

Parking at Weekend Masses: A Message of Welcome, Safety, and Courtesy

Dear Parishioners and Visitors,

It is a great blessing to see so many people gathering each weekend to celebrate Mass together at Manly. Whether you are a long-time member of our parish or visiting for the first time, your presence is a gift to our community, and we want you to feel truly welcomed and at home here.

As our numbers grow, we are aware that parking can sometimes be a challenge, especially at the 8:30am and 10:30am Sunday Masses. With this in mind, we would like to gently share a few reminders—rooted in both pastoral care and our shared responsibility for one another's safety.

Keeping It Safe and Accessible

Please do **not double park or block other vehicles**. While it might seem like a quick solution, doing so can seriously hinder access—particularly in emergencies. If an ambulance or emergency service needs to reach someone and the driveway is blocked, it could delay urgent care. For this reason, the driveway must remain completely clear at all times.



Making Use of Nearby Parking

If the parish car park is full, we warmly encourage you to take advantage of the Council car parks, all of which offer 2 hours of free parking:

- **Manly National Carpark** – Central Avenue
- **Pacific Waves Carpark** – Central Avenue
- **Whistler Street Carpark** – Whistler Street

These are just a short walk away and a helpful way to ease congestion here on parish grounds.

For the 8:30am Mass Community

If you are attending the 8:30am Mass, please aim to move your car before 10:15am, especially if you are heading to morning tea or a gathering afterward. This helps free up space for those arriving for the 10:30am Mass.

A Spirit of Hospitality

We never want someone to turn away from Sunday Mass because they could not find a place to park. Let us continue to make our parish a place of welcome and generosity, not only inside the church, but even in the way we share our car park. Every thoughtful decision helps someone else feel at ease and at home.




Sacrament of confession/reconciliation is available in Manly every Saturday from 10am to 11am and Wednesday from 6pm to 7pm.

The Mission of the Lay Faithful
Part 2 - Call for Re-Evangelisation

Last week, we began reflecting more deeply on **the mission of the lay faithful**, particularly on how they are called to **engage in all areas of social, cultural, economic, and political life**, animating these spheres with Christian values. This week, we turn to how the Church envisions this engagement, highlighting some contemporary challenges that require urgent attention.

One of the central themes of **Christifideles Laici** is the call to **"re-evangelisation."** This refers to a **renewed missionary mandate** directed toward countries and societies where Christianity once thrived but where communities of faith now struggle due to the rise of secularism, atheism, and widespread religious indifference. This problem is most acutely felt in developed nations—such as Australia and other Western countries—where materialism and consumerism, often the by-products of wealth and affluence, have led many to live **"as if God did not exist"** (CL, 34).

In this context, re-evangelisation requires the lay faithful to help build **ecclesial communities with a missionary outlook**—actively reaching out to those who no longer believe, or who no longer live out the faith they received at baptism. This begins with a personal commitment by the laity to **ongoing formation and catechesis**, not only for themselves but also for their children. As parents, and by virtue of the sacrament of matrimony, they hold the primary responsibility for educating their children in the faith and Christian life.

However, this task of catechising is not the sole **prerogative of parents but of the whole church community**, due to the fact that parents and guardians often need the support of the whole community in educating and instructing the youth (and each other) in the virtues of faith and religion, especially by those in the community **gifted with the charism of teaching and catechising**. The synod fathers recognised this contribution, affirming that the work of catechists "carries great importance in animating ecclesial communities" (CL, 34).

Another dimension of **re-evangelisation** entrusted to the lay faithful is **fostering positive relationships with people of other religions**—those with whom they work and interact daily in an increasingly pluralistic society. These interactions must be guided by principles of **dialogue rooted in love and mutual respect**, aiming to promote **unity and friendship** among all people (CL, 35). The foundation for this approach lies in the Christian doctrine of the **Imago Dei**—that every human being is created in the image and likeness of God, regardless of race, creed, or ethnicity, and thus possesses **inherent personal dignity** (CSDC, 108; cf. Gn 1:27).

It is this respect for human dignity that obliges the lay faithful to **defend and promote authentic human rights** in every sphere of life, including advocating for the **religious dimension of the human person** and ensuring that all people are free to **exercise their faith** in society without fear or coercion (CL, 38).

The group meets on **Thursday evenings at 7:00pm** at **St Mary's Parish Office**.





First Reading

Genesis 18:1-10 (JB)

A reading from the book of Genesis

Lord, do not bypass your servant.

The Lord appeared to Abraham at the Oak of Mamre while he was sitting by the entrance of the tent during the hottest part of the day. He looked up, and there he saw three men standing near him. As soon as he saw them he ran from the entrance of the tent to meet them, and bowed to the ground. 'My Lord,' he said 'I beg you, if I find favour with you, kindly do not pass your servant by. A little water shall be brought; you shall wash your feet and lie down under the tree. Let me fetch a little bread and you shall refresh yourselves before going further. That is why you have come in your servant's direction.' They replied, 'Do as you say.'

Abraham hastened to the tent to find Sarah. 'Hurry,' he said 'knead three bushels of flour and make loaves.' Then running to the cattle Abraham took a fine and tender calf and gave it to the servant, who hurried to prepare it. But the Lord answered: 'Martha, Martha,' he said, 'you worry and fret about so many things, and yet few are needed, indeed only one. It is Mary who has chosen the better part; it is not to be taken from her.'

Gospel Reflection

We are all like Martha in our own anxiety over making all the pieces fit; we obsess about the details and peripherals at the expense of the important and lasting. "The better part" embraced by Mary transcends the pragmatic and practical concerns of the everyday and sees the hand of God in all things; the "better part" is to realize

the gratitude all of creation owes its loving Creator for the gift of life.

With so many agendas demanding our time and attention, Jesus calls us to consciously choose and seek out "the better part": to make a place in our lives for the joy and love of family and friends that is the presence of God.

It is a motto of Benedictine monasteries around the world: "Let all be received here as would Christ" (**The Rule of St. Benedict**, chapter 53). Like Abraham's welcome of the three strangers (today's first reading from Genesis 18) and the welcome Martha, Mary and Lazarus extend to Jesus in Bethany, hospitality is not only a holy responsibility but also a joyful opportunity to welcome and serve Jesus in the persons those who come to our tables.
