REFLECTION

This Sunday's readings celebrate the grace of Christ's peace, and invite us to become messengers of that peace to all around us. Isaiah calls the people of Israel to trust in God's loving presence with them. He compares the care and comfort God lavishes on us to that of a comforting, nurturing mother. (First Reading)

Today's Psalm reverberates with the joy of a people conscious of God's care. In the Second Reading, Paul tells the Christians of Galatia that they are a new creation; a new people of God. The 'marks' that matter now are not the marks of circumcision, but those of a new creature who follows the way of the life, death and resurrection of Jesus Christ.

In the Gospel story, Jesus speaks of the urgency and magnitude of the task of proclaiming his message to all the peoples. He sends out the 72 disciples to prepare the way for him and to spread his peace. On their return, Jesus reminds the rejoicing disciples that their success lies in his power working through them, not in their own strength.

In the work of Christ there is a 'ripple principle' at work. The image is that of a stone entering a lake and then the effects go out in concentric circles, getting wider and wider, until they reach the very edge. The whole surface of the lake is transformed as the ripples spread ever outwards.

We today are called to bring the ripple effect of our encounter with Jesus Christ outwards. We are the group who have to show within the places we live that 'the kingdom of God is near.'

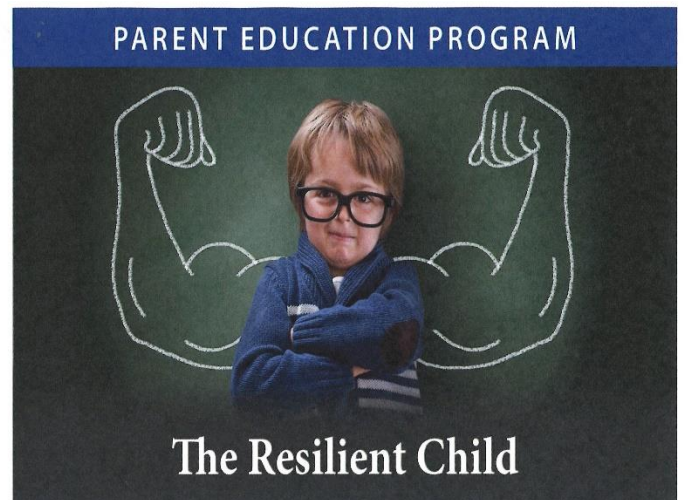
This week let us pray to the Father to be shown our mission individually and collectively in our church community, as we are called to become messengers of peace and hope in word and deed.

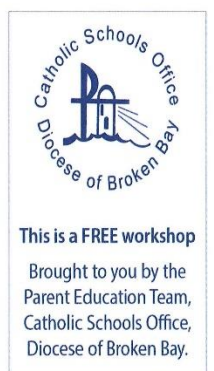

Dear Friends of Manly Freshwater Parish,

On behalf of Fr Paul Kim, the Parish Finance Committee and myself I wish to thank you for your generous support of our parish over this last Financial Year.

Each one of you is an important member of our Parish. We all have precious memories attending Mass and the Sacraments, watching our children and grandchildren receiving the Sacraments and important family events such as weddings, anniversaries and funerals. Therefore, you would agree that St Mary's Church, Manly and St John the Baptist Church, Freshwater are a vital part of our Community.

Blessed by God, with countless gifts and abilities, we are also called to make a financial commitment so that the Parish can carry out its Mission to live out the Gospel of Jesus Christ. Your financial commitment through the Planned Giving Program allows our Parish to develop a realistic budget to meet existing needs and obligations and plan for future developments.

During 2018/2019 our parish undertook urgent major repairs to the stonework and the windows at St Mary's Church, Manly (stage 1) with a cost of approx. \$250,000.00. We also completed essential repairs and maintenance to the presbytery kitchen and bathrooms with a cost of approx. \$107,000.

During the next financial year in addition to our daily running costs, we will undertake the following works:

- Major repairs to the roof of St Mary's Church, Manly (identified Dec 2018)
- Repairs and painting to St John's Church Freshwater
- Continued renovations to the Presbytery (painting)

Unfortunately, our present income will not cover this expenditure and so we need your financial help.

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke

Your peace will rest upon him.

The Lord appointed seventy-two others and sent them out ahead of him, in pairs, to all the towns and places he himself was to visit. He said to them, 'The harvest is rich but the labourers are few, so ask the Lord of the harvest to send labourers to his harvest. Start off now, but remember, I am sending you out like lambs among wolves. Carry no purse, no haversack, no sandals. Salute no one on the road. Whatever house you go into, let your first words be, "Peace to this house!" And if a man of peace lives there, your peace will go and rest on him; if not, it will come back to you. Stay in the same house, taking what food and drink they have to offer, for the labourer deserves his wages; do not move from house to house. Whenever you go into a town where they make you welcome, eat what is set before you. Cure those in it who are sick, and say, "The kingdom of God is very near to you." But whenever you enter a town and they do not make you welcome, go out into its streets and say, "We wipe off the very dust of your town that clings to our feet, and leave it with you. Yet be sure of this: the kingdom of God is very near." I tell you, on that day it will not go as hard with Sodom as with that town.'

The seventy-two came back rejoicing. 'Lord,' they said, 'even the devils submit to us when we use your name.' He said to them, 'I watched Satan fall like lightning from heaven. Yes, I have given you power to tread underfoot serpents and scorpions and the whole strength of the enemy; nothing shall ever hurt you. Yet do not rejoice that the spirits submit to you; rejoice rather that your names are written in heaven.'

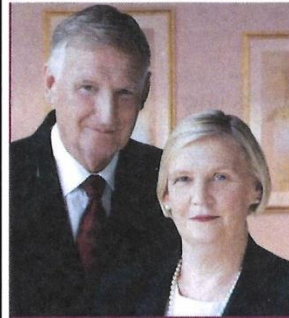
