This Sunday's Gospel -The beginning of the Christian year begins at the end of time: the promised return of Christ at the end of time. In this brief

Gospel parable of the master's return, Jesus articulates the Advent themes of waiting, watchfulness and readiness. Jesus calls us to realize our responsibilities in the present as we dare to look forward to the promise of the future.

Advent is a call to pay attention: to pay attention to the voice of God, the hand of God, the love of God in every joy and sorrow, in every pain and trauma, in every victory and setback before us. Jesus urges us to "watch" this Advent to behold the beauty and wonder and grace of God's presence in every moment of our lives.

The coming of Christ and his presence among us – as **one** of us – give us reason to live in hope: that light will shatter the darkness, that we can be liberated from our fears and prejudices, that we are never alone or abandoned by our merciful Father in heaven.

Advent confronts us with the preciousness and limits of time: that our lives are an Advent, a prelude, to the life of God to come. While confronting us with the reality that our lives and finite and fragile, these Sundays of Advent also assure us of the mercy of God, who is with us amid all the struggles and challenges of our everyday Advent journey to the dwelling place of God.

SCRIPTURE REFLECTION

As we begin another liturgical year, we focus on the coming of Christ.

We wait for his coming in our own lives; we wait for his coming at

Christmas; and we await his second coming.

In the **First Reading**, the exiles, freshly returned from Babylon, plead with God to return to them to help them rebuild their land. They are weary with waiting for him.

The **Psalm** too pleads with God, 'the shepherd of Israel', to come once again to help, protect and show his power.

In the opening words of his letter to the Corinthians, Paul thanks God for all the graces they have received. He is confident that God will keep them faithful while they wait for the Lord Jesus Christ to be fully revealed (**Second Reading**).

In the **Gospel**, Jesus clearly warns his disciples to stay awake, to be on their guard, to be like the doorkeeper ... ever alert, because he does not know when his master will return. Let us enter this new season with confidence, knowing that the Lord will give us, and our world, the graces we need, because 'God is faithful'. *Pathways to God 2020*

We really appreciate all the support that you have given our conferences over the years. Please keep all the needy families in your prayers.

We are so very thankful for your generosity in our Mid-Winter Appeal where donations in both Churches amounted to \$6,070. Earlier in the year the Australian Catholic Bishops' Bushfire Appeal conducted by the Society realised \$25.2 million across Australia. At this time \$19.1 million has been distributed to over 7,000 needy and effected families and individuals with the remaining \$6.1 million being committed to recovery and rebuilding over the next six months. With Government assistance expected and indeed forecasted to drop to the former Newstart Allowance leaving individuals only \$40 to live on, we can expect a lot more local requests for assistance and your kindness, generosity and support is appreciated.

BISHOP'S MESSAGE



Most Rev Anthony Randazzo Bishop of Broken Bay 24 November 2020 My dear sisters and brothers in Christ, Today, in our liturgical calendar, we

Today, in our liturgical calendar, we remember St. Andrew Dung-Lac and Companions. In 1988, Pope John Paul II canonised 117 martyrs who had died

for the faith at various times in Vietnam. It is a rather remarkable group of the faithful. Of the 117 people, 96 were Vietnamese, 11 were Spaniards, and 10 were French. Apart from the variety of nationalities, this group of martyrs comprised eight bishops, 50 priests, and 59 of Christ's lay faithful. There was also one seminarian.

I am constantly reminded by this commemoration that testimony to the faith is part and parcel to the Christian vocation. The ultimate testimony is to shed one's blood. In John's Gospel, Jesus lays out the pattern for discipleship, "This is my commandment, that you love one another as I have loved you. No one has greater love than this, to lay down one's life for one's friends. You are my friends if you do what I command you." (John 15:12-14) Saint Andrew Dung-Lac and the Vietnamese martyrs are a marvellous example of putting the words of Jesus into action.

Throughout our community of the Church, there are many Catholics, from Vietnam, and from other nations around the world where the freedom of Religion is under threat. Many individuals and families have suffered and have living memory of those sufferings, and yet they continue to make a vital contribution to the mission of the Church in our local community. Suffering is always a challenge, and yet these martyrs encourage us not to be engulfed by the burden of pain or hopelessness. Their example of faith is the encouragement that I believe we need in uncertain times.

This week, I would like to offer a word of gratitude to the many people in our community of the Church, who, despite their suffering offer us encouragement and hope. Martyrdom can be lived in so many ways, through many little deaths in life. Ultimately our faith helps make sense of them, and with a sense of hope in Jesus, each one of us can be inspired to offer our lives in testimony to the Good News of Jesus Christ.

We take inspiration from Saint Andrew Dung-Lac and Companions, my brothers and sisters, so that we may never lose hope.

First Reading *Isaiah* 63:16-17; 64:1,3-8 (JB)

A reading from the prophet Isaiah

Oh that you would tear the heavens apart and come down.

You, Lord, yourself are our Father, Our Redeemer is your ancient name. Why, Lord, leave us to stray from your ways and harden our hearts against fearing you? Return, for the sake of your servants, the tribes of your inheritance. Oh, that you would tear the heavens open and come down - at your Presence the mountains would melt. No ear has heard, no eye has seen any god but you act like this for those who trust him. You guide those who act with integrity and keep your ways in mind.
