Just as we were celebrating the reopening of our Churches, we are reminded by the re-emergence of Covid 19 virus in Victoria that all of us have to be more vigilant about social distancing and hand sanitizing. Also, if you are feeling unwell please don't come into the Church and have your health checked out by your doctor.

As announced last week we have changed our live streaming of Mass from the Saturday Vigils to the Sunday 8:30am Mass at St Mary's Church. We are still sorting out the technology to improve the sound quality.

Below is an interesting reflection on today's Gospel that I hope you find helpful.



"A sower went out to sow. Some of the seed fell on the path, and the birds came and ate it up . . . Other seed fell on good soil and brought forth grain, some a hundredfold, some sixty, some thirty." Matthew 13: 1-23 Love is more than a rose . . .

Don't let anyone tell you that love is a rose.

Love is a weed. It grows wild. It flourishes where it is trampled; it multiplies where it is ripped from the ground. Its roots grow deeper through suffering, stronger through storms. Don't believe that love is a beautiful flower.

Love is a cactus. It thrives in the most barren places. It collects the precious water of the desert and willingly sheds its tough skin to offer a drink to the thirsty traveler.

Don't look for love in the colors of nature, in the freshness of

spring, or in sunrises and sunsets.

Love is the old tree that gives its wood for warmth and its fruit for food. It welcomes into its branches ever bird of the sky; it shelters every animal of the wood. It gives everything it has — and keeps giving as its roots give birth to new trees that take on the God-like work of giving.

Love is the unwelcome rain that fills every creek and stream.

Love is the dark earth that nurtures every root to harvest.

Love is the seed that dies to become something greater than itself.

Don't get carried away with romantic notions of love.

Love is as real as dirt, as generous as water, as giving as seed.

Sowing seed is an act of pure faith; seed sown mirrors the love of the Gospel Christ: seed that is scattered, that breaks itself open to realize the harvest within it, that struggles to survive the most barren soil to provide food and shelter for every creature. Jesus challenges us in the parable of the sower to be both sower and seed: to sow seeds of encouragement, joy and reconciliation regardless of the "ground" on which it is scattered, and to imitate the seed's selfless giving of self that becomes the harvest of Gospel justice and mercy. Sacramental Program for First Holy Communion

First Holy Communion will be held over the weekend of 22nd & 23rd August. This year due to COVID 19 restrictions we will be changing the way we do our preparation program.

As part of the program we ask that the Children and the Parents come along to Mass for 4 weeks prior to the First Holy Communion weekend. Following each of the Masses the Children will receive a sticker for their Passports and they will require 4 stickers to confirm they have completed the program and are ready to make their First Holy Communion.

The Presentation Mass will be held at all Masses over the **weekend of 25th and 26th July**. During the Masses in week 2,3 and 4 the children will attend a special children's liturgy where they will have an opportunity to go over their session and practice how to receive Holy Communion. GROUPS MEETING AGAIN


Our Meeting rooms are now able to be used again, with strict guidelines from the Government. Please contact the Parish Office if your group wishes to resume meetings.

REFLECTION...

The readings this week are linked by images of nature, water, rain, growing crops and harvest.

In the **First Reading**, the prophet Isaiah compares the word of God to the rain falling on the world, which ensures a good crop and thus feeds the people.

Continuing this agricultural theme, the **Psalm** gives thanks to the Lord for his care for the earth. The whole world rejoices and sings at the abundant harvest.

For Paul, in the **Second Reading**, the whole of creation still hopes to be freed. All of us have the responsibility to be its good stewards.

Jesus uses images from the countryside familiar to his listeners, to tell the crowds who follow him a parable. Here God acts as a sower, scattering seeds freely on ground which is not always ready or able to receive it. **(Gospel)**

This week, we might want to focus our prayers on the needs of our environment, the Lord's creation.

Message for BBNeighbourhoods 30 June 2020

My dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

The Evangelist Matthew describes a simple, but powerful encounter between Jesus, little children, their parents and carers, and Jesus' disciples (Matthew 19:13-14). Matthew tells us that the children were being brought to Jesus so that he might lay hands on them and pray. It is a beautiful, intimate and pure moment of communion. In that moment of encounter with Jesus the wellbeing of the children is paramount. With Jesus, the children are happy, healthy, and holy. They are safe. Meanwhile, the disciples and those who brought the children to Jesus are caught up in an altercation. It seems that their daily schedule had not provided space for this meeting. Maybe the structure of the timetable did not allow for spontaneous moments or the needs of others. Whatever the case, Jesus intervenes saying, "Let the little children come to me, and do not stop them". This is clearly a God moment, and the disciples cannot quite see it.

In the Gospel according to Mark, the Evangelist reports the episode of the blind man of Jericho named Bartimæus (Mark 10:46-52). Sitting by the side of the road, this person was both blind and a beggar. He is alone and looking for At one level, he desires human compassion. companionship, because on his own he is vulnerable and isolated. At the same time, this person desires healing and he asks for mercy. It is tempting to think that the healing he desires is outward looking, that is, his eyesight. However, his vulnerability is also inward looking. Bartimæus shouts out to Jesus because he seeks inner healing and spiritual well-being. In sum, this vulnerable person realises that Jesus will understand him and suffer with him, which is the deepest sign of compassion and mercy. In that moment when Jesus calls Bartimæus, they become one. In that moment, we have a glimpse of Jesus suffering on the cross for the salvation of all.

These two passages from the New Testament are a powerful reminder of how the business of discipleship can sometimes distract us from the true purpose of following Jesus. The busyness of activism can reduce the Christian life to a series of meetings, debates, and endless conversations about strategy and process. The mindfulness of belonging to Jesus, of being present in and through him, and of being sent on mission to proclaim Christ to the world, primarily by a life of witness to the Good News, can often be missing.

As the community of the Church of Broken Bay, we can never risk being so caught up in this kind of bureaucracy. The two examples from the Scriptures above are powerful reminders of how Jesus cares for children and vulnerable people. The safety and well-being of all people in the community of the Church and beyond is part of who we are as disciples of Jesus. Likewise, the conviction that all people in the community must be respected and cared for will inform and direct what we do as we live out our Christian vocation.

Beginning with my own ministry as your bishop, I hope that the determination to live the Gospel is something that each of us will commit to. In this way, we will be faithful to Christ who respected, protected, and cared for the children, the vulnerable, and indeed all people.


