Our readings this week invite us to open our hearts to Christ, our welcome guest. May he increase our faith and our love, so that we may see him amongst us as our friend.

In the reading from Genesis, Abraham gives us the wonderful example of Bedouin hospitality. Nothing is too good for the stranger, and Abraham does not hesitate to offer comfort and food because he recognises God in them. God rewards him with the promise of a son.

The Gospel story of Martha, Mary and their brother Lazarus were close friends of Jesus and welcomed him into their home where they receive from him as well as serve him. Jesus again shows that his message of God's Kingdom is for everyone as he invites Mary and Martha to listen and share the good news.

Mary 'sat and listened'. This was the usual posture of a disciple of any teacher in the ancient world. But listening to the Torah was the right of men only, so Mary was quietly breaking the rule that reserved study for males, not females. Her sister Martha was not merely asking for help. She was demanding that Mary knew her place in the culture and keep to the traditional way of behaving.

Jesus ignored the traditional role of women and was encouraging Mary to listen and learn. He upheld her right to think about ideas, and to develop her mind. She should not be limited to the tasks that society laid down for her, but be allowed access to ideas, as Jewish men were.

Jesus always encouraged the idea of service among his followers, so he did not say that Martha's role of service was unimportant. This would have gone against all his other teaching. What he did say was that being a disciple, and learning about the ideas he was explaining, was even more important. He accepts women as full table companions – they can sit with him and talk with him. This was, not something that was at all usual in the ancient world.

Jesus reminds his followers that if we want to serve him, we must first listen to him — we need to be people of prayer before we can be people of action. Pathways to God | women in the bible.net 2019

A desire was expressed for stronger prayer and sacramental life and more effective outreach to those who seek healing, as a renewed openness to and sign of God's mercy.

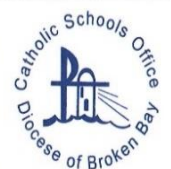

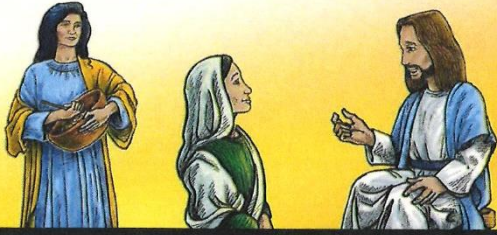

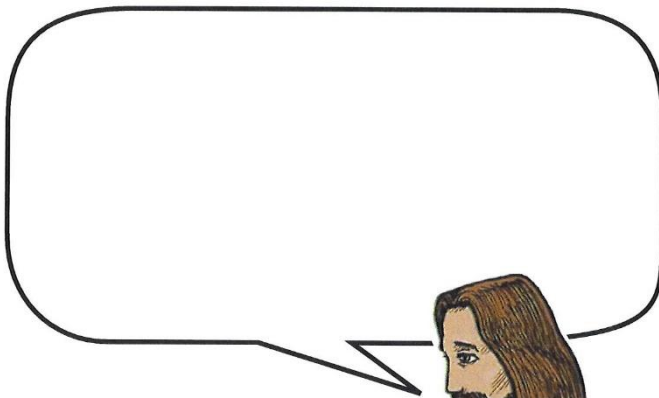

First Reading *Genesis 18:1-10 (JB)*

A reading from the book of Genesis

Lord, do not bypass your servant.

The Lord appeared to Abraham at the Oak of Mamre while he was sitting by the entrance of the tent during the hottest part of the day. He looked up, and there he saw three men standing near him. As soon as he saw them he ran from the entrance of the tent to meet them, and bowed to the ground. 'My Lord,' he said 'I beg you, if I find favour with you, kindly do not pass your servant by. A little water shall be brought; you shall wash your feet and lie down under the tree. Let me fetch a little bread and you shall refresh yourselves before going further. That is why you have come in your servant's direction.' They replied, 'Do as you say.'

Abraham hastened to the tent to find Sarah. 'Hurry,' he said 'knead three bushels of flour and make loaves.' Then running to the cattle Abraham took a fine and tender calf and gave it to the servant, who hurried to prepare it. Then taking cream, milk and the calf he had prepared, he laid all before them, and they ate while he remained standing near them under the tree.

'Where is your wife Sarah?' he asked him. 'She is in the tent' he replied. Then his guest said, 'I shall visit you again next year without fail, and your wife will then have a son.'
