



The Mission of the Lay Faithful Part 8 - The Elderly and the Sick

In this final reflection on the vocation and mission of the lay faithful, we turn our attention to the unique and vital role of the elderly and the sick in the Church and in society. St. John Paul II reminds us that every Christian, regardless of age or physical condition, is called to actively participate in the apostolic and missionary life of the Church and the world (Christifideles Laici, 48). This is a strikingly counter-cultural message, especially in affluent societies marked by what he described as "alarming symptoms" of a "culture of death" - where excessive concern with productivity and efficiency often leads to the devaluation of human marginalisation and particularly of those who are sick, elderly, or disabled (Evangelium Vitae, 54).

By contrast, the **Parable of the Workers in the Vineyard** (Mt 20:1–16) offers a different vision. The landowner goes out at various hours of the day, even at the eleventh hour, to invite workers into his vineyard—and all receive the same reward. For St. John Paul II, this parable affirms that all **are called to labor joyfully in the Lord's vineyard**, including the elderly and the sick. The reward is not based on output or efficiency, but on **human dignity** and a **faithful response** to God's call (*Christifideles Laici*, 48, 53).

The Elderly: Witnesses of Wisdom and Faith - For the elderly, this mission includes recognising that they embody the biblical virtues of wisdom and the fear of the Lord (cf. Sir 25:4–6), and possess a dignity that illicits and commands respect (*Evangelium Vitae*, 46). They serve as living witnesses of faith — pillars in both Church and society — who have persevered through life's seasons and whose experience offers insight, discernment, and encouragement to younger generations, and their wisdom can act as guide and balance to the energy and idealism of youth (*Christifideles Laici*, 48).

The Sick and Infirm: Sharing in the Paschal Mystery—For those who are sick or infirm, the Church invites them to live more deeply the Paschal Mystery—the suffering, death, and resurrection of Christ. St. Paul writes: "In my flesh I complete what is lacking in Christ's afflictions for the sake of his body, that is, the Church" (Col 1:24). In this way, the sick and elderly are called to unite their sufferings with Christ's Passion, becoming witnesses of Christian hope and joy, grounded in the sure knowledge of the power of the Risen Lord (Christifideles Laici, 53).

A Spiritual Mission of Inestimable Value - The elderly and infirm must recognise the inestimable value of their vocation — the spiritual mission of offering their sufferings for the Church and others. This form of intercession, carried out in union with the sufferings of Christ, is a powerful act of evangelisation. It allows the soul to grow in holiness, to experience deep joy and peace even amid suffering, and to become a channel of grace for the Church and the world (Letter to the Elderly, JPII, 1999).

May Our Lady, Health of the Sick and Comforter of the Afflicted, help the elderly and the sick to recognise their sacred vocation and the invaluable contribution they are called to make in the vineyard of the Lord. Amen.

Do you know someone thinking about becoming Catholic?



Pope's Prayer Intention for August: For mutual coexistence Let us pray that societies where coexistence seems more difficult might not succumb to the temptation of confrontation for ethnic, political, religious, or ideological reasons



What is an Indulgence? An indulgence is not "buying forgiveness" — only God forgives sins — but rather a gift through which the Church applies the merits of Christ and the saints to repair the lingering consequences of sin, deepening our communion with God and the Church. Using Christ's authority to "bind and loose" (Mt 16:19), the Church attaches indulgences to certain devotional practices and acts of charity, offering tangible experiences of God's mercy and healing, especially during the Jubilee Year, a special season highlighting hope, mercy, and spiritual renewal. Indulgences can be received for ourselves or for souls in purgatory (such as loved ones), and we may obtain one plenary indulgence per day.

Three Paths To Choose -

1. Pilgrimage: to a designated Jubilee Shrine (eg Manly, Chatswood, Gosford or Broken Bay Cathedral). While there, participate in on of the following – Holy Mass; Liturgy of the Hours; Stations of the Cross; Marian Rosary; Akathist (Hymn to Mary).

