MANLY FRESHWATER PARISH Mary Immaculate, Manly and St John the Baptist, Freshwater

13th Sunday in Ordinary Time 30th June 2019



The readings this week focus on the answers different people make to the call to follow the Lord. In the **First Reading**, Elisha leaves his people to follow Elijah, the Lord's prophet, but only after he has fed them and said goodbye to his parents. However, that is precisely what Jesus won't allow one of his potential followers to do along the road towards Jerusalem. Being Jesus's disciple involves total commitment and support, without any looking back, even when the conditions are demanding. (**Gospel**)

We can trust, with the **Psalmist**, that the Lord will show us the path of life: joy and happiness will be ours forever if we keep him in our sight and follow him. The Galatians are told that it is not fidelity to an external observance that will make them followers of Jesus but the extent to which they live the life of the Spirit. (Second Reading)

Today's gospel is part of the 'travel narratives' of Jesus as He "sets His face to go to Jerusalem". The passage contains a real sense of urgency to it, in that Jesus will not even let His followers get their affairs in order before following Him to Jerusalem. Acceptance of Jesus' call, and the condition to leave everything and not set their affairs in order before following Jesus to Jerusalem, is difficult, to say the least. Jesus is making it evidently clear that there are no guarantees that the road will be easy; if anything, it will be difficult and challenging. The difficult road is quickly evident when they encounter the inhospitality of the Samaritans, those considered to be standing outside of the Jewish faith. Jesus will not destroy the Samaritans, but rather, He continues to set His face toward Jerusalem, inviting His followers to continue the journey with Him. This week, we might want to reflect on great disciples who have followed the Lord unconditionally – like St Oscar Romero or St Teresa of Calcutta – and be encouraged by their example.

St Mary's Church at Manly is fitted with an audio loop for hearing impaired.



Dear Friends of Manly Freshwater Parish,

On behalf of Fr Paul Kim, the Parish Finance Committee and myself I wish to thank you for your generous support of our parish over this last Financial Year.

Each one of you is an important member of our Parish. We all have precious memories attending Mass and the Sacraments, watching our children and grandchildren receiving the Sacraments and important family events such as weddings, anniversaries and funerals. Therefore, you would agree that St Mary's Church, Manly and St John the Baptist Church, Freshwater are a vital part of our Community.

Blessed by God, with countless gifts and abilities, we are also called to make a financial commitment so that the Parish can carry out its Mission to live out the Gospel of Jesus Christ. Your financial commitment through the Planned Giving Program allows our Parish to develop a realistic budget to meet existing needs and obligations and plan for future developments.

During 2018/2019 our parish undertook urgent major repairs to the stonework and the windows at St Mary's Church, Manly (stage 1) with a cost of approx. \$250,000.00. We also completed essential repairs and maintenance to the presbytery kitchen and bathrooms with a cost of approx. \$107,000.

During the next financial year in addition to our daily running costs, we will undertake the following works:

- Major repairs to the roof of St Mary's Church, Manly (identified Dec 2018)
- Repairs and painting to St John's Church Freshwater
- Continued renovations to the Presbytery (painting)

Unfortunately, our present income will not cover this expenditure and so we need your financial help.

First Reading

1 Kings 19:16, 19-21 (JB)

A reading from the first book of the Kings

Elisha rose and followed Elijah and became his servant.

The Lord said to Elijah: 'Go, you are to anoint Elisha son of Shaphat, of Abel Meholah, as prophet to succeed you.' Leaving there, Elijah came to Elisha son of Shaphat as he was ploughing behind twelve yoke of oxen, he himself being with the twelfth. Elijah passed near to him and threw his cloak over him. Elisha left his oxen and ran after Elijah. 'Let me kiss my father and mother, then I will follow you' he said. Elijah answered, 'Go, go back; for have I done anything to you?' Elisha turned away, took the pair of oxen and slaughtered them. He used the plough for cooking the oxen, then gave to his men, who ate. He then rose, and followed Elijah and became his servant.

Second Reading Galatians 5:1, 13-18 (JB)

A reading from the letter of St Paul to the Galatians

My brothers, you were called to freedom.

When Christ freed us, he meant us to remain free. Stand firm, therefore, and do not submit again to the yoke of slavery. My brothers, you were called, as you know, to liberty; but be careful, or this liberty will provide an opening for self-indulgence. Serve one another, rather, in works of love, since the whole of the Law is summarised in a single command: Love your neighbour as yourself. If you go snapping at each other and tearing each other to pieces, you had better watch or you will destroy the whole community. Let me put it like this: if you are guided by the Spirit you will be in no danger of yielding to self-indulgence, since selfindulgence is the opposite of the Spirit, the Spirit is totally against such a thing, and it is precisely because the two are so opposed that you do not always carry out your good intentions. If you are led by the Spirit, no law can touch you.

Luke 9:51-62 (JB)

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke

Jesus resolutely set his face towards Jerusalem. I will follow you wherever you will go.

As the time drew near for him to be taken up to heaven, Jesus resolutely took the road for Jerusalem and sent messengers ahead of him. These set out, and they went into a Samaritan village to make preparations for him, but the people would not receive him because he was making for Jerusalem. Seeing this, the disciples James and John said, 'Lord, do you want us to call down fire from heaven to burn them up?' But he turned and rebuked them, and they went off to another village. As they travelled along they met a man on the road who said to him, 'I will follow you wherever you go.' Jesus answered, 'Foxes have holes and the birds of air have nests, but the Son of Man has nowhere to lay his head.' Another to whom he said, 'Follow me,' replied, 'Let me go and bury my father first.' But he answered, 'Leave the dead to bury the dead; your duty is to go and spread the news of the kingdom of God.' Another said, 'I will follow you, sir, but first let me go and say good-bye to my people at home.' Jesus said to him. 'Once the hand is laid on the plough, no one who looks back is fit for the kingdom of God.'
