We are familiar with the expression "from little things big things grow". We recall that Jesus fed the 5000 with



a few loaves and fishes. In today's gospel Jesus uses the image of mustard seeds and yeast to remind us that our faith has simple beginnings but can achieve great things if we are willing to share it with others.

"The kingdom of heaven is like yeast that a woman took and mixed with three measures of wheat flour until the whole batch was leavened." Matthew 13: 24-43

The seeds of maths and Shakespeare

Learning to read back in the first grade began with a series of cards or posters: A is for apple, B is for ball, C is for cookie (or celery), D is for dog — and we worked so hard to learn those sounds: a-pple, b-all, c-ookie, d-dog. Once we learned to make the right sound to the right letter, we were able to sound out combinations of letters that formed words. And we were reading! A wonderful new world of story and expression and learning was now open to us. Think about how far you've come since 'See John run' was the height of great literature.

And then there were numbers. First, we had to recognize that the numerals one through ten represented specific amounts of apples, cookies, pennies. Then we moved on, with the help of pie tins and pizza slices, to fractions. The next time you marvel at balancing your monthly accounts, stop and remember that it all began with ten apples.

Sacramental Program for First Holy Communion Commences Next Weekend with The Presentation Mass



First Holy Communion will be held over the weekend of 22nd & 23rd August. This year due to COVID 19 restrictions we will be changing the way we do our preparation program. We ask that the Parents prepare the children using the Preparation Booklet supplied by the Diocese.

As part of the program we ask that the Children and the Parents come along to Mass for 4 weeks prior to the First Holy Communion weekend. Following each of the Masses the Children will receive a sticker for their Passports and they will require 4 stickers to confirm they have completed the program and are ready to make their First Holy Communion.

The Presentation Mass will be held at all Masses over the weekend of 25th and 26th July. For further information contact the Parish Office on 9977 5822.

Welcome Back to Masses - There is no longer a limit to how many people can gather in our Churches, but we are still required to implement the Government requirement of 4sqm social distancing and the collection of attendees information. For Sunday and vigil Masses we will be preparing an ongoing list for those who regularly attend a specific Mass. A Welcomer at the Mass will mark off your name. If you are not on the list the Welcomer will take your name and contact details.

Changes to the Sacramental Program

Last week Parishes in the Diocese received a letter from Bishop Anthony regarding the changes to the Sacramental Program and especially to the celebration of Confirmation in 2020 in light of the Covid 19 restrictions.

Bishop Anthony advised that having considered the matter fully and subsequent to his discussions last week with the Council of Priest he wishes to bring to you the following forward:

- He is committed to the order of the Sacraments of Initiation being Baptism – Confirmation – Eucharist.
- As Bishop he is the ordinary minister of the Sacrament of Confirmation and does not wish this to be compromised by widespread delegation of the faculty.
- Given the uncertainly of how restrictions for gatherings may be eased in the future and given the constrains of time before November after which it would not be desirable to celebrate the Sacrament, he will not celebrate the Sacrament of Confirmation at all for 2020.
- 4. Feedback that Bishop Anthony has received about the celebration of Confirmation indicates to him that the practice of celebrating it with those who reached the age of 7 (typically those in Year 2 of school) is too early for a truly meaningful reception of the Sacrament.
 - Therefore, He wishes to use the circumstance afforded us negatively, the pandemic, to place our practice of Sacramental preparation, positively, on a new footing going forward.
- This will result in Confirmation in the future ordinarily being celebrated with those who have reached the age of 8, and who are typically in Year
 Reconciliation and Eucharist will therefore be celebrated with those who are aged 9 and are in Year 4.
- Consequently, through 2021 2022, the foundation of a programme of Sacramental Preparation for children who are 8 and older will have been established across all parishes in the Diocese

Bishop Anthony regards this as the best and most sustainable way forward to address both the suspension of the celebration of Confirmation for the rest of this year, and engage the unique opportunity with which we are now presented to bring the Sacramental Preparation Programme into the future on a different footing for children who are older and more able to appreciate the significance of their Christian Initiation.

Most Rev Anthony Randazzo Bishop of Broken Bay 14 July 2020

My dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

Last week I reflected upon how Jesus is the foundation of our mission as a community of the Church, especially in his respect, protection, and care for the children, the vulnerable, and indeed all people. These are a description of our "core values": respect, care, and protection of others. They are always Christ-centred and people oriented.

As a community of the faithful, an essential element of our vocation requires that we are to be vigilant in living these values. In our Diocese of Broken Bay, we are blessed to have a dedicated team whose mission is to assist us via ongoing formation and education regarding the safety of our children, young people, and vulnerable adults.

