# **Gospel Reflection**

Faith is a journey to the dwelling place of God. Like Jesus' journey to Jerusalem, our faith journey is difficult and painful; doubt, despair and ridicule are among

the obstacles we must encounter.

Jesus uses three images in today's Gospel that speak of the disciple's faith journey:

- the narrow gate: The major cities of Palestine were built
  with walls surrounding the perimeter. Throngs of people
  could enter the city only through the great gates at the
  city's entrance. Jesus, however, calls us to enter the city
  of God through the "narrow gate" -- through the lonely,
  humble entry way of the human heart.
- the locked door: Conversion is not an instantaneous transformation in which we go from Godlessness to holiness. Our lives are a constant process of conversion, of working to become the people God has called to become.
- the feast: God's invitation to the banquet of heaven is extended to all men and women of good will, not just to those who presume themselves to be God's special elite.

# The Mission of the Lay Faithful Part 7 - Promoting A Christian Culture

This week we look at the role of the lay faithful in **promoting** and transmitting Christian culture. This is one of the most important aspects of their service to society — to create and transmit a culture that is imbued with Christian values, especially in our contemporary context marked by increasing secularism, materialism, and widespread indifference to God (CL, 44).

Culture finds expression in diverse and evolving fields such as education, science and technology, the arts and humanities, media and communication, and the many institutions that shape and transmit shared values (*Christifideles Laici*, 44). The lay faithful are called to be present in all these areas, to engage them thoughtfully and faithfully, and to infuse them with the light of the Gospel.

In one of Jesus's parables, He compares the Kingdom of Heaven to leaven (or yeast) that a woman hides in three measures of flour, till it was all leavened (Mt 13:33). The leaven transforms the whole dough making it rise. In the same way, the everyday life and authentic witness of the lay faithful can transform culture, bringing rise to the Kingdom of God in society gradually, not by imposition, but through faithful witness.

For example, evangelisation in the field of education and research must aim to show that faith and science are not in opposition, and that "faith liberates reason from presumption" ensuring that it remains oriented toward truth (Fides et Ratio, 76). Our task is to demonstrate that all scientific truth can be reconciled with faith, and can help support and clarify faith truths, since "faith and reason are like to wings on which the human spirit rises to the contemplation of truth" (Fides et Ratio, Intro.). Reason without faith leads to error, despair and ideology, and faith without reason leads to fundamentalism or superstition.

In the field of arts and media, the aim is to communicate what is good, true and beautiful, and to challenge cultural messages that glorify sin through sexualisation and commodification of the human person by offering alternative narratives rooted in Gospel values that highlight the inherent dignity of persons (JPII Letter to Artists, 1999). As such, the many forms of social communication are powerful tools that must be harnessed by the lay faithful for the work of mission and evangelisation (Inter Mirifica, 2; Evangelii Nuntiandi, 45; Christus Vivit, 86).

Finally, in the area of **science and technology**, the Church reminds us that we are called to use technology to promote **ethical and integral human development**, respecting life from the moment of conception until death (CSDC, 458). This means resisting the "**technological imperative**", which is the idea that if something can be done technologically then it should be done. However, as Vatican II warns, "**Not everything technically possible is morally admissible**" (*GS*, 51). Technology has to serve **human dignity and the common good**, as such, its use must be governed by **human reason and conscience** rooted in the truth of man created in the *Imago Dei* (Laudato Si, 105; CSDC, 458).

May **Our Lady, Star of the New Evangelisation**, guide the lay faithful as they seek to be leaven in society—renewing culture through goodness, truth, beauty. Amen.

Social Justice Statement 2025-2026 - Signs of Hope on the Edge: Serving

## **Homeless People with Mental III-Health**

The 2025–2026 ACBC Social Justice Statement, Signs of Hope on the Edge: Serving People Living in Homelessness and Mental III-Health, which was launched on Wednesday the 13th of August 2025, addresses the growing crisis of homelessness in Australia, with 273,600 people assisted by homelessness services in 2022–23, one-third of whom had a mental health issue.

The statement highlights that rates of homelessness among those with mental ill-health have risen every year since 2011, driven largely by housing shortages and family and domestic violence. Many agencies are struggling to meet demand, leaving some families with young children and unaccompanied young people without emergency accommodation, while service gaps leave many with undiagnosed mental health conditions without support.

The statement calls on us to follow Jesus' example by offering compassion, friendship, and hope, recognising that secure housing is essential for physical and mental well-being and that everyone is created in the image of God. In this Jubilee Year, Pope Francis urges us to be "messengers and builders of hope" to those on the margins.

Then you will find yourself saying, "We once ate and drank in your company; you taught in our streets" but he will reply, "I do not know where you come from. Away from me, all you wicked men!"

Then there will be weeping and grinding of teeth, when you see Abraham and Isaac and Jacob and all the prophets in the kingdom of God, and yourselves turned outside. And men from the east and west, from north and south, will come to take their places at the feast in the kingdom of God.
