GOSPEL REFLECTION

When Luke wrote these few lines of his Gospel, Christians were living through difficult times and circumstances. In

many places they were treated with ridicule, disdain and intolerance. Jesus' words are addressed to them and to all Christians who have paid dearly for living their faith in their time and place.

Fire is a Scriptural symbol of judgment. The Lord will judge the hearts of all men and women in the light of the Gospel's "blaze."

The word used in the original text that reads here as baptism actually means a "plunging," a total submersion. Jesus continues on to Jerusalem where he will be "plunged" into the Passover of the new covenant into which, through baptism, we will all be "plunged," as well.

The Gospel is not a soft, easy message to embrace. Jesus does not sugarcoat his message: Families and households will be divided over the hard demands of the Gospel of reconciliation, justice and servanthood.

SPIRITUAL CONVERSATIONS GROUP


Do you know someone thinking about becoming Catholic?

The Mission of the Lay Faithful Part 6 - Safeguarding the Environment

This week's theme is on safeguarding the environment. Creation is the beautiful work of God, pointing to His existence, and serving as a source of praise for His beauty, providence and wisdom (cf. Ps 104). Creation is also a gift to humanity — whom God created in His own image and entrusted with dominion over His works (Gen 1:26-30). This "dominion" is not to be understood as licence to exploit, responsibility rather. sacred as а stewardship (CSDC, 452). Christians are called to govern the world with justice and holiness, recognising that all creation is included in Christ's work of salvation, and destined for transformation into "a new heaven and a new earth" (Rev 21:1; Rom 8:19-23; cf. CSDC, 455).

God has created human beings with intellect and moral responsibility, so that we might become **cooperators with Him in the work of transforming the world**. To transform means to be able to **foster the development of nature** in a way that God has intended. God wills that humans **protect and act with care and responsibility** towards nature. The environment is created **for the benefit of all humanity**, both **present and future generations**. As such, our use of natural resources — whether animals, plants and natural elements — must not jeopardise the ability of future generations from being able to meet their own needs (*Sollicitudo Rei Socialis*, 34).

In practice, this means a commitment to sustainable living, recognising that whilst some natural resources are renewable others are finite. It also means being mindful of how we consume goods in an economy that encourages the maximisation of profits above all else (CSDC, 470). For example, the temptations of consumerism and a "throwaway culture" which are described by Pope Francis as spiritual and moral crises, can affect our relationship with God's creation. They promote excess, greed, materialism and individualism which distorts our human identity in that it makes us value having things rather than realising our human dignity as created in God's image — which does not depend on what we have or own. It also reduces all things, including people, to disposable commodities (Laudato Si, 22; Centesimus Annus, 36). Indeed, as Pope Francis notes, "Obsession with a consumerist lifestyle can only lead to violence and mutual destruction" (LS, 204); and "living our vocation to be protectors of God's handiwork is essential to a life of virtue" (LSi, 217).

In response, Christians are called to an **ecological conversion**, a change of heart and attitude towards material things, and to **adopt new lifestyles** that shapes our consumer and investment choices (*CA*, 36). This involves practicing the virtues of **sobriety**, **simplicity** and **gratitude**, and learning to live and consume within the **natural limits of the earth**, respecting the **rhythms and order of nature**; and recognising the profound **interdependence among all living beings**. Such an awareness fosters a commitment towards **the common good**, and ensuring that everyone's needs are met whilst not exhausting nature's capacity to maintain and regenerate itself (CSDC, 486).

May our Lady, Pinnacle of God's creation, and St Francis patron of ecology, inspire us with a deep love of God's creation, and to protect and care for it for the benefit of all. Amen.



First Reading

Jeremiah 38:4-6, 8-10 (JB)

A reading from the prophet Jeremiah

You bore me to be a man of strife for the whole world.

The king's leading men spoke to the king. 'Let Jeremiah be put to death: he is unquestionably disheartening the remaining soldiers in the city, and all the people too, by talking like this. The fellow does not have the welfare of this people at heart so much as its ruin.' 'He is in your hands as you know,' King Zedekiah answered 'for the king is powerless against you.' So they took Jeremiah and threw him into the well of Prince Malchiah in the Court of the Guard, letting him down with ropes. There was no water in the well, only mud, and into the mud Jeremiah sank.

Ebed-melech came out from the palace and spoke to the king. 'My lord king,' he said, 'these men have done a wicked thing by treating the prophet Jeremiah like this: they have thrown him into the well where he will die.' At this the king gave Ebed-melech the Cushite the following order: 'Take three men with you from here and pull the prophet Jeremiah out of the well before he dies.'


I have come not to give peace, but discord.
