## ODeax Triends,

Greetings and good health. Just as we were getting used to having more people at Mass on Sundays the NSW Government has had to reimpose a limit of 100 persons who can attend Churches at one time. I do not expect that this should be a huge problem for our parish community. We want you to continue coming to Mass on the weekends; you do not have to ring and book.

Currently the 6pm Saturday Vigil Mass at Manly and the Freshwater Masses (Vigil 5pm and 9am Sunday) have plenty of spare seats. Some of you may wish to consider attending one of these Masses instead of your usual time. No need to book in, just give your name and phone number to the Welcomer please.
I must emphasis the need for all of us to observe Government health requirements; social distancing, hand sanitizing and assist with the wiping of the seats after Mass. You will notice new automatic hand sanitisers at the Church entrances, please make use of these as you enter and exit the Church. If you are feeling unwell in anyway, please stay at home. We will continue with our Sunday Mass live streaming of the 8.30am Mass.

We are now able to offer live music at all our Masses at Manly and at the 9am Mass at Freshwater. We are still working on music for the 5pm Vigil Mass.

Because of the above-mentioned restrictions, we have regrettably decided to postpone the Holy Communion Program until Term 4, 2020. Fr David Taylor

Reflection - The first two parables in today's Gospel the parables of the buried treasure and the pearl - are lessons in the total attachment to Christ and detachment from the things of the world demanded of the disciple in order to make the reign of God a reality.
The parable of the dragnet is similar in theme to last week's parable of the wheat and weeds. Again, Matthew makes the point that the kingdom of God is neither an instant happening nor a static event, but a dynamic movement toward completion and fulfillment which Jesus set into motion.

The "treasures" and "pearls" of lasting value are the things of God: the love of family and friends, the support of
 community, the sense of fulfillment from serving and giving for the sake of others. In order to attain such treasure, we must take the risk of the speculator and "sell off" our own interests, ambitions and agendas in order to free ourselves to embrace the lasting values of the compassion, love and reconciliation of God.
The Gospel "pearl" of great price transcends logic, efficiency, and self-interest; and the Gospel "treasure" is the joy and wholeness one experiences in imitating the humble compassion and forgiveness of Christ.
In the parable of the dragnet, Jesus calls us to embrace the vision of God that seeks out the good and nurturing, the right and just in all things amid the "junk" of life. Connections/Mediaworks

REFLECTION...As Ordinary Time continues, we are still in the central part of Matthew's Gospel where Jesus is teaching by means of parables. Today we have four more parables to add to the four already heard over the last couple of Sundays. These parables stress in particular the great value of the kingdom.
In the First Reading we have the narrative of the young king Solomon asking God for the gift of wisdom, so as to discern the true value of things and rule his people with understanding.
The verses taken from the Psalm extol the value of God's law, a treasure that brings true happiness.
St Paul, in the Second Reading, reveals the mutuality between the faithful follower and the generosity of the Father, who will justify and glorify those he has called.
In the Gospel the kingdom of heaven is likened to finding a treasure and selling everything to possess it. Good and bad coexist until the time of final judgment.
Maybe this week we can pray for the grace to recognize the kingdom amongst us and around us.

Bishop of Broken Bay Message - 21 July 2020 My dear brothers and sisters in Christ

This image of the Penitent Magdalene painted in 15941595 by the Italian Master, Caravaggio, is worth contemplating as we celebrate the Feast of Saint Mary Magdalene, the Apostle to the Apostles, on Wednesday this week.

