# MANLY FRESHWATER PARISH Mary Immaculate, Manly and St John the Baptist, Freshwater

20th Sunday in Ordinary Time 18th August 2019



Today's readings help raise our morale in the fight against evil. Jesus Christ, who came to bring fire on earth, gives us courage and hope to persevere in challenging times.

In the First Reading, Jeremiah advises the authorities to surrender to the Babylonians and put their trust in God. This unpopular message stirs the leaders, who try to kill him. In the persecution he suffers for speaking out so fearlessly, he foreshadows Christ himself. The Psalm is a song of confidence and makes much of personal trust in God, the One who comes to our aid.

The Second Reading is a stirring appeal to a Christian community to persevere on their road of faith. The author argues that the witness of all those who have gone before them, as well as the example of Christ himself, means there is no reason to lose heart.

In the Gospel, Jesus shows that he came to bring fire on the earth. His fire is the warmth of love and companionship: when we know we can go to him just as we are, and enjoy the intimacy of his friendship – the friend who is always offering the gift of his heart to each of us.

The warmth of Jesus brings comfort and hope to the world when we live in isolation from each other, lack of friendship and hope. When we lack the reconciliation and justice that makes life possible among us, then the warmth of God's love for all can inflame our coldness.

Jesus is also the fire that disturbs; love challenges as well as comforts. The flame of God can be frightening in that it demands a world of justice, peace and reconciliation. The fire of this love is the fire that also warms and comforts. The flame of God is the Holy Spirit. Jesus comes to bring all sorts of fire to the world, and to send the Spirit of comfort, justice, reconciliation and hope. The message of Jesus may divide us, and if it does, the love of Jesus can unite us, for love is the most powerful gift of Jesus. Pathways to God | Donal Neary sj 2019



## Reproductive Health Care Reform Bill 2019

A bill to make abortion legal in NSW up until birth, for any reason, has been tabled in NSW Parliament. Archbishop Anthony Fisher has asked all Catholics in NSW to urgently contact their state Member of Parliament and ask them to vote against this bill.

PETITIONS to reject the Reproductive Health Care Reform Bill 2019 when it comes before the House to be voted on are available at the entrances at both churches.

**From Archbishop Anthony Fisher -** As you would know, the bill to legalise abortion up until birth, with very few safeguards for mothers or children, passed the Legislative Assembly last night. It now moves to an inquiry before a vote in the Upper House.

To that end, a petition is being organised to ask Upper House members to vote against the bill.

I have asked that the petition be available for parishioners to sign at Masses over the next two weekends and returned promptly to the Archdiocese and in any event, by no later than **Tuesday**, **20 August 2019** so that petitions can be collated, counted and presented to the Legislative Council. Our Life, Family and Outreach team will be helping to co-ordinate volunteers to assist in parishes. ## Submission to the NSW Upper House Committee

The NSW Standing Committee on Social Issues have announced that there will be holding an Inquiry into the Bill. Submissions can be made until 5pm on Tuesday 13<sup>th</sup> August. The Committee is holding public hearings next week on Wednesday 14 and Thursday 15 August and is due to report by Tuesday, 20 August 2019.

I will be making a submission and would like to ask you all to consider signing on in order for the Bishops of NSW to make a joint submission similar to what the Queensland Province did when they faced this matter last year. I will circulate a draft of the submission as soon as it is completed (we are still awaiting the final terms of reference for the inquiry).

I ask you also to continue to pray that the bill will be defeated, and that a civilisation of life and love will prevail.

- Ephpheta Centre serving the Catholic deaf community.



OF **IMMACULATE** MONTH THE HEART OF MARY The Church dedicates the month of August to the Immaculate Heart of Mary. It is a dogma of the Catholic faith that Mary is the Immaculate Conception; that is, in preparation for the Incarnation of the Second Person of the Holy Trinity in her womb, she was conceived without the corruption of sin through the infinite merits of her Son, Jesus Christ. Over the centuries, as saints and theologians

reflected on how Mary pondered and treasured the sacred events from the life of Christ in her holy heart, as attested in Scripture, her pure heart was recognized as something to be imitated. Devotion to Our Lady's purity of heart began to flower, so much so that in the 17th century St. John Eudes promoted it alongside the Sacred Heart of Jesus. The devotion rose to a new level after the apparitions of Our Lady of Fatima, when Mary revealed an image of her Immaculate Heart to Lucia, Jacinta, and Francisco.



# You bore me to be a man of strife for the whole world.
