Gospel Reflection

Jesus commissions 72 messengers to go before him to prepare for his arrival in the towns along his route to Jerusalem. The number 72 symbolized for the Jews the number of the world's Gentile nations. In keeping with Luke's use of symbolic numbers and his Gentile perspective, the 72 disciples represent the new Church's mission to every nation and people under heaven.

Jesus instructs the seventy-two:

- to keep focused on the ways and values of God travel light, accept the simple hospitality of those you visit;
- to proclaim God's peace "amid wolves";
- to offer hope and healing, not judgment and condemnation;
- to find satisfaction not in what they have done in God's name but to rejoice in what God has done through them.

Jesus' vision of Satan's fall assures the disciples of every age that, despite the dangers of "serpent and scorpion" (First Testament symbols of evil); the good that they do out of faithfulness to their call will ultimately triumph. *Connectionsmediaworks.com*



SPIRITUAL CONVERSATIONS GROUP


Do you know someone thinking about becoming Catholic?

Peter's Pence is a collection taken up all over the world to support the works of mercy of the Holy See.

Donations assist the Holy Father, Pope Leo XIV, support the most disadvantaged, and emergency situations such as supporting victims of war and oppression who are in need of humanitarian assistance, natural disasters, and development.

The concrete participation in the needs of the universal ecclesial community has taken different forms throughout history. These collections and donations by the individual faithful or entire local churches raise the awareness that all the baptised have always been called to materially sustain the work of evangelization and at the same time to help the poor in whatever way is possible.

The practice originated in the Holy Scriptures.

In his public life, dedicated to the proclamation of the Good News, Jesus received material aid to support himself with the group of the twelve Apostles (Lk 8:1-3). With this aid they also assisted those most in need (Jn 12:4-7).

After Pentecost, in the time of the Church, the need was felt to support those who dedicated themselves fully to the proclamation of the Gospel (1 Tim 5:17-18).

Saint Paul, in the Churches he founded, instituted the collection in support of the Mother Church of Jerusalem, which faced serious economic difficulties.

This concrete participation in the needs of the community took on various forms throughout history, giving rise to the awareness that all the baptised are required to support, also materially and according to their means, the work of evangelization and at the same time to assist those most in need everywhere in the world.

Through the Peter's Pence Collection, held every year on the Solemnity of Saints Peter and Paul, 29 June, or the nearest Sunday, we are all invited to pray in a special way for the Pope and to offer our contribution in the Church where we attend Mass.

A little or a lot, it is all welcome. Giving is a gift.

Part 4 - The Vocation to **Dedicated Single Life**

This week, we reflect on the vocation and mission of the dedicated single life. Unlike other vocations, the dedicated single life is not considered a canonically recognised vocation. That is, it is not a sacrament like Matrimony or Holy Orders, nor does it have a formal rite of entry or regulation under canon law, as is the case with consecrated life. Nevertheless, while there is no single magisterial document devoted exclusively to this vocation, it is referenced in Church teachings and encyclicals, and it is recognised as a valid and valuable way of living one's baptismal call.

For instance, Lumen Gentium emphasises the universal call to holiness, affirming that all the faithful, regardless of rank or status—including single persons—are called to the "fullness of the Christian life and the perfection of charity" (LG, 40). The Catechism of the Catholic Church also highlights the responsibility of the lay faithful to bring the Gospel into the world, especially in areas where clergy may not be present, such as in social, political, and economic spheres (CCC 898-900; LG, 31).

The vocation of dedicated single life, then, is a free and intentional commitment to live a life of holiness and service in building up the Kingdom of God both in the Church and in society. It is not simply a state of life entered into by circumstance, but a conscious choice. Those called to this vocation embrace celibacy and chastity for the sake of the Kingdom (cf. Mt 19:12) and are committed to a dailv life prayer, discipleship. of evangelisation through their work and relationships. In many ways, single persons are uniquely available to serve others with greater freedom, often able to give their time and talents in ways that may be more difficult for those with family responsibilities, or even those in ordained ministry.

We can draw inspiration from several saints who lived out their vocation as dedicated singles. One such example is Blessed Pier Giorgio Frassati—canonisation on Sept 7, 2025—who, despite his wealthy background, devoted his life to charitable works and social reform. Deeply influenced by Pope Leo XIII's encyclical Rerum Novarum, he advocated for justice and cared for the poor with great zeal. His funeral drew thousands of the city's poor, a shock to his own family and friends, and a testament to the impact of his hidden life of service.

Another example is St. Giuseppe Moscati, a medical doctor from Naples, Italy. He is remembered for his groundbreaking work in medicine and scientific research, but even more so for his deep faith and compassion. He used his skills and income to care for the sick, poor, and needy, offering his profession as a true act of Christian charity. He died in 1927 and was canonized in 1987.

Let us learn to recognise, value, and celebrate single Catholics who have dedicated their lives to following Jesus more closely and serving others more generously.





Your peace will rest upon him.

The Lord appointed seventy-two others and sent them out ahead of him, in pairs, to all the towns and places he himself was to visit. He said to them, 'The harvest is rich but the labourers are few, so ask the Lord of the harvest to send labourers to his harvest. Start off now, but remember, I am sending you out like lambs among wolves. Carry no purse, no haversack, no sandals. Salute no one on the road. Whatever house you go into, let your first words be, "Peace to this house!" And if a man of peace lives there, your peace will go and rest on him; if not, it will come back to you. Stay in the same house, taking what food and drink they have to offer, for the labourer deserves his wages; do not move from house to house. Whenever you go into a town where they make you welcome, eat what is set before you. Cure those in it who are sick, and say, "The kingdom of God is very near to you." But whenever you enter a town and they do not make you welcome, go out into its streets and say, "We wipe off the very dust of your town that clings to our feet, and leave it with you. Yet be sure of this: the kingdom of God is very near." I tell you, on that day it will not go as hard with Sodom as with that town.'

The seventy-two came back rejoicing. 'Lord,' they said, 'even the devils submit to us when we use your name.' He said to them, 'I watched Satan fall like lightning from heaven. Yes, I have given you power to tread underfoot serpents and scorpions and the whole strength of the enemy; nothing shall ever hurt you. Yet do not rejoice that the spirits submit to you; rejoice rather that your names are written in heaven.'