For my part, as your bishop, I meet regularly with the Director of the Office for Safeguarding. Together we discuss how as individuals and as a community we will ensure that our standards meet best practice procedures, which are correct and most effective. The work of our Safeguarding team allows me to have oversight of child related activities in our parishes, schools and works of mercy; screening and training procedures; visiting clergy audits; and Redress compliance.

I am grateful for this work as it allows full transparency and accountability and it is supported by external processes in collaboration with the Office of the Children's Guardian. It is helpful to recognise this good work while at the same time recognising the need not to become complacent.

Within the Diocese, there is one Office for Safeguarding because we are one community of the Church. The Office includes three different teams for Chancery, Catholic Schools Office, and CatholicCare, which are under the direction of the Diocesan Director. Our Diocesan website has a dedicated page for the Safeguarding Office's work and activities. On that page, you will find links to training and education, policies, resources and research.

Our Gospel values drive all this good work. It is important for me to ensure that our community of the Church is vigilant and that we have robust external processes to assist us in our mission to proclaim and live the Good News of Jesus Christ and to ensure the safety and wellbeing of all.

Remember the first time you met your spouse? Maybe it was a chance meeting with a simple Hello, a few awkward words might have been exchanged until you finally screwed up your courage to ask her out or you said yes to his tortured invitation, and somehow, in God's good time, the two of you connected —a relationship began and love blossomed.

None of us will ever forget this pandemic. It's been a time of fear and anxiety, of confusion and frustration. Many parts of our lives stopped or took strange, unexpected turns; we learned to do without, we learned to adapt and — most important of all — we learned to depend on one another. We've walked some treacherous ground these past few months and we're just starting to get our bearings again — but whatever the "new normal" will be like in the weeks and months ahead, many of us will begin our lives again with a little more gratitude, a little more patience, a little more humility.

The great events and moments of life begin with small things — from simple beginnings and basic principles life's greatest accomplishments and journeys come to be. Humanity's dreams of peace, community and justice are realized, first, in the simple, basic and small acts of goodness and generosity offered by individuals like you and me. Jesus invites us to embrace the simplicity of "mustard seed" faith: the ability to see the potential in the smallest of things and the courage and perseverance to unlock that potential. He calls us to realize the potential of the Gospel "yeast": to let the grace of God transform the flour and water of our lives into the "bread" of hope, of forgiveness, or justice, of peace.

Matthew 13:24-43 (JB)

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Matthew

Let them grow together until the harvest.

Jesus put a parable before the crowds, 'The kingdom' of heaven may be compared to a man who sowed good seed in his field. While everybody was asleep his enemy came, sowed darnel all among the wheat, and made off. When the new wheat sprouted and ripened, the darnel appeared as well. The owner's servants went to him and said, "Sir, was it not good seed that you sowed in your field? If so, where does the darnel come from?" "Some enemy has done this" he answered. And the servants said, "Do you want us to go and weed it out?" But he said, "No, because when you weed out the darnel you might pull up the wheat with it. Let them both grow till the harvest; and at harvest time I shall say to the reapers: First collect the darnel and tie it in bundles to be burnt, then gather the wheat into my barn."

He put another parable before them, 'The kingdom of heaven is like a mustard seed which a man took and sowed in his field. It is the smallest of all the seeds, but when it has grown it is the biggest shrub of all and becomes a tree so that the birds of the air come and shelter in its branches.'

He told them another parable, 'The kingdom of heaven is like the yeast a woman took and mixed in with three measures of flour till it was leavened all through.'

In all this Jesus spoke to the crowds in parables; indeed he would never speak to them except in parables. This was to fulfil the prophecy: I will speak to you in parables and expound things hidden since the foundation of the world.

Then, leaving the crowds, he went to the house; and his disciples came to him and said, 'Explain the parable about the darnel in the field to us.' He said in reply, 'The sower of the good seed is the Son of Man. The field is the world; the good seed is the subjects of the kingdom; the darnel, the subjects of the evil one; the enemy who sowed them, the devil; the harvest is the end of the world; the reapers are the angels. Well then, just as the darnel is gathered up and burnt in the fire, so it will be at the end of time. The Son of Man will send his angels and they will gather out of his kingdom all things that provoke offences and all who do evil, and throw them into the blazing furnace, where there will be weeping and grinding of teeth. Then the virtuous will shine like the sun in the kingdom of their Father. Listen, anyone who has ears!'