Why pilgrimage? Pilgrimage embodies "incarnational prayer" – making the effort to step outside ourselves to encounter God physically and spiritually at sacred places of grace.

2. Pious Visits: visit any Jubilee site and spend suitable time in Eucharistic Adoration and meditation. Conclude with: Our Father; Profession of Faith (Creed); Prayer or hymn to Mary.

Unable to visit physically? You can receive the indulgence by spiritually uniting yourself in prayer.

3. Works of Mercy: Perform one or more of these with a devout spirit: participate in popular missions (eg Alpha); Spiritual exercises or retreats; formation activities (catechesis, prayer groups); visiting the sick, disabled, or imprisoned; penitential acts: fasting. Abstaining from media, donations to the poor, or volunteering.

Why works of mercy? The Jubilee calls the tangible acts of mercy, reflecting solidarity and Christlike charity.

Which path you choose, you must also:

- **1.** Have true repentance and be free from all attachment to sin (even venial sin).
- **2.** Sacramental confession (within about 20 days before or after the indulgenced act).
- **3.** Receive Holy Communion (preferably on the same day as the indulgenced act).
- **4.** Pray for the Pope's intentions (usually an Our Father and a Hail Mary).

Pilgrim Passports can be found at the entrance to the Church. Please stamp your passport at the Shine of St John Vianney.



Morning Prayer

During this Jubilee Year of Hope 2025, we are all invited to a deeper spiritual renewal, embracing prayer as a way to grow in faith and trust in God's

providence and love. As part of this journey, Morning Prayer (Liturgy of the Hours) will be prayed at 8:45am, Tuesday to Friday, before Mass, at the Blessed Sacrament Chapel, at Mary Immaculate Church, Manly. This ancient prayer of the Church unites us in praise and reflection through Scripture and psalms, drawing us into the rhythm of daily prayer with the universal Church. Prayer books will be provided, and all are welcome to join.

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke

All who exalt themselves shall be humbled and all who humble themselves shall be exalted

On a sabbath day Jesus had gone for a meal to the house of one of the leading Pharisees; and they watched him closely. He then told the guests a parable, because he had noticed how they picked the places of honour. He said this, 'When someone invites you to a wedding feast, do not take your seat in the place of honour. A more distinguished person than you may have been invited, and the person who invited you both may come and say, "Give up your this man." And then, to place to embarrassment, you would have to go and take the lowest place. No; when you are a guest, make your way to the lowest place and sit there, so that, when your host comes, he may say, "My friend, move up higher." In that way, everyone with you at the table will see you honoured. For everyone who exalts himself will be humbled, and the man who humbles himself will be exalted.'

Then he said to his host, 'When you give a lunch or a dinner, do not ask your friends, brothers, relations or rich neighbours, for fear they repay your courtesy by inviting you in return. No; when you have a party, invite the poor, the crippled, the lame, the blind; that they cannot pay you back means that you are fortunate, because repayment will be made to you when the virtuous rise again.'

All: Praise to you, Lord Jesus Christ.



GOSPEL REFLECTION

Gospel humility (a key theme of Luke's Gospel) is not a religious sado-masochism motivated by self-hatred or obsequiousness. As taught by Christ, humility is an

awareness of who we are before God; of our constant need for God and our dependence on God for everything; of the limitlessness of God's love and forgiveness. The Jesus of the Gospel, "who, though in the form of God, humbled himself... accepting even death on the cross" is the perfect model of the humble servant of God.

In today's Gospel, Jesus calls us to embrace the attitude of seeking out the "lowest places" at table for the sake of others, promising that at the banquet of heaven God will exalt such humility. In teaching us to invite to our tables "those who cannot repay you," Jesus challenges us to imitate the love of God: doing what is right, good and just for the joy of doing so, not out of a sense of duty, self-interest or the need to feel superior or in control.
