Gospel Reflection In today's reading from Luke's Gospel, the disciples ask Jesus to teach them how to pray. What is important to grasp is not the words of the prayer (Luke's version of The Lord's Prayer is shorter and more concise than Matthew's version), but the attitude of prayer Jesus teaches. To pray is not to impose our will on God but to ask God to make us open to his will; in other words, we pray not to change God's mind but for God to change ours.

Authentic prayer, as taught by Jesus and contained in the Lord's Prayer, has three elements:

acknowledging the goodness and love of God: Jesus teaches us to call God "Father." God is not the cosmic tyrant out of whom gifts have to be extracted through humiliating pleading; God is the loving eternal Parent who delights in providing for his children's needs.

asking that we may do God's will: Prayer worthy of God asks for the grace to do the work he calls us to do (forgiveness, reconciliation, justice), to become the people he calls us to become (brothers and sisters under our heavenly Father).

voicing our hope in the providence of God: We come before God knowing that, just as parents will provide for their children a good friend will aid another friend, God will hear our prayers and provide us with what we need. Even if it seems as if our prayers are unanswered, we live with the confident faith that the God hears and responds in ways that assure us of his presence in our lives. *Connectionmediaworks.com*

The Mission of the Lay Faithful Part 3 - Solidarity and the Common Good

We continue our study of the vocation and mission of the lay faithful in the Church and the world. In the past two weeks, we have explored the distinctly secular character of the laity, who are called to bring Christ's message of salvation into the social, economic, cultural, and political spheres. We also examined the nature of this engagement, beginning with the call for a reevangelisation of once-Christian societies. This renewal starts with a strong commitment to catechesis for all members of the ecclesial community, and the need for a missionary outlook that seeks to animate all personal and public activity with the values of the Gospel. This week, we will explore two more foundational principles: Solidarity and the Common Good.

Solidarity emphasises the **interdependence** of all members of society, and the **moral obligation** that we all have in standing with each other to promote **unity and shared responsibility**, especially with the poor and marginalised (CSDC, 192). In this sense, Solidarity is one of the fundamental principles defining the nature of lay participation in public life. Its aim is to highlight the fact that achieving **true human development** means ensuring the **Common Good** of all. **The Common Good** refers to the **social conditions** that allows everyone person and community to **flourish** and reach their **full potential**.

Without solidarity and a commitment to the common good, individuals, particularly the poor and marginalised, are left **exposed to injustice and exploitation.** These may take form political ideologies, economic injustices, unequal access to educational opportunities, or the many other systems that fail to recognise and respect the **inviolable dignity of the human person** as created in the Image of God (*Imago Dei*), and which obstruct human development and flourishing (CL, 5).

As disciples of Christ, the lay faithful cannot remain indifferent to any forms of injustice, but are called to collaborate with all men and women of good who seek to justice and peace. This requires confronting the many forms of injustice gripping our world, whether locally and internationally — including violence and war, torture and terrorism, the arms race, and the many the many other attacks on human dignity. Working to promote peace and solidarity can be achieved by an education that aims to defeat the dominant culture of egoism, hate and hostility, and which calls for a continual conversion of heart, and the pursuit of justice and charity (CL, 42; cf. *Sollicitudo Rei Socialis,* 39).


All peoples, regardless of their background, share a common **dignity**, **unity** and **equality** (CSDC, 164). Therefore, promoting solidarity in pursuit of the common good calls the lay faithful to actively participate in public life — whether as individual citizens or as members of groups and organisations whose aim is the promotion of the **common good**. This includes everything from labour unions, political parties, to local and international organisations dedicated to the promotion of **justice**, **peace and charity**.

May **Our Lady of Charity** and **Queen of Peace** inspire and strengthen the lay faithful to stand in solidarity with all peoples, and to actively work for the common in our society and the world. Amen. *Alfred Soliman Seminarian*

Parking at Weekend Masses: A Message of Welcome, Safety, and Courtesy

Dear Parishioners and Visitors,

It is a great blessing to see so many people gathering each weekend to celebrate Mass together at Manly. Whether you are a long-time member of our parish or visiting for the first time, your presence is a gift to our community, and we want you to feel truly welcomed and at home here.

As our numbers grow, we are aware that parking can sometimes be a challenge, especially at the 8:30am and 10:30am Sunday Masses. With this in mind, we would like to gently share a few reminders—rooted in both pastoral care and our shared responsibility for one another's safety.

Keeping It Safe and Accessible

Please do **not double park or block other vehicles**. While it might seem like a quick solution, doing so can seriously hinder access—particularly in emergencies. If an ambulance or emergency service needs to reach someone and the driveway is blocked, it could delay urgent care. For this reason, the driveway must remain completely clear at all times.

Making Use of Nearby Parking

If the parish car park is full, we warmly encourage you to take advantage of the Council car parks, all of which offer 2 hours of free parking:

• Manly National Carpark – Central Avenue

- Pacific Waves Carpark Central Avenue
- Whistler Street Carpark Whistler Street

These are just a short walk away and a helpful way to ease congestion here on parish grounds.

For the 8:30am Mass Community

If you are attending the 8:30am Mass, please aim to move your car before 10:15am, especially if you are heading to morning tea or a gathering afterward. This helps free up space for those arriving for the 10:30am Mass.

A Spirit of Hospitality

We never want someone to turn away from Sunday Mass because they could not find a place to park. Let us continue to make our parish a place of welcome and generosity, not only inside the church, but even in the way we share our car park. Every thoughtful decision helps someone else feel at ease and at home.

Lord, do not be angry if I speak.

For the one who asks always receives; the one who searches always finds; the one who knocks will always have the door opened to him. what father among you would hand his son a stone when he asked for bread? Or hand him a snake instead of a fish? Or hand him a scorpion if he asked for an egg? If you then, who are evil, know how to give your children what is good, how much more will the heavenly Father give the Holy Spirit to those who ask him!'
