Jeremiah said: I hear so many disparaging me, "Terror from every side!" Denounce him! Let us denounce him!' All those who used to be my friends watched for my downfall, 'Perhaps he will be seduced into error. Then we will master him and take our revenge!' But the Lord is at my side, a mighty hero; my opponents will stumble, mastered, confounded by their failure; everlasting, unforgettable disgrace will be theirs. But you, Lord of Hosts, you who probe with justice, who scrutinise the loins and heart, let me see the vengeance you will take on them, for I have committed my cause to you. Sing to the Lord, praise the Lord, for he has delivered the soul of the needy from the hands of evil men.

A reading from the letter of St Paul to the Romans

God's gift to us is nothing like our sin against him.

Sin entered the world through one man, and through sin death, and thus death has spread through the whole human race because everyone has sinned. Sin existed in the world long before the Law was given. There was no law and so no one could be accused of the sin of 'law-breaking', yet death reigned over all from Adam to Moses, even though their sin, unlike that of Adam, was not a matter of breaking a law.

Adam prefigured the One to come, but the gift itself considerably outweighed the fall. If it is certain that through one man's fall so many died, it is even more certain that divine grace, coming through the one man, Jesus Christ, came to so many as an abundant free gift.

Matthew 10:26-33 (JB)

John 15:26, 27 (JB)

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Matthew *Do not fear those who can kill the body.*

Jesus instructed the Twelve as follows: 'Do not be afraid. For everything that is now covered will be uncovered, and everything now hidden will be made clear. What I say to you in the dark, tell in the daylight; what you hear in whispers, proclaim from the housetops.

Do not be afraid of those who kill the body but cannot kill the soul; fear him rather who can destroy both body and soul in hell. Can you not buy two sparrows for a penny? And yet not one falls to the ground without your Father knowing. Why, every hair on your head has been counted. So there is no need to be afraid; you are worth more than hundreds of sparrows.

'So if anyone declares himself for me in the presence of men, I will declare myself for him in the presence of my Father in heaven. But the one who disowns me in the presence of men, I will disown in the presence of my Father in heaven.'