Caravaggio was not the first artist to depict Mary Magdalene in this manner. He makes the assumption that the woman in Luke's Gospel who washes Jesus' feet with her tears and dries them with her hair is Mary of Mandala (Luke 7:36-50). In the painting, we can see a glass bottle of oil representing the alabaster jar of perfume with which she anointed Christ's feet. Scattered on the floor next to Mary we can also see gold, pearls, and jewels that are symbols of earthly gain. Whatever the background of Mary Magdalene, what calls out to us for contemplation is not so much her past life but rather that, as the reading from the Song of Songs suggests, she found whom her heart loves (Song of Songs 3:1-4).
Only after having found Jesus in her life was Mary Magdalene able to bear witness to God's mercy and love. Traditionally this has been depicted, as this picture by Caravaggio suggests, as a penitent fallen woman. However, there is something much deeper here for our thought, and it can be found in the passage from John's Gospel (John 20:1-2, 11-18).
Having known Jesus in both life and death, Mary seeks the fullness of knowledge in his resurrection. There are two levels at which she seeks. The first is the most obvious and we would probably sum it up as the paschal mystery - the life, death, and resurrection of Christ.
However, the second is far more subtle, in that by faith, Mary demonstrates the real presence of Jesus in her own life. That is, through her living with Christ and her dying to sin, a new life is possible.
Through her belief in the risen Christ, the Paschal mystery is enacted in her life. This Good News then impelled her to go and tell the Apostles that the Lord is indeed alive! Because of this, we know her as the Apostle to the Apostles.
Each one of us, like Mary Magdalene, is invited to seek Christ in faith. Life in Christ will bring death to sin. Life in Christ is not just to be hoped for; it is something to be enacted now. Christ changes our hearts by making his home within us.
My sisters and brothers, this week be inspired by the life of Saint Mary Magdalene and by the words from the Song of Songs, to seek him whom my heart loves. Moreover, having found that love go and tell others that the Lord is indeed alive!

This is the Good News for each of us.

## Changes to the Sacramental Program

Last week Parishes in the Diocese received a letter from Bishop Anthony regarding the changes to the Sacramental Program and especially to the celebration of Confirmation in 2020 in light of the Covid 19 restrictions.
Bishop Anthony advised that having considered the matter fully and subsequent to his discussions last week with the Council of Priest he wishes to bring to you the following forward:

1. He is committed to the order of the Sacraments of Initiation being Baptism - Confirmation Eucharist.
2. As Bishop he is the ordinary minister of the Sacrament of Confirmation and does not wish this to be compromised by widespread delegation of the faculty.
3. Given the uncertainly of how restrictions for gatherings may be eased in the future and given the constrains of time before November after which it would not be desirable to celebrate the Sacrament, he will not celebrate the Sacrament of Confirmation at all for 2020.
4. Feedback that Bishop Anthony has received about the celebration of Confirmation indicates to him that the practice of celebrating it with those who reached the age of 7 (typically those in Year 2 of school) is too early for a truly meaningful reception of the Sacrament.
Therefore, He wishes to use the circumstance afforded us negatively, the pandemic, to place our practice of Sacramental preparation, positively, on a new footing going forward.
5. This will result in Confirmation in the future ordinarily being celebrated with those who have reached the age of 8, and who are typically in Year 3. Reconciliation and Eucharist will therefore be celebrated with those who are aged 9 and are in Year 4.
6. Consequently, through 2021 - 2022, the foundation of a programme of Sacramental Preparation for children who are 8 and older will have been established across all parishes in the Diocese
Bishop Anthony regards this as the best and most sustainable way forward to address both the suspension of the celebration of Confirmation for the rest of this year, and engage the unique opportunity with which we are now presented to bring the Sacramental Preparation Programme into the future on a different footing for children who are older and more able to appreciate the significance of their Christian Initiation.

## 17th Sunday in Ordinary Time - 26th July 2020

## First Reading

1 Kings 3:5, 7-12 (JB)
A reading from the first book of the Kings You have asked for wisdom.

The Lord appeared to Solomon in a dream and said, 'Ask what you would like me to give you.' Solomon replied, 'Lord, my God, you have made your servant king in succession to David my father. But I am a very young man, unskilled in leadership. Your servant finds himself in the midst of this people of yours that you have chosen, a people so many its numbers cannot be counted or reckoned. Give your servant a heart to understand how to discern between good and evil, for who could govern this people of yours that is so great?' It pleased the Lord that Solomon should have asked for this. 'Since you have asked for this' the Lord said 'and not asked for long life for yourself or riches or the lives of your enemies, but have asked for a discerning judgement for yourself, here and now I do what you ask. I give you a heart wise and shrewd as none before you has had and none will have after you.'
