

#### St John Mary Vianney Feast Day - 4 August (1786 - 1859)




Known as the Cure d'Ars, is the patron saint of parish priests. Born in France during the turbulence of the French Revolution, he faced great struggles in his studies due to limited academic ability. However, his deep love for Jesus and unwavering perseverance led to his ordination in 1815.

Assigned to the small, spiritually lazy village of Ars, Fr Vianney transformed the whole town through his profound holiness, tireless preaching, and deep devotion to the Eucharist and Our Lady. He became renowned for his ability to read hearts, offer wise counsel, and administer hearing confessions for up to 16 hours a day!

His life of prayer, penance, and simplicity inspired countless conversions. His incorrupt (miraculously spared from decay) heart remains a sign of his enduring love of God. As patron of priests, his intercession continues to support vocations and clergy worldwide. **St John Vianney, Pray For Us!**

#### The Mission of the Lay Faithful Part 4 - Work and Labour

So far, we've touched on a number of themes on the vocation and mission of the

lay faithful, including on their secular character and spirituality; their mission to engage in the social, economic, cultural and political spheres; and on the themes of solidarity with all peoples based on the truth that every human being is created in the image of God. This week we will explore themes around work and labour.

The Church teaches that work is a fundamental dimension of human existence (Laborem Exercens, 4). As such, work is **both a duty and a right**, and it is the means by which human beings are called to collaborate with God in honouring the gifts and talents that He has inscribed in our nature, for our benefit and for the benefit of others, and the development of society (Gaudium et Spes, 67).

Human work is a good thing! It precedes the fall of Adam and Eve, which means it is not a punishment or curse, but has since become toilsome because of original sin (cf. Gen 4:12). Nevertheless, God's original plan for human beings has not changed. We are still called to cultivate and care for creation, bringing it to perfection (cf. Gen 3:17,19; CSDC, 256). Indeed, God works, and is still working, and rests on the seventh day (cf. Gen 2:2-3; Jn 5:17). And during His earthly ministry Jesus spent most of His life in manual work, even in His parables rebuking those who hide their talents in the ground instead of being faithful stewards of the gifts entrusted to them (cf. Mt 25:14-30; 24:46). Through His own work in Nazareth prior to His public ministry, Jesus dignifies and ennobles human labour (Gaudium et Spes, 67). In this way also, human work actually becomes a participation in Jesus Christ's work of redemption when it is performed with diligence, honesty and a with Christian Spirit, it can be offered to God in the same way that Jesus offered His work to the Father for the salvation of all (CL,

The lay faithful are also called to be mindful of the many challenges to do with work, including the problem of unemployment or underemployment through precarious or unjust contractual agreements; the dehumanisation of work, where workers are treated merely as a means of production and neglecting their dignity and human value; exploitation of workers, including migrant workers and child labour, through inadequate wages, lack of benefits, etc; denial of the right of workers to unionise and engage in collective bargaining and in decision making processes; a disregard for work-life balance that affects family and social life; exclusion or discrimination in the workplace based on individual's gender, identity or background; technology that marginalises workers and does not serve the common good; etc (CSDC, 255-322).

Next week we will look at what the Church teaches regarding economic principles, and the role that businesses and government policies have in creating just economic systems.

May St Joseph, patron of workers (Feast on 1 May) inspire us to serve others through our work as he so faithfully served and provided for Jesus and Mary whilst under his care. Amen. Alfred Soliman Seminarian


The group is informal and begins with conversation, a short reflection from Fr Sam, and time for open questions. It's the first step before the formal RCIA program kicks off in September.

A reading from the book of Ecclesiastes

What do people gain by all their work?

Vanity of vanities, the Preacher says. Vanity of vanities. All is vanity!

For so it is that a man who has laboured wisely, skilfully and successfully must leave what is his own to someone who has not toiled for it at all. This, too, is vanity and great injustice; for what does he gain for all the toil and strain that he has undergone under the sun? What of all his laborious days, his cares of office, his restless nights? This, too, is vanity.

#### **Second Reading** Colossians 3:1-5, 9-11 (JB)

A reading from the letter of St Paul to Colossians Seek the things that are above where Christ is.

Since you have been brought back to true life with Christ, you must look for the things that are in heaven, where Christ is, sitting at God's right hand. Let your thoughts be on heavenly things, not on the things that are on the earth, because you have died, and now the life you have is hidden with Christ in God. But when Christ is revealed - and he is your life - you too will be revealed in all your glory with him.

That is why you must kill everything in you that belongs only to earthly life: fornication, impurity, guilty passion, evil desires and especially greed, which is the same thing as worshipping a false god; and never tell each other lies. You have stripped off your old behaviour with your old self, and you have put on a new self which will progress towards true knowledge the more it is renewed in the image of its creator; and, in that image there is no room for distinction between Greek and Jew, between the circumcised or the uncircumcised, or between barbarian and Scythian, slave and free man. There is only Christ: he is everything and he is in everything.

Luke 12:13-21 (JB)


A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke *To whom will all this wealth of yours go?* 

A man in the crowd said to. Jesus, 'Master, tell my brother to give me a share of our inheritance.' 'My friend,' he replied 'who appointed me your judge, or the arbitrator of your claims?' Then he said to them, 'Watch, and be on your guard against avarice of any kind, for a man's life is not made secure by what he owns, even when he has more than he needs.'

Then he told them a parable: 'There was once a rich man who, having a good harvest from his land, thought to himself, "What am I to, do? I have not enough room to store my crops." Then he said, "This is what I will do: I will pull down my barns and build bigger ones, and store all my grain and my goods in them, and I will say, to my soul: 'My soul, you have plenty of good things laid by for many years to come; take things easy, eat, drink, have a good time." But God said to him, "Fool! This very night the demand will be made for your soul; and this hoard of yours, whose will it be then?" So it is when a man stores up treasure for himself in place of making himself rich in the sight of God.'

## GOSPEL REFLECTION

Rabbis were often asked to arbitrate conflicts within families and communities. In today's Gospel, Jesus has been

approached to settle such an argument over an inheritance. Jesus responds not by taking sides but by addressing the greed that has brought both sides to near blows. He tells the parable of the rich man who, in the midst of his good fortune, loses his sense of what is really important. Possessions create the illusion that we can control our lives; the drive for gain makes us oblivious to the needs and dreams of others. The "foolish" rich man in today's Gospel sadly discovers that wealth in the reign of God has nothing to do with stock portfolios, bank accounts or the social register. *connectionsmediaworks.com*
